

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Hall, Riverhead, New York, on Wednesday, January 2, 1980.

Supervisor Janoski called the Meeting to order at 7:30 P.M., and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Supervisor Janoski asked the Reverend McElroy to begin the new year by giving an invocation to bless the Town and the proceedings of this Town Board.

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you Reverend. If I might be permitted, I'd like to make a short statement indicating that I certainly am happy to be here to serve the people of Riverhead. I have in the past few days worked with my fellow members of the Board. I see that we are going to cooperate and we all agree that our objective is to do the best we can for our Town. 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PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Supervisor Janoski: "We are scheduled for a public hearing at 8:00. If we might change the agenda a little bit, I would call on anyone that would like to be heard to address the Board. Please when you do so, come up to the microphone and give Mrs. Pendzick your name and address. Is there anyone wishing to be heard?"

Lizette Hand, 11 East Second Street, Riverhead; "I happen to read my Suffolk Life this afternoon after it came at 4:30. I'm interested in your comments that you might like to organize an office of community services, as agency you envision creating. May I ask what that would accomplish, present agencies do not?"

Supervisor Janoski: "Certainly. I don't view it as the creation of a new agency. As I looked about the organization of Riverhead Town Government, I see that various services are, for example, placed in the Office of the accountant. I might mention Dial-a-Ride and the Senior Citizens food program. What I would like to do is create a person who would be oriented towards the service of people and I would like to bring these services together under a person who would handle peoples services and I called it community services for lack of a better description. One of the things that we have done today is the creation of a new committee. It's a temporary committee which we called a committee for reorganization and we will be looking into that reorganization of moving various services away from, for example, the accounting department in an effort to try to make them more serviceable to the people. "

Lizette Hand: "Rather than call it a committee, you call it a person?"

Supervisor Janoski: "We formed a new committee today, a temporary committee to look into this re-organization of services."

Lizette Hand: "Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "You're welcome. Is there anyone that wishes to be heard?"

Fran Vitollo, Wading River, First Street; "When you're speaking about all these different things you want

to do is this creating more jobs for different people? Would they be on the pay basis or — I am a person who is strictly for roads. I live in a community where the roads are very, very bad and I can't see anyone on any more payrolls for Riverhead Town and I see where you can save this money and add it to our roads. And I'm going to be here many many times bugging you for the repairs of the roads in Wildwood Acres."

Supervisor Janoski: "Let me say two things. One, as I've answered before, I'm not creating a new department. What we're after is re-organization, to try to make those services more answerable and more readily available to people.

The second thing I want to say that we will, in the future, under this administration look towards getting federal highway funds which is something that has not been accomplished in the past."

Steve Haizlip, Calverton; "What she mentioned about the highways, it brings something to mind that I noticed along the road. So many broken bottles and beer bottles and coca-cola bottles are laying there and the past highway superintendent said he made every effort in the world to keep this clean, but it got beyond his control. So I would like to bring it out to the new highway superintendent to see if his efforts will be any better.

I lost a son over a year ago, and I have a feeling that he hit a bottle at night coming home and his tire was blown out and I had a feeling that this contributed. So I'd like for the new highway superintendent to look into this situation."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you. I will take that under advisement and I certainly will bring it to the highway superintendent's attention. I don't know if he's here tonight. Yes, he is, so he has heard your message also. Anyone else wishing to be heard?"

No one else wished to be heard at this time.

RESOLUTIONS#1 APPOINTS TOWN ATTORNEY

Councilman Prusinowski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Regula.

be, and he hereby is, appointed Town Attorney for the term beginning January 1, 1980, at a salary of \$17,000 (seventeen thousand dollars), per annum, payable in equal installments every two weeks, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Attorney shall represent the Town Board at its direction on such matters assigned to him by the Town Board.

Councilman Menendez stated: "Mr. Supervisor, before you call a roll on that, I have a couple of questions I'd like answered. Is Mr. Duffy in the room? I haven't met the gentleman yet?"

Supervisor Janoski. "Yes he is."

Councilman Menendez: "Mr. Duffy, could I ask you a couple of questions, please?"

Kevin Duffy: "Sure."

Councilman Menendez: "We haven't had the opportunity to meet you yet Sir and I didn't know who to expect. My first question is are you as of this moment, a bona-fide resident of the Town of Riverhead?"

Kevin Duffy: "Yes I am."

Councilman Menendez: "You've moved into Town?"

Kevin Duffy: "Yes."

Councilman Menendez: "I see. You are living here physically?"

Kevin Duffy: "Yes."

Councilman Menendez: "Second question. Do you intend this job to be a full-time Town Attorney?"

Kevin Duffy: "Yes I do."

Councilman Menendez: "Where were you today?"

Kevin Duffy: "I was finishing up — I have worked for Price Waterhouse, as you can see from my resume and my last day was scheduled to be Monday, but the present Town Attorney was leaving so I had to come here to meet with him before he left office, and therefore, had to post-pone my resignation until today. And I had to finish closing up my affairs with my former company."

Councilman Menendez: "Okay that's reasonable."

Supervisor Janoski: "Doc, if I might interrupt I want to point out that I asked Kevin to do that to be here Monday instead of being here today, so that he could spend the day with Henry Saxtein, and go over the on-going business. I thought that was important that he become familiar with what was underway. It was under my request."

Councilman Menendez: "All right. Well I just wanted to know some things because we haven't been told."

Next question is, we saw your resume today for the first time and that was only on request because we wanted to see it. I see by your resume you got your law degree — not degree but you passed your bar in 1978, right?"

Kevin Duffy: "Yes."

Councilman Menendez: "And since then, you've been employed at Price Waterhouse as an accountant?"

Kevin Duffy: "Well doing tax work."

Councilman Menendez: "Well then your expertise is in the field of tax accounting, and accounting, right?"

Kevin Duffy: "Well when I was employed at my former company, I did legal work there and the type of work I did was similar to what I could be doing here."

Councilman Menendez: "In the courts, handling civil cases and . . ."

Kevin Duffy: "Well no. I acted as a conduit between our company and our attorneys."

Councilman Menendez: "I see."

Kevin Duffy: "To solve any problem."

Councilman Menendez: "Have you ever had any experience in municipal law?"

Kevin Duffy: "Only what I've had in school."

Councilman Menendez: "I see. Well thank you Mr. Duffy. Glad to have met you. Thank you."

The vote, Prusinowski, Yes, Regula, Yes, Lombardi, No, Menendez, No, and Janoski, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Supervisor Janoski: "Kevin, would you come up to the microphone please? Kevin I want to say that I'm happy to have you with us and I have extreme faith in your ability to carry out your duties. I would like to administer the oath to your office now. Do you, Kevin Duffy, swear that you will uphold the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of the State of New York and perform those duties appertaining to the office of the Town Attorney of the Town of Riverhead?"

Kevin Duffy: "I so swear."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you."

Kevin Duffy: "I would like to just say to the Board that my door will be open to all members at any time, because I take my professional responsibilities very seriously and any time any questions, I will do my best to answer it."

Councilman Regula offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Prusinowski.

WHEREAS, Under Section 64(9) of the Town Law, it is provided that the Town Board shall designate by written resolution, the bank or trust companies in which certain Town officers shall deposit moneys coming into their hands by virtue of their office,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that for a period of one (1) year, commencing January 1, 1980, Suffolk County National Bank be, and it is hereby, designated as the depository in which the Supervisor, Town Clerk, Town Justices, Building Inspector, Recreation Department Supervisor and the Receiver of Taxes of this Town shall deposit all moneys coming into their hands by virtue of their offices, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the limited purposes of the Tax Receiver's General Receipt Account, the European-American Bank and the Peconic Bank are hereby designated as a depository, and for the limited purposes of the Federal Public Works Program and Capital Projects, the Chemical Bank, the Peconic Bank, and the Suffolk County National Bank and the North Fork Bank & Trust are hereby designated as depositories, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that (1) all accounts be collateralized subject to the approval of this board with memoranda of agreement that they shall, for the period that they remain the official depositories, bid upon the obligations of the Town of Riverhead and its subordinate districts when the same are offered for sale.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Menendez offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Lombardi.

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 64(11) of the Town Law, the News-Review, Suffolk Life, Long Island Traveler Watchman, and the Wading River Community Journal, be and hereby are designated as the official newspapers for the publication of all notices, resolutions, ordinances, and other matters required by law to be published for the Town of Riverhead for the year 1980 and the Town Clerk shall publish therein only at the direction of the Town Board.

The vote, Prusinowski stated: "Due to the fact that I work for one of these newspapers, I will Abstain, Regula, Yes, Lombardi, Yes, Menendez, Yes, and Janoski, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

#7 DESIGNATES CHAIRMAN - BOARD OF ASSESSORS

Councilman Lombardi offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Prusinowski.

RESOLVED, that Charles Crump be, and he hereby is, appointed Chairman of the Board of Assessors for the year 1980, and that he be paid additional compensation of \$1,000.00 (One thousand dollars) per annum for serving as Chairman.

It always rubs me the wrong way, that the Town has to pay for a big party in New York City. I don't like it. Granted if they learned something, sure they go in there they learn something. But they could send one man from each department in there to go in and get the work and bring back the gospel. There's no use to send in an army for what a boy scout troop could do. I vote No on this."

Janoski, Yes.

Councilman Prusinowski stated: "Doc, if you remember in our executive session today, I agreed with you 100%. We did cut it down or restrict it, that last year all the Planning Board Members and Appeals Board Members attended this or had the option of attending this seminar and we did cut it down to the Chairman or the designee on these department heads. If they do attend these seminars and learn something that can be beneficial especially in some of these areas where you could bring some expertise back from other Towns, it is worth it if they go to party, I think it's a rip off. So I'll go this year and maybe next year, if it turns out to be a big party, I'll vote with you and vote no."

Bill Nohejl, Wading River; "A while back there was an award — not an award, a bid put out for maintenance of lights. Has anything been done on it?"

Councilman Lombardi: "No not yet."

Bill Nohejl: "There is no maintenance of lights in Town at present."

Councilman Lombardi: "The only ones — we still have the contract with Hinck and Broadway Maintenance."

Bill Nohejl: "To when."

Councilman Lombardi: "Till February 1. And we did put out for bids . . ."

Bill Nohejl: "Right, \$140,000."

Councilman Lombardi: "We still have to discuss this with the new Board."

Bill Nohejl: "I know because there's an awful lot of lights out. You've got them up there and they're out and you have a maintenance going on and not being taken care of."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Bill one of the proposals is that it's cheaper actually for the Town to run the lighting

operation itself, like almost \$100,000 cheaper. So we're looking into the Town purchasing or we have a truck, Joe told me today in the Building Department and it's cheaper for us to — I'm sorry Highway Department to actually to get in one employee and have him full-time to maintain the lights and it would be substantially cheaper and probably we'll get better service because I understand the service-men in these contractors have been far from excellent."

Bill Nohejl: "In other words, you think you can do it for about \$40,000."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Well \$40,000 or \$50,000."

Councilman Regula: "Well originally that's what we figured because of the cost of the truck. However, now that we've found this cherry picker and it's in working order according to our superintendent of highways then that will be substantially less. We were figuring the \$40,000 with buying a new truck. However, for at least a year or so we probably won't need another truck."

Bill Nohejl: "All right. I will upkeep on this because this is one of my pet peeves."

Councilman Lombardi: "Is your light down yet Bill?"

Bill Nohejl: "It's down. And it's put at a proper place, where a lot of others should be. Wading River is lit up like a little park in some of those areas."

Councilman Regula: "But Bill we must tell you that you can call our Community Development. They're the people that are handling it."

Bill Nohejl: "For one year I did it."

Councilman Regula: "Well we'll have to check that out."

Councilman Prusinowski: "One of the problems is probably

that when you have contracts, I understand that Hinck Electric or the other contractor is an out-of-town contractor and they had problems. It was just poor service. So we feel that on a full-time basis if we have an employee it would be a lot cheaper also you get immediate response, community development office or whoever will channel these complaints directly to the individual and we should have this problem corrected a lot faster than it has been. Because I know throughout the campaign, one of the peeves was that the lights are out all over the place."

Bill Nohejl: "Around February 15 I'll check on it."

Councilman Prusinowski: "Well we should have a decision before then. That's when the contract ends, February 1st."

Supervisor Janoski: "Bill we also feel that an employee that is a resident of Riverhead certainly would not want to tangle with you and would probably get those lights put up."

Bill Nohejl: "No just taken care of. Being that you've got them there why don't you take care of them. Because I think you're paying for electricity and the light is not being used so we're losing double."

Councilman Menendez: "Bill you want a job?"

Bill Nohejl: "How much you pay, Doc?"

Councilman Menendez: "\$20,000."

Councilman Prusinowski: "\$50,000."

Bill Nohejl: "You know these figures are going pretty high here. It might be tempting. Thank you."

Supervisor Janoski: "Thank you Bill. Anyone else wishing to be heard?"

Richard Carey, Middle Road, Riverhead; "I believe in the past the Board has organized on a level where certain Councilman assumed liaison with certain town departments. I'm wondering if that is going to be the procedure this year and if you've already made those designations."
