Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Let the record show that the hour of 7:23 P.M. has occurred. The Clerk will read the Notice of Public Hearing."

Barbara Grattan: "I have affidavits of publishing and posting of a Public Notice of a Public Hearing to be held at Riverhead Town Hall at 7:10 P.M. on Tuesday, October 20, 1992, to hear all interested persons who wish to be heard regarding an amendment to Chapter 108 regarding "Signs" Sub-Section Z computerized electronic message center."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Anybody who is present who would like to address the Board? That being the case, there being no objection, this Hearing is closed."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Let the record show that the hour of 7:24 has occurred. The Clerk will read the Notice of Public Hearing."

Barbara Grattan: "I have affidavits of publishing and posting of a Public Notice for a Public Hearing to be held at Riverhead Town Hall at 7:15 P.M. on Tuesday, October 20, 1992, to hear all interested persons who wish to be heard regarding the proposed lease by NYNEX Mobile Communications to install a mobile phone site at the Gerald Street in Wading River."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Anyone present who would like to address the Board?"

Pedro Gonzalez: "Ladies and gentlemen, Master Christopher Biancone, my name is Pedro Gonzalez, and I'm with NYNEX Mobile Communications Real Estate Department. What we are proposing to do is to construct a mobile telephone cell site at the water tank which is located on, what is the name of the street, Gerald Street, which is very similar in respect in size and operating just like the one that currently exists at the Pulaski water tank right now. Are there any questions that I might be able to address?"

Councilman Prusinowski: "Just for the record, you will be paying us an annual fee for that?"

Pedro Gonzalez: "Yes, there is a proposed lease that's been sent to the office of Monique Gablenz and has been reviewed by your attorney, Richard Ehlers, and all the terms and conditions seems to be agreeable to them."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you, if anybody has any questions?"

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Is there anybody present who would like to address the Board?"

William Kasperovich: "Thank you. It's very easy to pronounce Kasperovich, but if you want to call me Kasper, that's all right, too. I live in Wading River. The water I use in my house comes from this tank that we're talking about. This tank

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is a standpipe tank different from the elevated tank on Pulaski Street. It is also in an isolated location. I have mixed feelings about allowing a stranger access to the water supply when no Water Department personnel are present, so that if this does pass, I would think it wise that a person designated by Mr. Pendzick be present. Secondly, the \$28,000 a year that this would generate, I feel should be applied to the bonds issued that are paying for the tank. That that tank is paid by a particular group of people in Wading River, and this tank would be a part of that installation. Consequently, I feel that that monies should go to paying the bonds. Thirdly, in the information given out, I didn't see anything about covering the cost to the Water Department for this installation. Whatever has to be done should be done with the scrutiny of a man experienced and knowledgeable about standing steel structures, particularly where water is involved. I'm thinking specifically of welding. That's about it in that sense, but mainly that this \$28,000 should go to the people that are paying for the tank, not the entire Township. Thank you."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Thank you, Mr. Kasperovich."

Pedro Gonzalez: "I think one of the items that he brought up was the question of cost to the Town. The cost of the construction of this site will be entirely born by NYNEX Corporation."

Supervisor Janoski: "And let me say that any revenues derived from a Water District facility goes directly to the Water District. I can't get it into General Fund, try as I might, I can't do it. So it does go to the Water District. We can't put it into the General Fund. The rental that we talked about."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Does anybody else want to talk to the Board? Mr. Haizlip?"

Steve Haizlip: "Mr. Supervisor for the Day, and the Supervisor and the Town Board. The only thing I'm concerned about here is when you start fooling around with telephone equipment, sorry, I messed up, I've got to give my name. Steve Haizlip, of Calverton. Now we're all set to go. The only thing that I'm concerned with here is when we start messing

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around with telephone equipment it involves transmitters and maybe transformers and so forth. So my only concern is what kind of EMF are we going to get from this which, in electric terms, engineering terms, electric motive forces, transmitting and through the equipment, the pipes, and going in the water which is a very good conductor. That's, I'd like to have that addressed if the gentleman can."

Pedro Gonzalez: "I'd like to show this chart which shows the reference point from items that we currently buy over the counter at any appliance store, like your walkie-talkies, microwave ovens, cordless telephones, and the reference to our antennas. All of the items that I have mentioned, emit a greater amount of radiation than the antennas that we propose to mount on the tank."

Steve Haizlip: "All very low voltage?"

Pedro Gonzalez: "Yes, sir."

Steve Haizlip: "Right, good, thank you."

Pedro Gonzalez: "If you would like to see this, I can pass this around."

Supervisor Janoski: "Do you have a copy of that for the record, perhaps? Thank you."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Does anybody else wish to address the Board? That being the case, without objection, this Hearing is closed."

Supervisor Janoski: "The Supervisor has asked me to let you know that the Bi-Centennial Journal is ready. It's hot off the presses. It is available right here at Town Hall, I believe at the Town Clerk's Office and at the Tax Receiver's Office and at the Assessor's Office. For the modest charge of \$8.00, you can have a copy of this Bi-Centennial Souvenir Journal and it is, I have read through it, it is a very interesting history and story of the Town of Riverhead. There's even a picture of a police chief standing next to a Hudson police car. For those of you that remember Hudson Hornets. And wasps. But, this is now available, and I would ask that you avail yourself of getting a copy of this. Also, Mr. Supervisor, we have a very

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nice duty to do tonight in which you will present out recognition to the Employee of the Quarter, who is Mr. Charles Brown, a very good friend of mine. And he's here in the audience and he's got a lot of friends and family here with him, so why don't we go down into the well here and you can present him with his award."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Okay."

Supervisor Janoski: "The Supervisor has asked me to ask the members of the Labor/Management Committee to join us up here, (inaudible). Mr. Charles Brown who is the quarter's recipient, (inaudible). The members of the Labor/Management Committee select an Employee of the Quarter, he is selected by his peers as the outstanding employee of the Town in this quarter. And Supervisor Christopher has a number of gifts, the first of which is a United States Savings Bond for \$100.00. And we also have this check for dinner for two, for Charles Brown."

(At this time, the Proclamation was read by Supervisor of the Day Biancone to Charles Brown, Employee of the Quarter.)

Supervisor Janoski: "Charlie, one of your fellow employees has sent a letter, couldn't be here tonight, he has asked that we read this letter."

Monique Gablenz: "Charlie, Danny Ruthinowski asked that I read this short note to you. Dear Charlie: I am really sorry and disappointed that I am unable to be here tonight. My tickets and reservations were made long before your selection was announced. Although it has only been a year and a half I have known you, I consider myself lucky to have the opportunity to work with you. You are certainly deserving of this recognition for the examples you set. People can look around Riverhead and notice your effect on the Town. Charlie, you have been doing a great job and setting a good example. Although sometimes it's a tough act to follow. I would like to thank everyone for contributing to making a selection because you have earned it and they are aware of it. It may be a good thing that I am not there tonight, because I probably would not say this to your face. I'll try to put the right

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words together and make a short speech at the ceremony (inaudible).
Congratulations."

Supervisor Janoski: "Would the other members of the Buildings and Ground crew join us. The whole gang is here."

Monique Gablenz: "These gentlemen this year have done an outstanding job with all the special events, the Bi-Centennial, these are the people that made it all actually happen. And we thank you very much.

Supervisor Janoski: "Let me simply say that Charlie, you're a heck of a guy and whatever we need done, it gets done, and thank you for that. This crew is a Godsend. You do the impossible. Now it's your turn, Charlie."

Charles Brown: "First, I'd like to thank God for (inaudible). I've worked for 15 years and I've worked for another good Supervisor (inaudible). I can look around and see that there are only a few people that started out with me and I'd like to thank the man for choosing me and I'd like to thank everybody who came out tonight (inaudible). And I would like for my wife to come up so everybody could meet her. I'd like to thank her for (inaudible)."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "I recognize anybody who wishes to be heard on any subject."

Steve Haizlip: "Steve Haizlip from Calverton. Mr. Acting Supervisor of the Day, Mr. Supervisor, and members of the Board. June the 15th, the great Calverton Civic Association conducted the meeting. On August the 18th, I turned in the questionnaires with complaints on it from the citizens of the Town, which requires some government action. Again, I don't want to be like patriotic and flag waving, but it goes back to the people elected by the people, which is a government for the people, but what I would like to know at this time, has any review been made of the package of the questionnaires with the complaints that was wrote up by members and citizens of the great Calverton Civic Association?"

Councilman Stark: "Some of those questions have been

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addressed within the Calverton Hamlet Study, and will appear in a survey of which we really have taken correction from the Aquebogue and Jamesport which Dick and Frank are heading in. We are going to expound on some of those concerns in that particular area. They will show up in that survey."

Steve Haizlip: "Okay. I'm glad to hear that."

Councilman Stark: "For a broader scope of finances through that study."

Steve Haizlip: "All right. One of the particular complaints that was in it was one of mine about putting lines on Edwards Avenue, from 25 all the way to the Long Island Railroad, which they have accomplished, and that is very good. And now the citizens and the members of the greater Calverton Civic Association will be glad to hear that some action is being taken on all of them, the action will be taken."

Councilman Stark: "Steve, we have several members of the Civic Association on the Hamlet Study."

Steve Haizlip: "Very good, I'm glad to hear that."

Councilman Stark: "The questions or areas of concern they are primarily concerned with zoning, or the adoption of zoning or what have you. Striping a road certainly is not going to be covered in the Hamlet Study in so far as that aspect, but there are several of these concerns that they have incorporated into the survey. It will be out sometime in the spring."

Steve Haizlip: "Very good, all right. It's being looked into. Thank you."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Is there anybody else wishing to be heard? Mr. Bail?"

Sid Bail: "Thank you, Mr. Supervisor and Mr. Supervisor. Members of the Town Board. I heard the magic word 'Hamlet Study' come up, which brings me to the area of my concern. I see one of your Resolutions tonight, Resolution 640, deals with a determination of the environmental significance on the change of zone petition of Werner Abel, Jr. I have some problems here. I think if you vote a negative declaration, I think you would

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be overlooking the traffic impact that the ultimate build-out of this project would have if you granted the change of zone. I think we were talking about over 600 parking spaces. I'm also quite concerned about the integrity of our Hamlet Study in Wading River, which was the first of the Hamlet Studies, and you mentioned the others that are in process, and the Calverton Study which is just beginning, and which may turn out to be the most important Study that's done in the Town, an understatement. I think by now the Town should know that Wading River is not so desperate for a larger supermarket or a restaurant or the promise of a department store, that we're willing to scrap the vision that went into the Hamlet Study. And I hope you take this into consideration. I hope we don't have to come back here for a series of Public Hearings where we have to mobilize people. I thought we were beyond that four years ago when the Hamlet Study was completed, but if it's necessary, you know, we'll do what we have to do. Thank you for your time."

Supervisor Janoski: "Why don't we say that regardless of what action we take here tonight, there is going to be a series of Public Hearings because anyone can apply for just about anything. And we must go through a process and that process is going to move ahead and there will be Public Hearings. And that's why we have them so that the folks in Wading River who are for or against, can come out and tell us and give us the reasons why. The (inaudible) being a very legitimate concern. And that helps us as a Town Board to come to a conclusion on the worthiness of the application. We have to do it. We cannot say no prior to the process being (inaudible)."

Sid Bail: "Okay, thank you very much for your time."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Mr. Benedict."

Dick Benedict: "Dick Benedict, Fanning Blvd. I see under Applications, Suffolk County National Bank for an internally lighted sign. If I read that correctly, Route 58 northside, west of Route 25 and Doctors Path, is that in the vicinity of where they are renting a building in Metropolitan Life? The back half of Metropolitan Life they rent. And they want to put a free standing time and temperature on Route 58 side at at 7:10, the Public Hearing on computerized message signs, would that have any effect on this sign? Because

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traveling around the country, the most of these that I see don't work. Well, they're either off, the time is off or the temperature is off. You know, the lights are out, anyway, that's in front of Metropolitan Life, then. Somewhere in that vicinity. Thank you."

Mike Johnson: "My name is Mike Johnson. I'm the owner of Sayville Shop, Main Street. I'd like to say good evening to the Acting Supervisor, Supervisor Janoski, and the Town Board. I have a question on Resolution #646, I don't know what it's about, but it does, I have a problem that I'd like to ask the Town Board what their advice might be with the situation of peddlers. We have a particular truck that comes into the Riverhead area on Fridays, Saturdays, and days that the Social Service checks are awarded to the recipients. It rides around different areas of Riverhead, stops, and he peddles. He pays a fee for his peddler's license, I don't know how much it is, but what he does, and I don't know if it affects Swezey's and if it affects the other stores and merchants on the street, but what he does do, he doesn't pay any taxes, he undercuts everyone's prices, and he just stops at random. What does the Town do about that?"

Supervisor Janoski: "The Board shares your view about that and I'll recognize Councilman Prusinowski."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Pursuant to many complaints from downtown merchants and Route 58 merchants like yourself, and with the cooperation of the Chamber of Commerce, we have drafted this peddlers law which will address that very problem. He cannot do that under this law."

Mike Johnson: "Great. Can I get a copy of that?"

Councilman Prusinowski: "After this, I'll be more than happy to give you it. In fact, about four months ago, when we had the first Public Hearing on this, we made some slight amendments to the wording. We did receive some correspondence. Okay, we have received some correspondence and a petition from some of the downtown merchants specifically addressing this problem. I agree with them. They should be paying, they should all be on an equal playing field. They're not paying taxes, and the overhead, the rent and everything else you have."

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Mike Johnson: "No sales taxes or anything like that, it's not fair."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Right, payroll tax, the works."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Mr. Kasperovich."

William Kasperovich: "William Kasperovich from Wading River. I wish to bring to the attention of the Town Board and the Town Attorney, who is not here, that there is a lack of rectitude. Many of the Resolutions read, as we have in 629, that will be voted on this evening. The third paragraph, 'Whereas, a map and plan prepared by Young and Young, Riverhead, New York that are on file with the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead for public inspection'. In the past several weeks, I tried following up on the Public Hearing and Resolution 544 and I went to the Town Clerk's office for a map that would have been on file. There is no way to know that this was the document that was used. When I talked to the Water Superintendent he said no, that's not the map, that's not the one that was used. I said well I think it is, and he says well, then it shouldn't have been used. That's not correct, that's not proper. Now, the procedure that we have in this Town Hall usually is for expedience, but for legal correctness, the document should be spelled out in the Public Hearing and in the Resolution, especially the Resolution. It is a legal instrument and it should be described explicitly to so indicate this instrument and no other one. This is a fundamental procedure in the practice of law in this country and I don't see that we can't abide by this procedure. I'm not going to go into back history to indicate difficulties that have occurred because the instrument was not spelled out. But I think that is no excuse to continue that we put the onus on the Town Clerk and she is not given the procedure and the paths to follow such that this type of wordage can be used in Resolutions. I say if you're talking about a piece of paper that becomes a legal instrument, describe it specifically and explicitly. Thank you."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Thank you Mr. Kasperovich."

Steve Haizlip: "Steve Haizlip of Calverton. The only

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reason I want to come back up is that I want to amplify it and make it plain that I wasn't speaking for myself or the great Calverton Civic Association. I'm speaking for our President, Ann Miloski. Thank you."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Let's take up the Resolutions."

Resolution #628

Councilman Stark: "Mr. Supervisor, I commend you on your selection as Supervisor of the Day. I commend your family in bringing up such a bright, young boy who reads very, very well for third grade. Resolution #628 commends Jim and Connie Lull and members of the Bicentennial Commission for their outstanding efforts.

WHEREAS, it is both fitting and proper to identify individuals who have devoted themselves to the betterment of the Town through community service, and

Supervisor Janoski: "I think I'm going to recognize you, Christopher, cause I know you want to say a little something and then I will say what I have to say and then we can all go home and watch the World Series. Would you like to? Whatever you would like."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Thank you everybody."

Supervisor Janoski: "Well, that's very direct. I want to say that we're not quite sure how long we've been doing this, but it is a wonderful program which the Riverhead Free Library runs the summer reading program. And, of course, it's meant to get these young people involved in educational useful activities in the summertime. So we're happy to support it, the members of the Board and I. And I just want to say that out of this program comes the most intelligent and capable young people that you would ever want to meet. And it is times like this that I don't worry so much about the future of the country because we do have some very bright young people coming up who will lead us in the future and Christopher has been a very relaxed, he hasn't been excited all day long, as far as the things that we've done. Very relaxed, he will not as I told one radio station today develop ulcers or high blood pressure as some of us do. So his approach to government is, I think, a very good one. And it has been a pleasure for me, Christopher, to have you as Supervisor of the Day. I know that we will see

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each other in the future as you grow up and perhaps there will be some other events for you to take part in for the remainder of this year. You have been an outstanding Supervisor, and I thank you very much for giving me the pleasure of your company today."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "Now, your last job is to do this."

Supervisor of the Day Biancone: "Without objection, this meeting is adjourned."
