Supervisor Janoski: "Under unfinished business we have a special permit for a general aviation airport from Riverhead as has been mentioned in the correspondence. We received additional input in the Environmental Impact Statement. The Town Board has reviewed that input and has raised some questions which we feel were not adequately answered and those questions will be returned to the applicants for submission of additional information.

From Riverhead Flagg Corp. an application for a change of zone and special permit for condominiums, we have received a Draft Environmental Impact Statement. And are presently in a thirty-day period which is allowed for public comment on the Environmental Impact Statement.

From Edward Sujecki, special permit for addition to labor house, it is presently before the Planning Board.

I would, at this time, recognize anyone who wishes to be heard? Yes Sir."

"Good evening, Gentlemen. My name is Norman Wehrman, citizen of Riverhead, residing in Glenwood Village. I'd like to take this opportunity speaking for the constituents at Glenwood Village trying to bring to the attention of the Board the, the situation that prevails, that the newly (few words inaudible, not talking into the microphone at this time) --- raceway. The Planning Board has a meeting on June the 3rd, and there was some questions asked of Mr. Jim Cromarty at that time and I would like to reiterate some of them. And namely was that he would cooperate with the residents and with the owners of Glenwood in reference to noise. The Board --- the Planning Board at that time requested he acquaintance himself with the section of the Town rules that govern loud noises, rights and so forth that might affect Glenwood Village was in the Town of Riverhead. He said he would do so. He also made a statement, at that time, that all the race cars would now have a new type muffler on and the noise would practically be nil. Now I don't know whether you had heard the Raceway this past Friday night, the parade here Friday, the parade here Saturday, but it's intolerable. We do not want the Raceway to go, we're not out to try to make the Raceway go, but we think that something should be done to try to curtail the noise. Maybe they have to bring in an acoustical engineer, or a sound engineer and re-install a fence as a backroom to the sound that's facing Glenwood Village that this noise will then be deflected back toward Route 58 and up in the air.

And I just would like to thank you for the opportunity to be able to state our cause and our reasons for coming here tonight and praising you of this intolerable situation."

PERSONAL APPEARANCES - continued

Irene J. Pendzick: "Could I have the spelling of your last name, please?"

Norman Wehrman: "W-E-H-R-M-A-N."

Irene J. Pendzick: "Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "The Town Board is aware of some of the problems that existed since the raceway started in operation this season. And our position has been that we want to work along with the new owners to see if we could come to an agreement as to how their operation is run so that we can co-exist, so that the operation can go on through the season and so that there will be a minimal disturbance of the neighbors of the area and I hope that we can accomplish that."

Norman Wehrman from the audience: "I hope so myself, because you must realize that we have several hundred people living there and the majority are elderly and the noise is just unbearable. There is --- the amount of money that that raceway brings into our Town is negligible in comparison to the amount of money that resides and stays in Riverhead, from social security and pensions. Social security alone brings into Riverhead, and that money stays here, over six million dollars a year. That raceway, the very maximum, fourteen engagements, they started with eighteen, but were rained out, they figured fourteen. The maximum that they could bring in is around \$300,000 and that's not staying here, that's pulling out. We don't want the raceway to go. We feel it's good for the community. We feel it will help the community, but we want something done about the noise."

Councilman Prusinowski: "As you know, the last race must start before 11:00."

Norman Wehrman: "We know that."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Okay. Have they been living up to that part?"

Norman Wehrman: "Yes they have."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Okay. I just wanted to ask that because I asked Mr. Cromarty that when he was in there."

Norman Wehrman: "They have lived up to it, yes."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Okay."

Irene J. Pendzick: "I was going to tell you, is your microphone on? Is the button pushed up? Okay, thank you."

Norman Wehrman: "Did everybody hear me?"

Supervisor Janoski: "Oh, absolutely."

Councilman Lombardi: "We heard you."

Norman Wehrman: "Thank you very much."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you. Does anybody else wish to be heard at this time? Mrs. Tax Receiver."

Dorothy Jermusyk, Tax Receiver: "Supervisor Janoski, Councilmen, I'd like to make my final report for the year 1981-1982. Our total warrant for collection this year was \$18,864,253.34. We collected \$17,898,239.87. We returned as unpaid items \$966,195.37. This represents approximately 95% of the taxes due. We disbursed to the schools \$10,535,276.53. To general town and special districts \$6,958,232.33. The balance, of course, was given to Suffolk County \$404,731.01. Our audit came out to the penny. We were the third Town in Suffolk County to turn our books in, passed only by Southampton who is number one and they're on computer. Shelter Island was number two, with one book. We have nine books, so I think we did a pretty good job.

I also issued checks to the Supervisor, one check for \$13,810.79 which represents the amount of penalties that we collected on late payments and \$17,373.02 interest earned on our day of deposit accounts. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all of you for the cooperation of and help you have all given me. I want you to know that I have enjoyed

being your Tax Receiver and I've done my best. Thank you very much."
