PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Supervisor Leonard asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

Donald Walsh, Past Fire Department Chief, asked the disposition of the resolution submitted some time ago by the Fire Department relating to the creation of a Fire Prevention Bureau.

Supervisor Leonard said no action was taken by the Board.

Town Clerk was instructed to add matter to "Unfinished Business".

PERSONAL APPEARANCES continued:

Charles Cuddy, Esq., appeared before the Board and talked on the matter of the Hubbard-Collura Application for Change of Zone.

Mr. Cuddy informed the Board that he had a conference with Mr. Dominy who requested a proposal in writing be submitted as to how they will use the Park - this proposal has been submitted in detail and is presently being reviewed by the County Attorney.

Mr. Cuddy asked the Board for a two week extension on its decision, which was granted.

APPLICATION FOR SPECIAL PERMIT - METROHOUSE ASSOCIATES, INC.

Charles Cuddy, Esq., presented an Application for Special Permit Use pursuant to Riverhead Town Ordinance No. 26, Section 207 A 2-b for the Construction of Apartment Dwelling Units.

Mr. Cuddy outlined as follows:

Applicant, Saul Muchnick, President of Metrohouse Associates, Inc.

For 180 unit efficiency apartments on East Main Street opposite A & P Store. 10 acre parcel of land - propose to erect 90 efficiency apartments, 90 one bedroom apartments plus a 3000 sq. ft. community building.

Will house entirely elderly residents for the Town of Riverhead.

\$75 to \$85 per month for the efficiency apartments. \$100 and up for the one bedroom apartments.

Recreational facilities will be provided.

550 sq. ft. for each efficiency unit - 600 sq. ft. for single apartments.

Builder is an experienced builder.

Mr. Cuddy asked the Town Board to refer the matter to the Planning Board and this was so ordered.

PETITION-(Crow's Nest Drive Residents)

Residents of Crow's Nest Drive Reeves Park, asking to be excluded from proposal for Road Improvement District and acceptance as Town Highways. Filed.

Town Clerk explained that the petition is not properly executed, however, the petitioners were anxious to inform the Board of their intentions as of this date and will re-submit a corrected petition.

Mrs. Edward Hattorff asked the Town Board if it would consider a road for a street improvement district if one street signs a petition asking to be deleted from the improvement district.

Town Attorney: "Mrs. Hattorff, when you present petitions you are not indicating your desire to become part of the road improvement district - what the legal effect of the signature on the petition is, is to gain the acquiescence of a desired number of land owners on the street. Thereafter certain legal machinery goes into effect pursuant to the provisions of the Town Law. Once you have signed and I don't know of any way a person who signs can later say, -I want out."

Mrs. Hattorff: "What the committee would like to know is, would you accept roads for a road improvement district if a particular street - in this case Crow's Nest asks to be deleted from the District?"

PETITION-Crow's Nest Drive continued:

Town Attorney: "The question will be whether there are sufficient signatures of people owning on Crow's Nest Drive to cause the proper notices to be published and the district created on that street - if there are 60% of the resident land owners sign the petition - that is that. "

Mrs. Hattorff: "There are only three people on that street that want to be included in the district. "

Town Attorney: "Then your legal question is whether the proper percentage of people in the entire subdivision sign-whether they can force the entire subdivision to become part of the district, even though - say - six owners on a particular street representing 90% of the ownership don't want to be part of the district. That answer I don't know off the top of my head - but I suspect not. "

Councilman Young: "If 60% of the people in the entire district sign - it doesn't make any difference what the other 40% feel. The district will be created. "

Town Attorney: "The Town Law will govern not the Town Board. "

Mrs. Hattorff: "Then if the district is created - Crow's Nest will not be deleted?"

Town Attorney: "That's right - I will examine the law and give you an answer before the end of the week. "

Mr. Mario Simeola: "We are all against the improvement district with the exception of the three as mentioned by Mrs. Hattorff. We want to keep the road private. What do we have as a legal stand to keep it private?"

Town Attorney: "Your vote will be "No", but perhaps it may be in the minority. "

Judge Costello asked if the deed of the property calls for the center of the road.

Mrs. Simeola: "Yes, it does. "

Judge Costello: "That poses another problem. The Town Attorney will explain. "

Town Attorney: "The problem that everyone in the subdivision faces and in particular the people on the road committee is that you can have 60%, 70%, 80% - if the other 20% say, "No", they may well go to lengthy condemnation proceedings to acquire title of all these streets. "

Mr. Simeola: "How long will this procedure take - ten years- we hope?"

Town Attorney: "If pursued diligently it should not take too long. "

Mrs. Hattorff asked if Crow's Nest Drive can be included in condemnation proceedings?"

Town Attorney: "It will be a matter for the Board to determine. "

COMMUNICATIONS

Mrs. James Miller, dated 6/13/72, requesting street light on Pole #49, Hubbard Avenue, Aquebogue, as recently there has been vandalism and terrorizing in the neighborhood - she works at night and comes home before day light. Filed. Copy of Lighting Committee.

Little Flower Children's Services, dated 6/16/72, requesting permit to display fireworks on grounds of Little Flower on Saturday, July 1, 1972, rain date Sunday, July 2, 1972, application and certificate of insurance submitted with request and approved by Town Attorney as to sufficiency of coverage. Filed.

Town Clerk informed the Board that Mr. Thomas Galan of Riverhead Expo Corp. (Raceway) appeared in person and made request for permit to display fireworks Speed-way Grounds on Saturday, July 1, 1972, rain date Saturday, July 8, 1972. He submitted application and certificate of insurance, which was approved by Town Attorney as to sufficiency of coverage.

Mrs. Elva Mammina, dated 6/8/72, tendering resignation from the Narcotics Guidance Council for the reason she has moved to Rocky Point, suggesting name of Alan Pollock who works for the National Council of Churches in Riverhead to replace her, stating he devotes time and energy to the cause and would make a worthy member on the Council. Filed.

Town Clerk to reply.

Town of Southold Planning Board, dated 6/14/72, (copy of letter to Suffolk County Dept. of Planning), stating the Town of Southold feels that regardless of special exception or special permit such uses in relation to special exception and special permit uses for airports, race tracks and two family dwelling type 6, should not be allowed within 500 feet of the Southold-Riverhead Town Line. Filed.

N. Y. State Dept. of Transportation, dated 6/12/72, advising that jurisdiction over Highway Route 113 (Peconic Avenue) was transferred from the State to the Suffolk County Dept. of Public Works and therefore the State is repealing existing regulations which it established on Route 113. Asking that the usual joint request from the Town and County on the regulation be legally re-established. Filed.

Town of Riverhead Planning Board, dated 6/19/72, relating to petition of Henry and Marjorie Lamb for zone change from Industrial "A" to Residence "C" of various parcels of land fronting on Pulaski Street, Mill Road, J. T. Blvd. and Industrial Blvd. Recommending to the Town Board that the petition be denied. Filed.

Claire E. Kratt, Secy. of Reeve's Park Estates Civic Ass'n, Inc., asking that minutes of Town Board meeting on page 180, second sentence of Mrs. Dorman be changed to read from 16¢ per lineal feet to \$1.60 per lineal feet as Mrs. Dorman inadvertently quoted the wrong figure. Filed.

COMMUNICATIONS

Andre Harley, dated 6/13/72, writing for himself and neighbors who reside at the intersection of South Washington Avenue and Peconic Blvd. , South Jamesport, concerning dangerous intersection where several accidents have already occurred and near accidents are witnessed every weekend. Asking the Town to do something as there may be a fatality and asking consideration be given immediately to putting a regular traffic light at this intersection. Filed.

Copy to Police Chief Grodski and Supt. of Highways.

Police Chief Grodski reported: He has checked the location. A traffic light would cost \$10,000. Found that the full stop sign is always removed from that point. The approach signs indicating the intersection are too close. They don't give a preparatory warning and the communicant has a large red maple tree and a big birch tree right on the corner and possibly on Town property. All this can be corrected and white lines should be painted for the stop lines.

The matter was referred to Police Chief Grodski and Supt. of Highways Alex Horton.

CSEA Unit, dated 6/12/72, Building, Recreation, Sewer and Water District Department Heads requesting the establishment of an additional Employer-Employee Negotiating Unit. Filed.

Edward R. Munson, Building Inspector made the following comment: "Ever since the inception of CSEA and the Taylor Law there has always been a question of whether the department heads were in the contract at all - and we never knew whether we were going to be counted - so therefore we are leaving towards the whim of the Town and asking to be negotiating separately - and it is legal according to the Taylor Law to have several units. "

Judge Costello: "I said from the first day we negotiated with the CSEA that the Supervisors should have their own unit and we should have done this long ago. "

The Board tabled the matter for the next meeting of the Board.

HIGHWAY MATTERS

Alex E. Horton, Supt. of Highways, reported that Mr. Kart and Mr. Meier are working on the Little Bay Drainage matter and a report should be ready for the next meeting.

Mr. Horton complained that various contractors come in and dig up our roads in making connections.

Judge Costello suggested we go into a permit system and charge them each time they make an opening.

Mr. Horton reported that curb, gutter and sidewalk moneys are running low and asked what was to be done about the people that had paid for their curbing.

Town Clerk suggested the moneys be refunded as many people complain saying they can use the money.

Town Board agreed that the money be returned.

HIGHWAY MATTERS continued:

Mr. Horton reported re Town Dump: "In other Towns the Supt. of Highways get paid for taking care of the Dump. Southold pays \$3500, Southampton pays \$2500, and there was \$2500 put in the budget for me. I have been working there for one year and I haven't received any extra moneys - there is a sum of \$7500 in the budget and \$2500 was placed there for me. "

Councilman Young: "Do you want to have this job, Alex?"

Mr. Horton: "I will take it if I get paid for it. "

Supervisor Leonard: "I think the Board has already talked about a Sanitary Department. "

Councilman Young read a letter from Robert Villa, Engineer, Suffolk Co. Health Department to Riverhead Town Board as follows:

"I have addressed the Town Board several times since the beginning of the year regarding the operation of the town refuse disposal area. As it is now being operated, there are definite improvements needed to bring the site in compliance with part 19 of the New York State Sanitary Code.

Two major areas of concern to this office are supervision of the site and scavenger waste disposal. In the matter of supervision, I feel compelled to state that if this issue is not settled and someone designated to oversee the operation, then there is no alternative but for this office to write a case report to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and ask for legal action against the Town. We will be forced to take this action because there is no one at present to which we can address ourselves to take the necessary actions to ensure that the site will be operated as a true sanitary landfill.

The scavenger waste disposal problem could be solved by having the wastes discharged into the Riverhead sewage treatment plant facilities. This method of disposal would eliminate the present method of disposal and be the ultimate solution. We are aware that you have employed a consulting engineer to study some aspects of the treatment plant, and we strongly recommend that the firm be directed to make recommendations on this proposal.

If discharge and final disposal of these wastes to the sewage treatment plant is not possible, then a subsurface leaching pool system will have to be installed, as we no longer can condone discharge of such wastes to open lagoons.

Please inform this office of your intentions within the next two weeks so that we can initiate appropriation actions." (End)

Councilman Young: "I called Mr. Villa this afternoon and I told him that the engineers are planning to up-date our sewer disposal plant so that it can take care of this scavenger waste - however, the study won't be completed until September and it will be a year because of the work to be done before we can use the sewer plant. Mr. Villa has recommended a temporary septic tank. I think we can put it all under ground. He is coming up with a more detailed plan in the near future and I told him we will go along with this type of system until our sewer plant is up-dated. This will satisfy Mr. Villa, however, he still wants someone to be designated as head of the sanitary land-fill operation. "

HIGHWAY MATTERS continued:

Mr. Horton: "I was in contact with him a couple of times and rode around. There are things we have to do - like this ordinance and outsiders bringing in stumps and we were going to charge them. We've got a shanty which we were going to put there and collect tickets."

Councilman Young: "We should have a resolution making Alex Horton head of-----"

Judge Costello: "Why don't we discuss this?"

Town Clerk: "You have such a resolution."

Supervisor Leonard: "We said we were going to have a separate department there and in my opinion you can't have Alex run the Highway Department and the Sanitary Landfill."

Councilman Young: "Then let's get somebody else."

Town Clerk directed to put the matter under "Unfinished Business."

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Judge Leonard to Police Chief Grodski: "I read in the News-Review where we are traping our woods with wrecked automobiles. Those cars all have motors in them, I believe."

Police Chief Grodski: "These are on private property - not visible from public road and reported to the Editor by some concerned person. I have no record of any complaints about the cars being there. I only know what I read in the papers."

Judge Leonard: "Could we have the cars traced?"

Police Chief: "Yes, they should be traced - but as I said, I have had no complaints."

TOWN ATTORNEY

Francis J. Yakaboski, Town Attorney reported that he has prepared an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance which would prohibit Drive-in type restaurants and will submit same for the Board's approval.

Town Attorney also reported that Goder Incinerators have hired local counsel to collect the balance of their bill. He has advised them that if the machine works, the Town intends to pay.

NEW BUSINESS

Police Chief Grodski reported on the matter of Marine Boat for Police Department as follows:

Found that the matter of purchase must go to bid.

It will be a one man operation and the craft can be transferred to Long Island Sound for several hours of patrol there.

NEW BUSINESS continued:

Police Chief Grodski asked authorization to police the Bay by a person who can supply proper equipment to do the job. This is to avoid paying of rental as Town Law does not allow rental. To be paid for services and equipment to be provided.

A discussion followed and it was suggested that the Chief consider starting a Marine Division and the possibility of getting State Aid.

Police Chief Grodski agreed to look into the matter of establishing a Marine Unit which will pay for costs of boat and labor.

Donald Walsh asked if the specs were obtained from a qualified bayman.

Police Chief Grodski replied: "From franchised dealers- the Rocky Point man who knows the Sound and the one from Riverhead who knows the Bay, and we have a qualified man Patrolman Sadowski who knows the Bay and the Sound and is an expert boatsman."

Mr. James Jansen, Wading River: "I am still confused - was a man brought in on writing the specifications for material need on the local ordinance - in other words the needs are different on different waters."

Police Chief Grodski: "Yes, Mr. Luce from Riverhead, a resident franchised dealer in water craft and engines and who is familiar with the Bay and a Rocky Point man who is familiar with the Sound."

PECONIC TRAFFIC CIRCLE

Councilman Young reported that one day when he was meeting with the Merchants Group, some of them came from a meeting with the State Traffic people in Babylon and they discussed there the traffic circle in Flanders. They were very upset because the State said there wasn't going to be anything done on the traffic circle until after the Sunrise Highway is completed which may take two more years - and right now people are by-passing Riverhead because of the traffic at that circle. They said that Mr. Klein is responsible for holding up the plans. I think this is something we should take action on."

Sal Messina: "These engineers claim they were ready to go but were surprised that we in this Town didn't do something about this - the State and County were for it, but that Mr. Klein was the only one against it."

Supervisor Leonard: "I have to interrupt here and say that I was the one that said we should wait until the Sunrise Highway is completed and the new Expressway. To spend \$200,000 - and we have in the making a bridge that is to go across the river which has been planned for eight years. Last Wednesday I learned they haven't put that out for bids yet. I don't think we are missing much business."

Sal Messina: "If you owned a store on Main Street and you talked to the Southampton people - we are missing a lot by not pressuring the County to go ahead with that bottleneck. Traffic is at a virtual standstill any day at 4 o'clock to six o'clock on Main Street. Friday night and Saturday morning you can't move."

PECONIC TRAFFIC CIRCLE continued:

Judge Costello: "We had a very strenuous meeting with Mr. Halsey and Mr. Strong. Mr. Young was there also - the Supervisor was against it because all the East End Supervisors especially Dode Hulse. We had Mr. Halsey and Mr. Strong and some merchants from Flanders because one of the plans that was submitted by the engineers happened to close off some road (route 113) and they went back and told Mr. Klein to hold it up. I agree with you, Mr. Messina, that something should be done."

Councilman Young: "Let's do something."

Mr. Messina: "Mr. Young, wouldn't it make sense for the merchants in the Town of Southampton to make it difficult for their people to come and shop in our Town?"

It was decided by the Board to hold a meeting at the earliest opportunity with the Merchants Division and the County Legislatures to discuss this matter and bring about a solution.

Police Chief Grodski stated that he had read in the local newspaper that the Expressway is tentatively scheduled to open June 28th and asked if the Town Board has officially received word on who will police the 1.6 mile, as he understands the State pays the County X-number of dollars for policing the Expressway.

DRAINAGE MATTER

Mr. James Jansen, Wading River, asked if anything will be done on the sump in Wading River that he has been calling for four years - he had his driveway washed out and damage to house and property because of this sump - that he has been told that nothing can be done in the winter because it is freezing - in the spring because of the road - in the summer because of something else.

Mr. Horton said the sump is full of water and it was built in the wrong place.

Mr. Jansen: "You started to widen the sump - you dug an area to divert the water so you could dig out the existing sump - this was over four years ago - it would help if you would finish the job."

Mr. Horton: "The sump has a clay bottom. It is built in the wrong place and I didn't build it."

A lengthy discourse followed between Mr. Jansen and Mr. Horton.

Edward Kelley told the Board that a similar problem arose at the Baiting Hollow Country Club and dynamite was used to make a few holes and while a little water gathers there now and then - there has been no further problems.

It was decided that the entire Town Board and Mr. Horton will inspect the area to bring about a solution.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Leonard, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

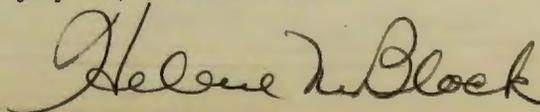
