WHEREAS, a special permit application to repair and park equipment at Kroemer Avenue, Riverhead, New York, was filed by Robert Stevenot on December 17, 1979, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead referred this matter to the Planning Board for its recommendation and

WHEREAS, the Town Board held a public hearing on this application on February 26, 1980, wherein all persons wishing to be heard were heard, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board referred this special permit application to the Suffolk County Department of Planning which returned the application as a matter for local determination, and

Councilman Menendez offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Lombardi.

WHEREAS, a special permit application to use a house as a dwelling in an area zoned commercial, located at Harrison Avenue, Riverhead was filed by Herbert Obser on December 11, 1979, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead referred this matter to the Planning Board for its recommendations, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board held a public hearing on this application on February 26, 1980, wherein all persons wishing to be heard were heard, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board referred this special permit application to the Suffolk County Department of Planning which returned the application as a matter of local determination, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Riverhead Environmental Quality Review Board has recommended to the Town Board that this action does not require an environmental impact statement and this Board concurs with their recommendation, and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board recommended to the Town Board that the special permit application of Herbert Obser to use a house as a dwelling in an area zoned commercial, located at Harrison Avenue, Riverhead be approved with the following conditions: that at such time as the residence becomes uninhabitable or is demolished, no new residence is to be constructed or continued on the subject premises, and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the special permit of Herbert Obser be granted subject to any restrictions, requirements, and/or limitations as detailed in the Code of the Town of Riverhead, section 108, the site plan dated May 3, 1978 as approved, and/or the report of the Planning Board as submitted.

WHEREAS, the Town Board has advertised for sealed bids for one (1) No. 4103 Dictaphone, or equal, ten-channel reproducer, and one (1) No. 4503K Dictaphone, or equal, high-speed search and time reader, to be compatible with Dictaphone Model 4000, ten-channel tape recorder to be used by the Riverhead Police Department,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the contract for one No. 4103 Dictaphone, or equal, ten-channel reproducer, and one No. 4530K Dictaphone, or equal, high-speed search and time reader be awarded to DICTAPHONE CORP., at a contract price of Six Thousand and Ninety Dollars (\$6,090.00), subject to the plans and specifications.

AWARDS SPECIAL PERMIT - DARRELL MEYER

Councilman Regula offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Prusinowski.

WHEREAS, a special permit application to renew a permit to operate a gas station at 520 West Main Street, Riverhead, New York, was filed by Darrell Meyer on January 9, 1980, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead referred this matter to the Planning Board for its recommendations, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board held a public hearing on this application on February 26, 1980, wherein all persons wishing to be heard were heard, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board referred this special permit application to the Suffolk County Department of Planning which returned the application as a matter for local determination, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Riverhead Environmental Quality Review Board has recommended to the Town Board that this action does not require an environmental impact statement but conditioned

that the tanks be tested for leakage and the results submitted to the Building Department before a permit is issued and this Board concurs with this recommendation, and

WHEREAS, the applicant submitted a letter dated January 8, 1980 that a hydrostatic pressure test was performed and all tanks checked out satisfactorily.

The vote, Prusinowski, Yes, Regula, Yes, Lombardi, Yes, Menendez, Yes, and Janoski: "Before I vote, I just want to say that this particular move is important to us not because it represents another business in the Town of Riverhead, but because at the meeting I attended last week with the Supervisors of the five east end towns, it was pointed out by the Federal Department of Energy that one of the prescriptions that they would find for the pending problems that we might have this summer with gasoline is to get our gas stations opened again. A number of them have closed and I'm happy to see that one is, in fact, opening which will receive an allocation of gasoline which will not disappear. I vote Yes."

#128 AUTHORIZES THE TOWN BOARD TO APPOINT SIX (6)
SPECIAL POLICE

Councilman Lombardi offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Menendez.

RESOLVED, that the following named personnel be appointed to the position of special police, for the Town of Riverhead. Said appointments to be effective March 4, 1980, at no salary. The personnel are Frank Mackie, Dixon Palmer, Jeffery Wernikowski, Gary Hotchkiss, Stephen Palmer, and Walter Bone.

The vote, Prusinowski, Yes, Regula, Yes, Lombardi, Yes, Menendez, Yes, and Janoski: "I think I better explain this a little bit. We have these six young men in school for the past number of months and they will spend this time — I guess the best way I can describe it is an internship with the regular police department to fulfill their training. I vote Yes."

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

#129 AUTHORIZES APPLICATION FOR STATE AID FROM THE NEW
YORK STATE DIVISION FOR YOUTH UNDER THE YOUTH
DELINQUENCY AND DROPOUT PREVENTION PROGRAM-RECREATION
DEPARTMENT

Councilman Menendez offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Lombardi.

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead to apply for the Youth Delinquency and Dropout Prevention Program and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that such application is in all respects approved, and Joseph Janowski, Supervisor, is hereby directed and authorized to duly execute and to present said application for approval to the New York State Division for Youth, in the amount of \$26,663.00.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.


