

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Hall, Riverhead, New York, on Tuesday, January 5, 1982 at 7:30 P.M.

Supervisor Janoski declared the Meeting to order at 7:30 P.M., and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Dr. Caryl Granttham, Riverhead, New York; "I'm speaking tonight as President of the Woman's Club of Riverhead. You already have the communication, the letter in the hands of the Board, but I'd like to read it for the record. It was dated January the 4th, addressed to Supervisor Janoski and Members of the Riverhead Town Board.

'Gentlemen:

The Woman's Club of Riverhead through unanimous action of its Board of Directors and the vote by the membership at its regular October Meeting approved a petition to the Riverhead Town Board to change the name of the Peconic River Park to the Helen W. Ammann Park.

Helen Ammann, 14th President of the Woman's Club of Riverhead, her term was 1938-1940 was a pioneer in the effort to beautify, to preserve, and protect those unique natural and historic features of this community. She was among the very first to focus on the Peconic River and its environs as a special treasure that should be kept forever safe from degradation. She was, in effect, and Environmentalist in the best sense of that term long before most of us knew or appreciated what it meant. The Ammann family, too, was for years the center — at the center of Riverhead civic and business life. For all these reasons, we respectfully urge you, the members of this Town Board to make this memorial park designation one of its first actions in the New Year.

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you Dr. Granttham. I would recognize anyone else who wishes to be heard at this time. Yes Sir."

Vincent Ciolino: "I'm presently the head coordinator of Riverhead Kid Wrestling, part of the Riverhead Town Recreation Department Program and I just wanted to inform the new Board Members of the fact that we do exist. In the past, you've enabled us to use the Town facilities and the school facilities and that to keep our program going. We also — if we have any problem, the problem is transportation. We have some fifty boys in the club. We've been active for five years. The ages between eight years old and thirteen years old and in the past, we have used the Town

vans, the twelve seater vans and we'd just like to say tonight that we would like continuance use of those vans and I might add that it doesn't interfere with the use of those vans during the course of the week. Our tournament schedule is Friday nights and weekends when the vans aren't in use and I'd like to say that we'd like to continue the use of them as we have in the past. And I'd like to also thank Stan Grodski and Mike Mayo for their help in the past. Thank you very much."

Maureen Perrella, 420 East Main Street; "Good evening everyone. I've been here since 1975 and here it is 1982 and I would like to ask you what's new at 414 East Main Street?"

Supervisor Janoski: "414, the search warrant has been appelled and the first appearance in court last month and it is now on the court calendar for, I believe, January the 12th to answer to the nine hundred and some charges against them."

Maureen Perrella: "I was glad to read in the paper last week that some positive steps have been taken at the Orchard Court Complex."

Supervisor Janoski: "Yes I had requested a Health Department Inspection of that building which was provided by the Health Department, very much as in 414, the same procedure, the Health Department and the Building Department violations found, five apartments have been ordered vacated. Now it is changing hands. The new owner is in the process of upgrading the building."

Maureen Perrella: "Well I hope the new owner is not a recalcitrant landlord, as we have many of those, too many of those in this Town. I just hope — I'd like to urge the Board, the new members to the new years resolution, hopefully by the end of this year, perhaps clean up the mess that exists at 414."

Supervisor Janoski: "I would recognize at this time, anyone who wishes to be heard? Mr. Kasperovich."

William Kasperovich, 15th Street, Wading River; "I wish you Board members a very good 1982. I hope you can see some of the points that I've been working on in '81 in this coming year.

On December the 1st, I thought I was speaking to a legally formed duly met Town Board. When we see the minutes, the meeting agenda tonight we see special Board Meetings held December 4th, December 8th, that other than the evening sessions, there are other Town Board Meetings and there are minutes kept. Consequently, think that I was before a Town Board and led so to believe this to be correct, I expected minutes to be kept. Tonight I got a letter or a piece of paper, cause that's all I could call it, is a piece of paper, it's not minutes, it's not a summary, it is improper and incorrect.

Now, what are you gentlemen trying to pull? I met before the Board to show them a possible, questionable, legal procedure, definitely irregular. Definitely improper and not being a lawyer, I cannot say it's not legal. But it sure stunk that way.

Now when the Town Court in Riverhead Township is not allowed to do their job, I say this is wrong. When the Board of Appeals can allow a variance that erases a violation, especially and after the fact violation, this is a wrong — as could be. And yet I get a piece of paper that throws the words around in a strange way. Now I would like you people to let the public know when you are in session as a Town Board and when are you together to have a bull session."

Supervisor Janoski: "Mr. Kasperovich, that was not a special meeting of the Town Board. It was a Town Board work session which you requested to appear at. I do have a tape recording of the entire conversation that is available in my office."

William Kasperovich: "I requested to appear before a legal Town Board and you gave me an appointment at this time to appear before the Town Board. The Town Clerk was there, the two new elected Councilmen were there and now all of a sudden you were saying it was not a Town Board."

Supervisor Janoski: "I think that — you know I really don't want to argue this point. The difference between a legally called meeting of the Town Board and what we have as a regular

Tuesday work session. Certainly there is no precedent not legal reason to call a special meeting of the Town Board in order to have a citizen meet with it. We are not going to take any action on behalf of the Town. We are there to listen to you and we afforded you that opportunity."

William Kasperovich: "Well . . ."

Supervisor Janoski: "As I said, also a tape recording of the entire proceeding of that afternoon was kept and it is in my office. This is a summary you may . . ."

William Kasperovich: "It is not a correct or proper summary."

Supervisor Janoski: "That is your point of view. You certainly are entitled to it. I don't even recall — I got that this afternoon. You spoke your mind as to your objections of procedure with regard to the granting of a variance or seeking of a variance through the Zoning Board of Appeals and it is not. But . . ."

William Kasperovich: "But you seem to ignore the thing that I brought up was that you're circumventing the Town Court. And that I made quite clear and quite plain, especially to Mr. Prusinowski's misunderstanding of what is referred to as the grieved party in the court of law. Mr. Prusinowski if you don't understand legal terminology, I would suggest that you first find out what you talk about before you use words that you don't understand.

Now, I would like the Town Board to take a stand on legal procedure of erasing violations by the Board of Appeals, circumventing the Court, the Judge does the judging. Nobody else."

Supervisor Janoski: "I would like to recognize Councilman Prusinowski."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Mr. Kasperovich, when you attended the work session, you made your point."

William Kasperovich: "You call it a work session, that

is questionable to me because Mr. Janoski told me I was meeting before the Town Board."

Councilman Prusinowski: "You requested time. We showed up. You made your point crystal clear. We said we understood what you were talking about. We had a discussion about the point that you're bringing up and — right now, I don't understand what you're telling me about legal technology — legal — technical terms. But there's no Town Board member sitting here that wants to curcumvent the courts or the procedures set up by the Town Fathers and the State of New York. Now you had a grievance, we listened to it, and it's under consideration by the Town Board and we did thoroughly understand what you were bringing to us. I do not agree with you when you say we don't understand what we're talking about. I understood what you were talking about. Now I didn't read the summary sheet, if you would like to have a transcript of the tape recording of the meeting that day, we would be more than happy to provide it to you."

William Kasperovich: "Thank you, I would."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Okay."

William Kasperovich: "All right. My second point . . ."

Supervisor Janoski: "Mr. Kasperovich, you are pushing seven minutes now and you, of course, remember the five minute ruling. Perhaps you could save your second point till January 19th."

William Kasperovich: "I'm afraid that we all are involved with time periods. That after certain periods of time, there are certain things we cannot do. Now I think this thing is serious enough because I feel with the new Board that —."

Supervisor Janoski: "Could you give us an estimate as to how much longer — how much more time you need Mr. Kasperovich?"

William Kasperovich: "I'll take — I'll eliminate three of the other items and just stay with this one two or three minutes."

PERSONAL APPEARANCES - continued
Supervisor Janoski: "Mr. Kasperovich proceed."

William Kasperovich: "Some time back, the Board appointed a Mr. Young and a Mr. Nohejl to a citizens committee for the Scavenger Waste project. The citizens committees are required by the conservation department or any public funded projects. Mr. Young was not aware that he was appointed. When I talked to him on the phone, he said quote, "I need this like I need a whole in the head," unquote. Mr. Young has not attended any of the meetings, has not participated. The man is too busy with his own practice. So he has contributed nothing, not even his presence. In addition to which there is a conflict of interest that this is not an ordinary citizen. This is a practicing engineer that solicites business from the Town. Now I feel that since you people were interested enough to appoint a Town Attorney that functions, I believe at \$65 an hour for this scavenger waste project, that the citizens that are interested in this project that would give up their time, afford and capabilities for nothing, should be allowed into these projects as citizens and I feel that Mr. Young's intention and absence indicates a void in this committee that should be filled by an able and qualified and especially an interested citizen. I bring this to your attention and also to the attention of the citizens that are here. That these public funded projects do make places for citizens and they should be filled by people willing to serve. Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "Mr. Prusinowski."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Yeah, I just have to correct that information. Number one, when we asked Mr. Young to serve on the committee, he was willing to serve. Now whether or not he attended the meetings, we'll look into. Number two, to the correct information, Mr. Kasperovich, is that if you had read the regulations from the EPA, the Environmental Protection Agency establishes the citizens participation Committees with the sole interest of appointing people who have a conflict of interest. Believe it or not, the reason why they want these type of people and one of the reasons we picked Mr. Young is that the project involves buying property, work related to technical fields and they feel they want people on there who have a conflict of interest. No so much that they're going to derive money from the project, but who have interest in the community whereby producing this project it might hurt their own business. The purpose of the citizens participating committee is a requirement from the EPA. And we fulfilled that requirement, I believe, in a proper manner. Thank you."

PERSONAL APPEARANCES - continued

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you Mr. Prusinowski. Thank you Mr. Kasperovich."

William Kasperovich: "Do I have a rebuttal to this."

Unidentified speaker from the audience: "How about at the end of the session."

Supervisor Janoski: "How about — this is not — the purpose is not for a debate and I'm sure that we will be meeting many times in the next two years Mr. Kasperovich, so let's give someone else a change to speak. Fran?"

(Tape ended) (tape began)

Fran Vitollo, Wading River; "We have this Mr. Bill Kasperovich, evidently he has nothing else to do but to bother the residents of my community. I have received a number of calls and I'll go back to 1972 where they feel that an individual like this has been coming to you people and doing nothing but complaining about my residents and feel that he must be on the payroll and I thought that I would let you people know about this and they want it on record that he is not getting paid for the complaints that he has caused my communities since 1972."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you Fran. Jessie."

Jessie Tomlinson, Wading River; "I have a couple of questions on some of the resolutions and then I have a brief comment. On the moratorium, the three month moratorium on the game room which I'm very pleased. I think three months, though, is kind of short considering that the Town Board and the other Boards usually act slowly on any sort of changes or corrections to planning in the Town, but I'm pleased at least that it is for three months. I'd like to know whether or not the game rooms in Tepper's and 7-11 have been removed. Does anybody know?"

Supervisor Janoski: "Well first of all, let me say that we pass three months and the Town Board, of course, if more time is necessary can extend the moratorium. To my information the two game — and this is part of the problem, we don't even know if we could call them game rooms. The two places that you mention have been — have ceased operation."

Jessie Tomlinson: "On the appointment of Peter Danowski as the Deputy Town Attorney and on Frank Yakaboski is that — you always say agreed upon hourly rate. What is the agreed upon hourly rate? I think the people would like to know."

Supervisor Janoski: "Certainly. The special counsel to the Town of Riverhead receive a compensation of \$65 per hour."

Jessie Tomlinson: "Okay. Now I just have a comment about the Planning Board. As you know, I'm a member of the Planning Board and I was rather disappointed and somewhat disturbed that you did not choose to see fit to reappoint Robert Donnelly. Mr. Donnelly has been a member of the Planning Board for five years. He had some experience on the Zoning Board and I believe he has brought a degree of professionalism and expertise to the Planning Board. That will be sorely missed and I have no quarrel with Mr. Larsen. I know that he is happy to be on the Board. I know he's wanted to for many years. But I think it has to be said that the reason Mr. Donnelly was not reappointed was political and the reason that Mr. Larsen was appointed was political. And you can't sit there and pretend that you are interested in good government in the case of other appointments and in this particular case disregard the procedure that you, Mr. Janoski, insisted upon when Mrs. Wendelken was appointed to the Zoning Board. I don't think it's fair to the citizens of the community that you have a double standard, shall we say.

And, Mr. Boschetti, I happen to be one of the people in the Town who read your ads, your political ads and I remembered distinctly that you said on many occasions that you would not make any appointments based on politics. And I think your actions tonight do not agree with your statements.

I just would like to end by saying that there's an old adage, political power corrupts and absolute power corrupts absolutely."

Supervisor Janoski: "Jessie, I have to say that my only regret is that your term of office was not up on the Planning Board. Um . . ."

Jessie Tomlinson: "I think, Mr. Janoski — Mr. Janoski, I think that remark is absolutely rude and not in keeping with the Supervisor of the Town — this Town. Having not lived here as long as some of us, you don't know that this Town resents nasty remarks like that. Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "You're welcome."

Councilman Boschetti: "Mr. Supervisor."

Supervisor Janoski: "Yes Lou Boschetti."

Councilman Boschetti: "Regarding the appointment of Mr. Larsen, I have to tell you that you're right. I'm glad you read my ads and I'm glad so many others did with you and I'm glad that people believed them as I did. The reason I voted for Mr. Larsen is quite simple. Mr. Larsen is qualified. I — in my ad I stated that political considerations would not enter into my decisions. That works both ways. You can say it is against him or you can say it is for him. I discounted it completely and only considered the man's qualifications. It is my belief based on what I was told by Mr. Fairley and Pat Tormey that a revision of the Master Plan is necessary at this time. Mr. Larsen has that ability. He helped establish the last Master Plan. So I think the appointment is appropriate and I'm glad I voted the way I did. But thank you for your comment."

Supervisor Janoski: "Is there anyone else that wishes to be heard at this time?"

Unidentified speaker from the audience: "Yes."

Supervisor Janoski: "I hear a big yes, but I don't see a hand. Oh, Mr. Tomlinson."

Bob Tomlinson, Wading River; "Mr. Lombardi said tonight that he was voting no on the appointment of Mr. Larsen to the Planning Board and asked why there wasn't any public announcements and seeking of resumes by the four gentlemen that sit up there, who several months ago said they would do just that in the past. In addition to which Joe, I think that your coustic remarks to my wife are uncalled for. But I would like to first and primarily have your answer as to why you're neglecting to do as the four of you said you would do in the last election."

Supervisor Janoski: "I will say to you, that first of all, that perhaps let me explain why I made that comment because I have here the minutes of the meeting of January 1, 1978, and my comment was directed towards the fact that your wife was

appointed when Richard Larsen was removed at that Town Board Meeting."

Bob Tomlinson: "That's right."

Supervisor Janoski: "I certainly meant no insult."

Bob Tomlinson: "It was political."

Supervisor Janoski: "It was political."

Bob Tomlinson: "As it is tonight."

Supervisor Janoski: "And certainly this is a political business. I would perhaps not want to take the time to read the minutes of that particular meeting, but I will say that I have a copy of them here and leave it rest at that."

Bob Tomlinson: "Joe, that doesn't do away with the fact that you and the gentlemen sitting along side you, said during the last election that you would seek resumes and interview qualified people. You did not do that or did you do that?"

Supervisor Janoski: "We considered a number of names and quite honestly with the five years that Mr. Laresn had on the Planning Board previously, the fact that philosophically my one question over and over again was pro-business and growth which I think we desperately need. A consistency with the members of the Town Board as it is now constituted. I — and also of the fact that I think that."

Bob Tomlinson: "Joe, you appointed Bea Miller as Bingo Inspector."

Supervisor Janoski: "Whom?"

Bob Tomlinson: "Bea Miller."

Supervisor Janoski: "Yes."

Bob Tomlinson: "A qualified wonderful person, nice woman, who'll do a great job. It was political. We expect that, political but qualified. Mr. Larsen is qualified, but you tend to hide and lie. You said that you would open it up to the public with resumes, come in for interviews. I can tell you you're going back to minutes of 1978, I'll go back to ours last year. When I sat with Mr. Reyer."

Supervisor Janoski: "Sir, just a minute Sir."

Bob Tomlinson: "And he begged me to have Larsen appointed to the Planning Board in place of Maurie Semel, so he could have ticket money for the Republican functions. Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "Now, I won't appreciate your tone in this room and certainly — he's teaching me how to talk on the radio. We will just let it drop then, because I don't intend to have an argument."

Bob Tomlinson: "All right, we'll have it Friday. Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "Is there anyone else who wishes to be heard at this time. Yes ma'am."

Dorothy Painter: "Good evening gentlemen. Mr. Tomlinson did take a few words out of my mouth."

Supervisor Janoski: "Could you give your address also?"

Dorothy Painter: "Pardon me?"

Supervisor Janoski: "Your address."

Dorothy Painter: "I've lived in Riverhead for twenty-seven years."

Supervisor Janoski: "We need to have your address."

Dorothy Painter: "My home address?"

Supervisor Janoski: "Yes."

Dorothy Painter: "I don't care to give it Sir. I haven't heard anyone elses. I've lived in the Town of Riverhead for twenty-seven years."

Supervisor Janoski: "We haven't asked for your telephone number."

Dorothy Painter: "No. I wouldn't give that out either. I'm very selective. I did want to ask a question. There was a resolution concerning a Bingo Inspector, I believe. What are the qualifications for a Bingo Inspector?"

Supervisor Janoski: "Probably in law, they require a certain residency in town and perhaps an age requirement. Outside of that, I would probably . . ."

Dorothy Painter: "Would there be any reason why someone performing their duties as a Bingo Inspector would no longer hold that position?"

Supervisor Janoski: "No, there would be no reason."

Dorothy Painter: "In other words, this again, is a political appointment. This is a case of we're in power, we'll pick our own. In other words, Mary Lawrence is no longer the Bingo Inspector because she happens to be a Democrat?"

Supervisor Janoski: "I don't believe I know Mary Lawrence. Did you want to say something, Joe. Did you ask for the floor. I don't know Mary Lawrence."

Dorothy Painter: "I assume Sir, that that must be the reason. Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "Yes ma'am."

Jean Hudson, Riverhead; "I am referring to the designated terms of the Board of Directors — Board of Assessors. Why, that Mr. Charles Crump who has been an assessor for eight years."

Supervisor Janoski: "Mr. Prusinowski."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Two years ago, when the Republican Party won the last election, there were some things that have swung with the political elections for years and years. One of them being the Bingo Inspector, which historically over the years, except in a few instances, I remember Cy Walsh the Democratic Party appointed him one time as Bingo Inspector, has historically gone with the will of the election."

Two years ago, Mr. Stakey was not experienced enough to assume the position of Chairman of the Board of Assessors. We re-appointed Mr. Crump and I have no reservations, he did a great job, he was a good assessor. He's a good friend of mine. But two years later, the voters of the Town of Riverhead have elected a Republican Town Board and I think that it's not inappropriate to appoint Mr. Stakey who now has two years of experience as Chairman of the Board. This is not a reflection on Mr. Crump. He's a fine man, he's done a fine job, and we appointed him and I voted for him last time two years ago."

Jean Hudson: "But isn't he more qualified?"

Councilman Prusinowski: "He's got more experience, but I think Mr. Stakey can do a fine job."

Jean Hudson: "So it's political?"

Supervisor Janoski: "Yes it is. Is there anyone else that wishes to be heard at this time?"

No one else wished to be heard at this time.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned at 8:56 P.M.
