

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead  
held in the Town Hall, Riverhead, New York, on Wednesday, January 2, 1974 at  
10:30 A. M.

Supervisor Leonard called the meeting to order at 10:30 A. M., and wished everyone a Happy New Year.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Menendez.

RESOLVED, That the office of Town Attorney for the Town of Riverhead be and hereby is established with a salary of \$12,000.00 per annum payable in equal installments every two weeks and with secretarial and office expenses at \$2,000.00 payable by voucher.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the job description of Town Attorney shall include attendance to Town Board Meetings, drafting of unusual resolutions, review of legal notices, memorandums on legal issues, drafting of ordinances, attendance to Zoning Board and Planning Board and Department Heads, attendance to day-to-day matters of the Town Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Allen M. Smith, Esq. of the Town of Riverhead be and he hereby is appointed Town Attorney for the Town of Riverhead for the term beginning January 1, 1974;

The vote, Councilman Menendez, Yes, Town Justice Manning, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Councilman Young, Yes, and Supervisor Leonard, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Before voting, Judge Leonard asked Mr. Smith this question: "There will be no conflict between you, Easthampton, Southampton and other places where your firm represents?"

ALLEN M. SMITH: "I do not anticipate any of the matters other than identified to me by the Board in discussion we have had as being in conflict. If there is conflict between the position of Town Attorney and any of the clients of the firm of Smith, Tasker and Finkelstein, the Board will be advised of that conflict immediately and appropriate action taken by the Board."

REGINALD C. SMITH, ESQ., Father of Allen Smith administered the Oath of Office to his son as Town Attorney and said it was just 40 years ago today that he was sworn in as Town Attorney.

Reginald Smith: continued

He pointed out Syrena Stackpole who was then Justice of the Peace. He told the Board that he remembers that the Laws of 1934 required that there be two meetings of the Town Board each year. One to take place after the day of Election and the other one day or two before the Annual Meeting of the Board of Supervisors. We were creating the Sewer District at that time, so there were many meetings of the Town Board - sometimes we met every night.

Mr. Smith continued saying that there is a famous man who lives out in California and his name is George W. Percy, Sr. He was the Town Attorney for the Town of Southampton from 1913 to 1952 and he went through about six different administrations after shifting from Democrats to Republicans but Percy went on forever and here is his motto - "Be the Town Attorney and don't be a member of the Town Board. You are not hired for purpose of making policy or administrative procedures, you are hired to look after them to see that they don't go wrong. You can advise them and warn them of the consequences of their acts. But please don't tell them what to do." Mr. Percy had that policy from 1913 to 1952. Mr. Percy is still around and is older than Mr. Smith. (Followed by applause)

PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Supervisor Leonard asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

Dr. Caryl R. Granttham, President, representing Riverhead First Committee read a statement to the Board, following are some excerpts:

"The Riverhead First Committee wants to congratulate the new Board as it assumes responsibility today for the direction of the governmental affairs of this Town. They have been given an overwhelming mandate to bring a more responsible and responsive kind of government to Riverhead and the citizens group stand ready to assist in any way.

These recommendations have been adopted unanimously by the Board of Directors at its early December meeting.

1. Strongly support the move to the Councilmanic form of government for Riverhead. That the ward or sector system of representation should be an integral part of the change over.

Recommend that the new Board of Councilmen be paid on a per diem basis at a most moderate rate and that such service be considered a high position of public service to the Town.

Urge that henceforth all Town Board Meetings be held at night.

2. Urge immediate completion and implementation of the Master Plan. The moratorium on certain growth pattern scheduled to run for one year will soon come to termination.

Press this new Board to address itself to the need for a reconstruction of the Planning Board. Expand Board to seven members and selection to the Board no longer be on the basis of political affiliation, but rather the basis of expertise, and high commitment to the public interest.

3. The Advisory Committee Board on Conservation needs strengthening. Senior Citizens have no such spokesman presently in the Town. A businessmen's and industrial development committee is urgently needed. An architectural review advisory committee could be helpful. " (End)

PERSONAL APPEARANCES - continued:

Edward Gadzinski, President of CSEA Unit offered the congratulations of the employees to the new Board and asked for the Town Board to schedule a meeting with the CSEA Unit to resolve some problems still left unresolved.

Roy Hooper said that the grandfathers and fathers of the people sitting on the Board helped build this Town.

Mr. Hooper said he worked for the Highway Department at one time and he knows how the Town runs and some of the people here who are getting these high wages are not earning them.

Mr. Hooper also said that he hopes this Democratic Board can see the light and help the old people who have no children and are paying library and school taxes. He is tired of hearing about recreation and children for they are not paying the bills.

Judge Leonard resented the Town Board being called a Democratic Board. He said he is a Republican, so the Board is bi-partisan.

Paul Meyer congratulated Dr. Gratham on the report she made before the Board. He believes she gave the proposals a great deal of study and they are sensible, and suggested the Board take them under consideration.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT MATTERS

Edward R. Munson, Building Inspector, said that the Attorney assigned to the National Flood Insurance Act has not made a report to the Town as yet, and asked if anyone knew what the status was.

Mr. Munson said we have discussed for sometime the drainage criteria and the curbs and gutter situation in the Town whereby the Town would have a criteria for correcting the drainage on private properties with establishing big stores, industries, etc. so that they don't create floods on our highways and to make sure they have proper entrance in the Town Highways as well as County and State Roads.

The last time Mr. Munson heard this matter mentioned was in the Minutes of the August 7th, 1973 Town Board Meeting, when it was turned over to the Town Attorney. Since then he has heard nothing.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT MATTERS - continued:

Mr. Munson spoke to the Board about the final report of the Building Department for 1973. He said the Budget amount was \$30,895.00. The fees taken in this last year were \$30,445.50. We are pretty close to being self sustaining and that is the way the Building Department should be - any services needed from the Building Department should be paid by the person who needs the services and not by the taxpayers and since there is quite a change in building prices, contracts and materials and services, etc., Mr. Munson requested the Town Board to look into the matter of raising the fees for building permits.

PETITION

Edward Carrera to Amend Zoning Ordinance. Filed.

Charles Cuddy, Esq., spoke briefly on the above Petition: "This is a survey of property located at Wading River-Manorville Road. 3/4 acre parcel, southerly portion of it is in the Business C Use District, remainder is in the Resident B District.

Applicant proposes to have entire parcel in Business C District. There is business property on both sides that is currently used. Wading River School is across the street.

Applicant will covenant any form the Board proposes.

Mr. Cuddy asked that this matter be referred to the Planning Board.

Supervisor Leonard recessed the meeting to hold a Public hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING-Billiard Parlor) - 11:45 A. M.

The Town Clerk submitted affidavits of publishing and posting Public Notice Calling Hearing to amend Zoning Ordinance No. 26 relating to Billiard Parlors by Special Permit of the Town Board.

The affidavits were ordered filed.

PUBLIC HEARING - continued:

Town Clerk read the following excerpt from the Riverhead Town Planning Board letter, dated 11/21/73:

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That this Board does recognize that billiard parlors would provide for recreation and entertainment, but does not consider that a permitted use should be granted without restrictions and for these reasons recommends to the Town Board not to amend the ordinance to allow billiard parlors as set forth in the aforesaid petition, but does recommend to the Town Board that they consider amending the Zoning Ordinance to allow this use as a special permitted use with a proviso that the permit be granted when an agreement has been entered into between the Town Board and the applicant for the special use of billiard parlors, whereby it is mutually agreed that the use may be terminated for just causes and for any other conditions which the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead would wish to impose." (End)

Town Clerk read the following communication from Charles E. Raffe, Esq. :

"On January 2, 1974, the Riverhead Town Board has scheduled a Public Hearing for 11:45 A. M. to consider the application of James Kulesa and West Riverhead Corporation for an amendment to the Riverhead Town Zoning Ordinance which would permit Billiard Parlors by special permit of the Town Board in Business D Use District. It is for that reason that I am enclosing with hopeful anticipation an original and two copies of a proposed resolution approving said change. It is my hope that following the Public Hearing, immediate action will be taken.

I would like to point out, in this letter to you, the fact that James Kulesa is the tenant under a lease with West Riverhead Corporation. The lease between West Riverhead Corporation, as Landlord, and James Kulesa, as tenant provides that Mr. Kulesa has until January 31, 1974 to obtain the necessary approvals from the Town of Riverhead for the zoning change and further for him to obtain the approval of the Secretary of State on his Billiard License. In the event all permits are not obtained, the lease becomes null and void, and all our efforts will prove futile.

It is for these reasons that I ask that immediate action be taken on our application. I also request that in the event you do approve the change, that you consider this letter as an application on behalf of Mr. Kulesa for a special permit to operate a Billiard Parlor on West Main Street, Riverhead, New York. Mr. Kulesa had formerly operated the Riverhead Billiard's and is acquainted with the business and is prepared to start his operation. He has been previously licensed by the State of New York who has found him a fit person to run a billiard parlor and they have advised us that it is only necessary to file an application showing a new location and they will give us a permit for a new location and provided the zoning allows a billiard parlor at said location." (End)

Charles E. Raffe, Esq. representing the Petitioners appeared before the Board and said:

"The Petition was filed by West Riverhead Corporation as a Landlord and Mr. Kulesa as a proposed tenant.

Under the Business D Use District Section 208A of Zoning Ordinance, there are no uses for Billiard Parlors and the Petitioner desires to use these premises for a Billiard Parlor which will provide for a recreational use.

Mr. Kulesa acquired these premises in April of 1973.

## PUBLIC HEARING - continued:

In the Zoning Ordinance in effect prior to October 11th, 1973, a billiard parlor was a permitted use under the Business D Use District.

The premises are located at 38 West Main Street. It is only several hundred feet away from the present operation.

Ralph Quinton last summer purchased the property and the Benjamin family at that time served notice on Mr. Kulesa that he would have to vacate.

Billiard Parlors are not permitted in any use district in the Town of Riverhead at this time. The values of the adjoining properties certainly would not be depreciated by the use or by granting us this extension.

One of the vacant stores located downtown in Riverhead would be rented.

1. Billiard Parlors are places for family recreation and entertainment. No one under the age of 16 may enter a billiard parlor unless accompanied by a parent.

2. No alcoholic beverages are served.

3. No gambling permitted.

Granting of this amendment will not create a parking problem for the place does lie within the public parking district.

The Town Board should recognize this need of a place of entertainment for young adults.

The petition of Mr. Kulesa being restrained from operating this business and from having a livelihood without granting such an amendment.

Mr. Raffe further said that he had examined some books on billiard parlors and it is true that for a long time the terminology pool hall designated the place as dark and dingy with lights hanging from the ceiling. But even the State of New York under the General Business Law saw the wisdom in changing the image of Billiard Parlors and it is now against the law to refer to them as pool halls.

I understand there is a large complex of them now in Smithtown, Babylon, Patchogue and Northport. The Towns in Suffolk County have seen fit to allow them and they are considered to be much more of a family entertainment.

Judge Leonard: "Did you say you are on the main floor?"

Mr. Raffe: "Yes."

Judge Leonard: "Have you inspected these quarters yet?"

Mr. Munson: "The building is a safe building and stable structure. I would say it could now be occupied."

Mr. Raffe: "There was a fire in this building some time ago and after the fire, the entire building was redone on the inside. They have carpets and panelled walls."

Judge Leonard: "Inspect it, please, Mr. Munson."

Mr. Munson: "He has to get a use permit and this would all be done before he gets his permit."

No one else wishing to be heard and no further communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Leonard closed the Hearing at 12 Noon and reopened the Meeting.

PERSONAL APPEARANCE

Anthony Tohill, Esq., spoke to the Board about the letter from Mr. Katz read at the Public Hearing for extensions to Water and Sewer Districts. He said he spoke with Messrs. Barr and Heller in the hallway and he will ask again that the orders as submitted by Mr. Tooker and subject to Town Attorney's approval be postponed because after talking with the gentlemen, he is aware that they are unaware of exactly what their fate will be with that property and it might be quite some time before their problems with the Town are resolved.

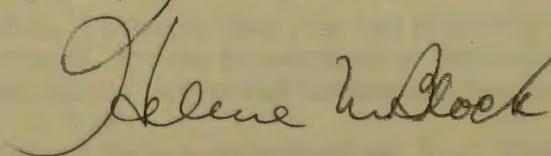
