Supervisor Leonard called the Meeting to Order at 10:30 A.M.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Alex E. Horton, Supt. of Highways asked the Town Board to secure engineers to inspect the Highway Building floors. He further added that they are in dire need of repairs.

Mr. Horton also asked the Town Board for a definite decision on who will take care of clearing snow and ice from the Parking Fields during snow storm periods.

After some discussion by the Board the following resolution was offered:

RECEIVER OF TAXES

Irene Pendzick, Receiver of Taxes, reported that all the tax bills are mailed out and this is the first time that they have been mailed out by the lien date.

At this point of the meeting Supervisor Leonard asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

PERSONAL APPEARANCES

RAYMOND MCKAY - congratulated the Town Board on having the foresight to go to Connecticut and visit the Atomic Plant where they have the first-hand information.

COUNCILMAN YOUNG reported: "Next Tuesday, the Town Board is going up to Brookhaven Lab and have arranged to talk to some of the top scientists up there who will tell us what the story is."

MR. MCKAY then complained about a low spot on Union Avenue, Aquebogue, that fills up with water. He further stated that it presents a dangerous situation when it freezes, especially for the school buses.

COUNCILMAN YOUNG said that he had spoken with Alex Horton and the problem is being looked into.

MR. MCKAY then talked about the Town getting the Dog Catcher a new wagon with a two-way radio to make this job easier.

COUNCILMAN YOUNG said that the Town was in a legal bind, because the Dog Catcher is not a Town Employee, he is a private contractor.

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PERSONAL APPEARANCES continued:

SUPERVISOR LEONARD commented that they have had trouble over this before and also with Civil Service.

MR. ROY HOOPER, referred to item #28 on the Agenda and asked why it was necessary to have overtime in the first place, when there are six men working at the Dump. He further stated that if Mr. Horton could run the Town Dump for \$40,000 a couple of years ago, why is it necessary to spend \$200,000 to do the same job today. He further added that something should be done to lower the taxes for the Senior Citizens.

EDWARD GADZINSKI, Foreman of the Sanitation Department, said he has been in charge of the Sanitary Landfill since 1964. He further commented on the fact that some of Mr. Horton's ideas didn't work and he got criticism from the Health Department. He further explained about the men who operate the Dump and why they are necessary. Prior to this arrangement there were people coming in from all over the County using our Dump to dispose of their garbage. Now there are about 1,000 less people coming in. He concluded by explaining about the overtime and the need for it.

PAUL MEYER complained about the hunters shooting too close to his house and stated he was told they should be no closer than 500 yards away from residences.

SUPERVISOR LEONARD commented that the law was 500 feet not 500 yards.

MR. MEYER then asked if signs could be posted stating that a fine would be imposed if hunters shot too close to homes.

CHIEF GRODSKI replied that under Section 130 of the Town Law, certain Townships including Riverhead, permit the municipality to further restrict hunting, but when they do pass an Ordinance, it must be forwarded to the Conservation Department for approval first. He further stated that answering complaints about hunters does take up an awful lot of police time and it is a problem.

JUDGE MANNING stated that the Town Board and the Town Attorney are considering drafting an Ordinance prohibiting hunting within the hamlet of Riverhead.

SUPERVISOR LEONARD asked Mr. Horton to explain the need for the overtime compensation resolution for one of the Highway Department men.

MR. HORTON replied that a policeman called up at 4:00 o'clock in the morning and he had to send someone up.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

West Side Realty Co. -Petition for Bank Building in the Riverhead Shopping Center. Supervisor Leonard reported that these people were before the Board and they found out that under the circumstances they would have to withdraw their petition until further notice.

DATA PROCESSING: Supervisor Leonard reported that the County has offered to do the tax rolls for the Town and a meeting on this is scheduled for December 4th at 2 P. M. with the Assessors, Tax Receiver and the County.

Mrs. Marie Hoff replied she was not acquainted with the contents of this ordinance.

Town Clerk reminded her that it has been published in the local newspaper and posted on the bulletin board in her office.

Town Attorney read and explained the contents of the provisions in the Amendment to Ordinance #18.

Chief Grodski asked if this would create problems with out-of-state fishermen.

Town Attorney explained that there will now be some controls on the uses of the beaches, with the proper permits.

Chief Grodski said he was just worried about the parking problems they used to have with the fishermen parking along the roads and walking down to the beaches to fish.

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Leonard declared the Hearing closed.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.


Town Justice Leonard offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.
