RESOLUTIONS

#130 REAFFIRMS SUPPORT FOR COAL FIRED PLANT AT JAMESPORT
Councilman Menendez offered the following resolution which was unanimously adopted by the Entire Town Board.

WHEREAS, this Town Board is in unanimous agreement that a coal-fired generating facility located at Jamesport in the Town of Riverhead is in the best interests of the residents of the Town, and its neighbors, and

WHEREAS, the Town, and the entire eastern end of Long Island is experiencing an economic decline regarding jobs, business expansion and the resulting erosion of the tax base, and

WHEREAS, the establishment of a coal-fired generating facility would be an effective vehicle to economic recovery, by providing the jobs and an expanded tax base, and

WHEREAS, the Long Island Lighting Company's present facilities are 100% oil-fired in its fuel requirements, and the proposed coal-fired facility will reduce dependence on oil to some degree, to the benefit of not only this area, but to the State and even the Nation, and

WHEREAS, existing Federal and State environmental regulations regarding coal-fired generating facilities adequately protect the environment,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead unanimously supports the siting of a coal-fired generating facility located at Jamesport, in the Township of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York.
