Town of Riverhead Planning Board, dated 4/11/72, submitting the following recommendations on referral of petition of William G. Hubbard, Sr., William G. Hubbard, Jr., and Vincent Collura for amendment to Zoning Ordinance No. 26 of the Town of Riverhead, by adding to permitted uses of Business A Use District- "Riding Academy and Corral by Special Permit of the Town Board":

"Whereas, this Board has met with Mr. Charles Cuddy, attorney for petitioners, and reviewed their reasons for petition, and

Whereas, this Board has reviewed all of the uses permitted in Business A and reviewed the lands now zoned Business A in the Town of Riverhead which may be affected by the addition of this use, and

Whereas, this Board has referred to the Town of Riverhead's comprehensive plan and its recommendations for the future development of the resort businesses in the Town, and

Whereas, this Board believes that this use will aid in promoting the resort aspects of the community and is particularly suited in the Business A, "Resort Business" District of the Zoning Ordinance, and

Whereas, this use would not predominate because of the limited amount of Business A districts in the Town of Riverhead, and

Whereas, this use would not permanently alter the character of any resort neighborhood, and there is a lack of this activity in the area,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved that this Board recommends to the Town Board that the petition of William G. Hubbard, Sr., William G. Hubbard, Jr., and Vincent Collura for amendment to Zoning Ordinance No. 26, by adding to Article II, Section 205A, paragraph f the following: "Riding Academy and corral by Special Permit of the Town Board", be granted, and

Be It Further Resolved, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead." (End). Filed.

Charles R. Cuddy, Esq., dated 4/18/72, requesting the Board to withhold any action in connection with the application of Wm. G. Hubbard, Sr., Wm. G. Hubbard, Jr., and Vincent Collura to amend the Zoning Ordinance to the next meeting of the Board. Filed.

Town Justice Costello read the following "DETERMINATION" of the Town of Riverhead Zoning Board of Appeals in the matter of the application of W. Hubbard, Sr., and W. Hubbard, Jr., for a determination that having horses on the subject premises is an allowed use under Article II, Section 205A and Section 203A of the Zoning Ordinance:

" Mrs. Tormey: This Board feels that the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Riverhead is based on establishing certain uses in a district and excluding all others. However, we feel that where the Zoning Ordinance is set up in such way as to establish certain uses and exclude all others, only those that are specifically stated should be allowed. We feel that the harboring of animals, particularly these animals in question, which are to be used eventually for commercial venture, is not among those uses allowed in the Business A District. The Ordinance does in fact restrict the harboring of animals in the Agriculture District by regulating the harboring and maintenance of animals, by eliminating the raising of animals, riding academies, livery stables, etc., from that district. Zoning Ordinances, we find, do not generally regulate the keeping of pets. However, it would seem that seventeen (17) horses which were moved on to the subject property for use as hacks (riding horses) can hardly be considered as pets. They were, in fact, used as rented riding horses last year.

We agree with the statement that it is true that a park may be operated in this Zoning District. There is however, no definition of a "park" in the Ordinance. Any application for a Zoning Permit for a park would have to present specific plans for approval. That a zoo, game preserve, etc., would be allowed under the term "park" is an assumption by the appellant not borne out particularly by the Ordinance.

This Board is not in a position to know whether the future plans of the County of Suffolk as regards Indian Island Park, do definitely include riding stables or not. There is no present plan for maintaining or harboring horses. In any event the nebulous future plans of the County of Suffolk can hardly be considered binding on the Board of Appeals of the Town of Riverhead.

With all that in mind I will move that the appeal of W. Hubbard, Sr., and W. Hubbard, Jr., Hubbard Avenue, Riverhead, New York, for a determination that harboring horses on the subject premises is an allowed use under Article II, Section 205A and Section 203A of the Zoning Ordinance be DENIED. The motion was duly adopted by a roll call vote of all members present." (End).

Riverhead Town Republican Club, dated 4/6/72, submitting the following resolution adopted by its Board of Directors on April 5, 1972, for consideration by the Town Board: "Be it RESOLVED that the Riverhead Town Board urge the County Legislature to complete the studies of the Riverhead Traffic Circle as soon as practical and immediately thereafter take whatever action is necessary to relieve the traffic congestion in this area." Filed.

Councilman Young reported that a meeting has been held with County Legislators Strong and Halsey who will work on this matter and when plans are finalized will submit same to State and County Engineers and request a check on the traffic flow.

COMMUNICATIONS continued:

Riverhead First Committee, Inc., dated 4/3/71, relating to request of Clearview Community to correct zoning irregularities, which matter was referred to the Planning Board and to date not acted upon. Urging the Town Board to take the matter into their own hands and set a specific time limit for an agreement to be reached between affected parties or announce their own decision. Filed.

Wading River Civic Ass'n., dated 4/5/72, requesting permission to use parking area on the corner of Sound Road and North County Road on August 5, 1972. Also materials from Highway Department - also asking if it would be possible to provide temporary lighting fixtures for that date. Filed.

Permission granted to use parking area on August 5, 1972.

The matter of providing temporary lighting fixtures was referred to Judge Costello and the matter of highway materials to Supt. of Highways Alex E. Horton.

Wading River Civic Ass'n., dated 4/13/72, advising the Beautification Committee of the Wading River Civic Ass'n. has completed its review of the Twin Ponds area located in the center of the village and findings reveal two areas that require maintenance work to maintain the stability of the Pond. The first item is the removal of the road sand that has accumulated to a high level at the east end and the second item is the erosion of the north side of the Pond - asking to be advised as to what action will be taken. Filed.

Matter referred to Supt. of Highways.

Miss Theresa McDonald, dated 4/8/72, making complaint that people consistently park three to ten A & P shopping carts diagonally across the sidewalk in front of her property - this presents a hazardous problem to pedestrians. She has carried such complaint to the Police Department and to the Manager of the store to no avail and requests the Town Board to solve the problem. Filed.

Police Chief Grodski reported that he has talked with the owner of the apartment house who will look into the matter and also to the manager of the A & P Store who will take care of the complaint.

EXECUTIVE SESSION-7:15 P. M.

Edward R. Munson, Building Inspector presented plans for Proposal by Manor Lane Gardens, Inc., of 4 Sejon Drive, Sayville, N. Y., for five (5) buildings containing a total of 74 apartments in a Garden Apartment complex located on the east side of Manor Lane, Jamesport, N. Y.

The Town Board directed the Building Inspector to compile the necessary information for application for a Special Permit of the Town Board in accordance with Zoning Ordinance No. 26.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Supervisor Leonard asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

Mrs. Clara Haugaard, Wading River, N. Y., addressed the Board and read a statement relating to an encounter with Town Justice Thomas R. Costello in Justice Court. At the conclusion of the statement she asked that the Town Board request the Administrative Judge to conduct an investigation into the operation of the Riverhead Town Justice Court.

The statement was filed with the Town Clerk.

Mr. Edward Wood, spoke as a representative of the Riverhead Chamber of Commerce and presented the following proposals for a new Town Hall:

1. Modular Building on East Main Street.
2. Entire first floor of the Perkins Inn-the owner will remodel for rental to the Town.
3. The old Bohack Building on East Main Street.
4. Possibly build on Town-owned land on Route 58.

(Mr. Wood was applauded by John P. Riesdorff).

Mr. Gordon Ahlers, spoke as an independent citizen, and suggested the Town Board appoint a Town Hall Committee giving it six to eight weeks to make its report.

Mr. Ahlers concluded saying: "We have wasted the past 20 years-let's get the show on the road now".

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Alex E. Horton, Supt. of Highways, reported that the Insurance Company has offered a settlement of \$2000 on the damaged truck and he will not accept this amount for the reason that it is not enough to cover costs of repairs.

After discussion the matter was referred to the Town Attorney.

Mr. Horton also reported that Northville Dock is dumping oil refuse in the Town Dump.

Mr. Horton said this is creating a bad situation which is being criticized by the Health Department - he said he has written asking them to stop this routine but has had no response and suggested that a letter from the Town Board will bring results.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Police Chief Grodski called the Board's attention to Waste Disposal Ordinance which permits the residents in the area of Central School District #2, Town of Southampton, to use the Town Dump facilities.

Chief Grodski further stated that unless the Ordinance is changed his men cannot enforce the ban recently imposed by the Board.

After discussion, the matter was referred to the Town Attorney.

Supervisor Leonard recessed the meeting to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 8:00 P. M.

Town Clerk submitted affidavits of posting and publishing Notice of Public Hearing in the matter of the application of Dejomar Properties for a change of Zone from Agriculture A to Industrial B (Youngs Avenue) and for a special permit for a non-nuisance industry for recycling, salvaging and compaction on behalf of Dejomar Properties.

The affidavits were filed.

Thereupon Supervisor Leonard declared the Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to be heard.

John J. Munzel, Esq., representing Dejomar Properties, appeared before the Board and stated that it was agreed that the Town would sell Dejomar Properties the two acres of land for the placement of the truck garage, contingent on zone change to Industrial B.

That the property was presently zoned Agriculture A and an application was made to change the Zone to Industrial B on premises located on the north side of Youngs Avenue.

That the Planning Board has recommended that the petition for zone use district from Agriculture A to Industrial B be granted for the two acre parcel.

Re: Special Permit: The petitioners applied for a special permit in accordance with Article II, Section 210A, paragraph 2d of Zoning Ordinance - for establishing the use of recycling and salvaging of paper, glass and nonferrous metal.

The Planning Board approved the plan for recycling subject to further details.

Mr. Munzel outlined that the recycling will all be done indoors - that the petitioner proposes to pick up bundled papers, separate from the garbage - this will be done by districts and will be done FREE OF CHARGE - all baling will be done indoors - only nonferrous metals will be salvaged.

Councilman Grodski asked "Did I understand your client will pick up baled papers free of charge?"

Robert Parietti, Petitioner: "Only as long as the market conditions allow".

Mr. Munzel: "If it is not economical, my client will not continue the practice and the possibility is there that they will have to shut down."

Mr. Parietti stated this requires a sensitive operation as bottles will have to be separated by colored glass and it is not known that this Town can generate this.

Dr. Alfred Smith asked how long before the building will be built.

Mr. Parietti said he hoped it would be completed by September 1st.

Police Chief Grodski called the Board's attention to the ordinance prohibiting the placing of garbage and wares on curbs, sidewalks and streets, which is currently being violated by garbage containers being placed in front of homes.

PUBLIC HEARING - 8:00 P. M.

He said this practice takes away from the beauty of the local environs, as dogs and humans go through this garbage and it is most unsightly. He urged the Board that this ordinance not be violated.

Mr. Munzel stated that this is an ancient ordinance and pointed out it is more economical for the garbage trucks to pick up the garbage containers when they are placed in front of the homes.

John P. Riesdorff asked the Board what it was going to do about the containers on Main Street and those tied to parking meters.

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received hereto, Supervisor Leonard, declared the Hearing closed and re-opened the meeting. No action was taken by the Board on the aforesaid Hearing.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Town Attorney advised he is holding the prepared resolution on the Lighting District matter for a change in boundary.

Tooker Law Firm Donation for trees:

Councilman Young made a suggestion that we use the funds to buy and plant some trees. He further stated that he had talked to the Garden Club and they had offered to help and asked if the Town Board would be willing to donate some moneys.

Dr. Caryl Grantham applauded the Board's courage to beautify the Town. She said they are looking at a new master plan and should use it.

Judge Costello said we have a parking district and the Chamber of Commerce is 100% for its maintenance. He added that it's a wholesome thought and he is all for it.

Mr. Wickham Tyte suggested the Board start a Special Account for beautifying the Town and add moneys to it as received. He further suggested that trees be planted along the River.

Councilman Young replied that only half of the River is bulkheaded.

Mr. Sidney Block asked who was responsible for cutting the trees down and when was this done.

Town Clerk replied that the person responsible for the act is now deceased and we should let his soul rest in peace.

Miss Syrena Stackpole stated that the trees once shaded the windows of stores and offices and although they had to use electricity they were happy to do so. She added that one storekeeper asked the former Supt. of Highways to ax one tree and he put the rest of them away.

TOWN ATTORNEY

Francis J. Yakaboski, Town Attorney informed the Board that he has received a communication from the Attorney General's Office stating they have a complaint from the Wildwood Acres Association, Inc., to the effect that the Town refuses to maintain the following streets as public highways: Hulse Avenue, Park Street, Hill Street and 230 feet of Wildwood Road.

He added that the complaint further states that it appears that each of these streets are 50 feet wide and asks an explanation as to why the Town Board refuses to recognize them as Town Roads under Section 189 of the Highway Law, and maintain them as such.

A lengthy discussion followed, after which the Town Board decided that the matter be referred to the Supt. of Highways to examine the roads and make report and the Town Attorney to research the Highway Law.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

Edward R. Munson, Building Inspector, asked the status of the following matters:

1. Bayview Hotel
2. Merkd's Day Care Center

The Town Attorney advised Mr. Munson that he is preparing documents to serve on the Bayview Hotel people and will file an appeal to the Appellate Division on the Merkel matter.

RESOLUTIONS

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

WHEREAS, Frank Block, Laborer in the Highway Department has successfully completed his six months probationary period, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Superintendent of Highways be and is hereby authorized to increase said employee's salary from \$2. 75 per hour to \$3. 50 per hour, payable bi-weekly, effective April 18, 1972.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Leonard, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

WHEREAS, Said applicant has filed with the Town Clerk a Certificate of Insurance naming the Town of Riverhead with a coverage limit of \$500,000/\$500,000 for Public Liability and \$500,000/\$500,000 for Property Damage, and a sketch showing location where the fireworks are to be discharged by N. Y. Pyrotechnic Products Company, Inc., the firm in charge of setting off said fireworks, and

WHEREAS, The Town Attorney has read and approved all papers filed in this connection, now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk be and is hereby instructed to issue a Fireworks Permit for the public display of fireworks, to the Riverhead Chamber of Commerce, for the evening of July 2nd, 1972, rain date July 3rd, 1972, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the issuance of said Permit is subject to conditions and provisions as contained in Section 405-Subd. 3 of the Penal Law of the State of New York.


Town Justice Costello read the resolution relating to State of New York Taking Map No. 62, Parcel No. 39 (Road).
