

Minutes of a Regular Board Meeting held by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall, Riverhead, New York on Tuesday, July 2, 1990 at 7:30 p.m.

Supervisor Janoski called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

**Supervisor Janoski:** "Before we start the meeting and get into public hearings and resolutions, we have some awards to make for a recycling contest which was sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce and the winners are here with us with their families. Of course we have Curtis Highsmith, President of the Chamber of Commerce. Why don't you come on up Curtis. And members of the business community are also present. Now, the projects are out in the hall and I'm sure that you say them on the way in. And of course there is one of those projects that always causes some little confusion and that is the category of the smallest. When we did a T.V. show in which we talked about this contest, there was an entry form and all the projects were on the set and we saw this piece of paper and looked all over for the project. Well it was the table to the end of the room and it got kind of lost in moving them here from the bank. But it's out there. So why don't we get into the presentations. Let me mention that Chip Cleary is here and come on up here Chip. When we were doing that T.V. show, Chip was my guest on the show and we were talking about Splish Splash also and Chip had said that he would like to present to the winners some complimentary tickets to Splish Splash. So why don't we start off with Jeffrey. To those of you who saw this show, know that I called Geoffrey George because that is what was written on my list and I can see why the mistake was made because Geoffrey spells his name with a "G". Geoffrey why don't you come up here. Geoffrey is the winner in the most decorative category and he did that really clever wreath. Of course this was a contest to get the children thinking about recycling. But also to tug out their creative thought also to see what they could do with some of these materials that are recyclable. Geoffrey, everybody liked yours. I remember that Chip was really impressed by it on the show. So congratulations to you. Were they soda rings? And now the category for the largest project goes to Christine Zaneski. Is Christine here? Christine did the robot and of course it is much much bigger than

she is. Christine, congratulations. The most functional category, the winner is John Schaviano and he did a bird feeder. Come on up here John. The most unique is a butterfly and Rachel Vancuren is the winner for that category. We had a lot of fun with this project. It was the best presentation. It was a little train. We played with it before and after the show. The winner is Michael Kruzon. Congratulations. The most creative category was for a vase with flowers. I remember the vase very well. A very unique bottle shape. You didn't empty that bottle did you? Amy Zuckerman, the winner of that category. And now the person I want to meet. This is the winner in the smallest category. It is an airplane which was made out of recyclable aluminum foil. Glen Tyndall is the winner. Glen, come on up. Now I have to save this list of names because my schedule for tomorrow is on the other side. I want to thank the Chamber of Commerce for sponsoring this program. Recycling of course in the Town of Riverhead is moving along very well and partly due to the sponsorship of programs like this to educate our young people. And of course thanks to you residents of the Town of Riverhead who are making the recycling program a success. The children, of course, are probably a driving force in each of the homes as far as getting us to do what we have to do. And we will be having programs in the school. I want to do a project with batteries because it is my observation that children probably use most of those little batteries in toys and gadgets as such. We'll see that probably next year. And of course I don't see John here but John is Sanitation Supervisor. He's been doing an outstanding job and hence the support of Town Board to make these things work. It is important that we are successful and last but not least. Chip Cleary from Splish Splash was kind enough to donate the passes. I want to sneak in there myself one of these days. Chip thank you. If I could have... Monique, why don't you preside, just get it started and we're going to go outside and take a couple of pictures and I'll be right back."

Deputy Supervisor Gablenz, "Ok folks, if we could just get started. We're going to get started (if you don't mind) while they're out in the hallway taking some pictures. Do I have a motion to approve the Minutes of the Regular Board meeting held on June 4, and the Special Board of June 7?"

Deputy Supervisor Gablenz, "Let the record show that the hour of 7:47 has arrived. Will the Town Clerk please read the notice of public hearing."

PUBLIC HEARING - 7:45 p.m.

I have affidavits of publishing and posting for a public notice for a public hearing to be held at Riverhead Town Hall at 7:40 p.m. on Tuesday, July 2, 1991 to hear all interested persons who wish to be heard regarding: Special Permit Application of William Keller to create a single-family residential use within an existing retail structure on Pulaski Street.

Deputy Supervisor Gablenz, "Is there anyone present representing the applicant? Mary, why don't you just step up to the microphone. You just need to state your name and address and then if you could just give a brief description of the application."

Mary Keller, West Main Street, "Thank you. I'm here for my husband William Keller who has applied for a special permit for a single family dwelling above our store at 514 Pulaski Street. We have a trophy store there. We also live in the Town of Riverhead on West Main Street. We also want to put a separate entrance door on the side of the building to put the apartment above the store."

Deputy Supervisor Gablenz, "Ok. Thank you Mary."

(SUPERVISOR RETURNS TO THE MEETING)

Supervisor Janoski, "Is there anyone present who wishes to address the Town Board on this special permit application? That being the case and without objection, I declare the hearing to be closed."

7:40 PUBLIC HEARING CLOSED AT 7:50

Supervisor Janoski, "Also, I am going to request that the Town Board, after we have completed the scheduled agenda, consider a resolution granting this application. We will take up the resolutions. Is there anyone present who wishes to address the Board on any matter? Warren."

Warren McKnight, Wading River, "Under Reports on open bid report for snack vendors for Recreation Department, is this the first year you've done this in town. In other words, for persons if they wanted to have a concession at our recreation?"

Supervisor Janoski, "Yes indeed. There has been a great deal of interest in having such vendors and we went through the process. First we developed the process which was fair and legal to go out to bid for concessions at those various locations. And it's an opportunity (of course) for the town to realize some revenue and also to allow some citizens to have an income."

Warren McKnight, "A number of citizens who have been in the town for a number of years express interest in bidding on this and some of the problems they said they didn't know how to bid or where to bid or compare. Since it was something new, is there any way that these citizens can come to Town Hall or through Town Hall to be educated on this so they can bid sensibly?"

Supervisor Janoski, "It's the usual bidding process. It is published in the paper, the official paper of the town and it's just a matter of putting down in a sealed envelope an amount of money that you are going to give to the town, paid to the town if you will, for that particular concession at a particular location."

Warren McKnight, "I see. And basically..."

Councilman Stark, "Warren, it was my recommendation as Recreation Chairman noticing that we did with the only exception of Jamesport, had any kind of snacks or what have you. I directed Ed Hudgins, our Recreation Coordinator Director (what ever you want to call him) to this this Town Board. He sought the bids and people bid on them."

Warren McKnight, "Basically, I referred some people to, like Willie Patterson, the Principal of Riverhead Middle School. He has a few concessions in other towns and I told people to contact him to get an idea."

Councilman Stark, "He has all the right in the world to do it. And travelling the beaches this past week, I noticed that the people who are attending the beaches are very thankful there is some place they can go and get a cold soda, a hot dog, a snack or whatever it may be. Ice cream for the kids who get sand in them and everything else."

Warren McKnight, "The only thing I'm concerned about and rightfully so is that there are professional people outside the area who are more experienced in it. Perhaps somebody from New Jersey and other places that might have an advantage and experience and get the bid and our people might miss out in town."

Councilwoman Civiletti, "It was awarded to local residents."

Warren McKnight, "They were awarded already."

Councilwoman Civiletti, "They are being awarded tonight."

Warren McKnight, "Great excellent."

Councilman Stark, "Two local vendors."

Warren McKnight, "Is it to be announced?"

Councilman Stark, Hillie Booker is one of them and Sandy Tuthill who is a long North Road Tuthill family."

Supervisor Janoski, "Thank you Warren."

Henry Pfeiffer, Wading River, "I'd just like to compliment the administration on the fact that they held the last meeting of the Town Board in Wading River. I saw people there that I had not seen in years and certainly a great many strangers to this democratic process. I know we had a lot of motion picture stars there and so forth and it started to get repetitious but I think the value of exposing the functioning of the Town Board to the populous of Wading River was well worth it. Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski, "Thank you."

Councilman Stark, "We're also planning one in Jamesport in August."

Henry Pfeiffer, "Beautiful."

Supervisor Janoski, "Is there anyone else present wishing to address the Town Board? Okay. Let us take up the resolutions."
