PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Supervisor Leonard asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

Harold Evans, Chairman of the Town of Riverhead Conservation Advisory Council spoke to the Board and stated that the Town of Riverhead is one of the few Towns on Long Island that does not have a Wetlands Ordinance and since the wetlands are scarce and are important, the Committee has worked together with Denis Hurley, Attorney (also member of Committee) and have compiled such an ordinance.

Mr. Evans submitted a copy of a proposed Wetlands Ordinance for the Board's consideration and approval.

Town Clerk to prepare copies for all Board members.

John P. Riesdorff, member of Committee for a New Town Hall, pointed to the display of proposed plans for a new Town Hall and said the building is a one-story complex, will include a drive-in window for taxes and water rents payments and the basement will store town records.

Mr. Riesdorff asked if anyone would object to paying \$.05 per \$100 or \$22.00 per square foot for construction.

A number of people in the audience asked questions as to "site" and "additional costs", etc.

Mr. Riesdorff spoke about open fire hydrants which has cost the Riverhead Water District a loss of one million gallons of water last Monday night.

Mr. Riesdorff urged the people to notify the Police or Fire Departments immediately in the event they spot an open hydrant.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES continued:

Dr. Alfred H. Smith asked the Board if it had taken any action to continue holding one evening meeting.

Dr. Smith was advised that the Board has agreed to continue this practice for the balance of the year and it has already been so advertised.

Mrs. Marie S. Hoff reminded the Board that there are many individuals from the Wading River area who are interested and eager to be asked to be present when the Board meets on the matter of the Lease Agreement between Mrs. Jay Hulse and the Town of Riverhead.

PETITION

Signed by 71 citizens and taxpayers of the Town of Riverhead opposing the building of Garden Apartments on Elton Street, Riverhead, N. Y. Filed.

Supervisor Leonard recessed the meeting to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 8:00 P. M.

Town Clerk submitted affidavits of Publishing and Posting Public Notice calling Hearing on the matter of Rose Longi, President of Manor Lane Gardens, Inc., for a Special Permit to erect garden apartments consisting of five (5) buildings containing seventy-four (74) apartment units at Manor Lane, Jamesport, N. Y. The affidavits were filed.

Town Clerk read the following:

A communication from Mrs. Rose Longi, dated August 11, 1972, asking that the hearing scheduled for August 15th, be postponed, as due to very important personal reasons, she cannot appear at this date. Filed.

Telegram dated August 11, 1972 from Rose Longi, President of Manor Lane Gardens, saying she cannot appear for personal reasons, on August 15th and asks one month's postponement. Filed.

Fairhaven Property Owners Association, dated August 10th, 1972, stating opposition to construction of garden apartments on Manor Lane, Jamesport. Outlining reasons that such building of these apartments will affect the traffic congestion on the Main Road, affect the water problem that already exists and will add to the school age population and create a need for additional schools. Filed.

Petition signed by 129 residents of the Jamesport and South Jamesport Communities, petitioning the Town Board to deny the application for permission to erect garden apartments on the east side of Manor Lane, Jamesport. Filed.

Supervisor Leonard asked if anyone wished to be heard.

PUBLIC HEARING - 8:00 P. M. - continued:

Francis J. Yakaboski, Town Attorney, rendered opinion that since the petitioner is not here and is not able to attend (although the personal reasons are not enumerated) and even though many citizens have appeared, that we should grant a reasonable adjournment.

Judge Costello: "Providing anyone who wishes to be heard - the Board would hear right now. "

Town Attorney: "The only thing I would say on that, is that these applications such as the one the petitioner has here - and at the hearing the petitioner is supposed to present a case and anyone opposed should appear and say so. Now if the Board does grant an adjournment anything that is stated this evening will only have to be repeated at the adjourned date. "

Judge Costello: "You might have a few of our citizens here tonight who might not be able to be here on the adjourned date and in fairness to both sides, we should have their testimony recorded. "

Supervisor Leonard: "At Mrs. Longi's insistence we scheduled this hearing and it has been advertised. "

Judge Leonard: "She has a right to ask for a postponement, and I think in all fairness she should get it. She said "personal reasons", and I think we should listen to her. "

Carl Stagg suggested the postponement be scheduled for an evening meeting.

Gordon Ahlers asked if somebody else could have spoken for Mrs. Longi.

Town Clerk advised that Mrs. Longi had informed her that her attorney has gone to Europe and she has engaged a new attorney who needs time to review the matter.

Mr. Stagg asked how much the notices are costing the Town.
Mr. Stagg was informed that the advertising costs are paid by the petitioner.

Arthur Sanders stated he thinks the people should have the courtesy of being heard on the matter or have it postponed indefinitely.

Councilman Young: "This is a legal matter and whatever the law says we have to follow it. We should give her every chance to be heard.

Supervisor Leonard: "There was no way I could notify all the people who wished to be heard on account of the notice coming at this late date. "

Mr. Sanders: "The least she could have done is had someone here to represent her. I think, Mr. Supervisor, this application should be denied right now. "

PUBLIC HEARING - 8:00 P. M. - continued:

Town Attorney: "If the Town Board is going to grant an adjournment, I suggest this be done to September 19th, 1972 at 8 P. M. Also that the Town Clerk be directed to notify Mrs. Longi that on that adjourned date the matter will be heard and that if she does not appear personally or by representative that the matter will be removed from the Board's Agenda and there will be no determination as the matter will be withdrawn completely."

The Town Board agreed to the opinion of the Town Attorney.

Town Clerk will so advise Mrs. Rose Longi and will advertise the re-scheduling of the Hearing.

Supervisor declared the Hearing adjourned to September 19th, 1972 at 8:00 P. M., and re-opened the meeting.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Decision on application of Rosano, et al - Special Permit-Garden Apts., Elton Street, Riverhead, N. Y.

Town Attorney respectfully requested the Board to reserve for an additional period until the next meeting, its determination on the Rosano application.

NEW BUSINESS

Carl Stagg recommended that more lighting be provided for various areas in Stotsky Park.

Mr. Stagg was informed that the Board is aware of this situation, has already discussed it and is giving the matter much consideration.

Supervisor Leonard recessed the meeting to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 8:30 P. M.

Town Clerk submitted affidavits of publishing and posting Public Notice calling Hearing in connection with proposed amendments to Town Ordinance No. 3, "Traffic Control and Parking", of the Town of Riverhead, and read the notice in its entirety.

The affidavits were placed on file.

Supervisor Leonard thereupon declared the Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to be heard.

Police Chief Stephen J. Grodski advised the Board that "Item No. 33. Along the north curb line of East Main Street (Rte. 25) from its intersection with Ostrander Avenue curb line to a point (east) ending 217 feet." will have to be deleted because it pertains to State Highway and this section will have to be handled in the same manner as request for Prohibition of Parking as for West Main Street. The Town cannot include this in its Ordinance.

Police Chief Grodski stated that he has observed that some one painted a double line on the Ostrander Avenue and State Highway before this public hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 8:30 P. M. - continued:

John Riesdorff said he takes issue with the entire paragraph No. 33, as this is an attempt to get even with the chicken place.

Mr. Riesdorff also said he uses this more than anybody in Riverhead and he sees no necessity for this amendment as it will hurt the people attending funerals at Tuthill's Funeral Parlor. The people sometimes have to park all the way down to where the Salvation Army was located and if the Board is going to do this why not go all the way and take Dr. Youngs and Dr. Zuhoski.

Mr. Riesdorff further stated he does not think it is right to restrict this to the chicken place. He asked the Town Board to inspect the area of Colonial Arms where there are no sidewalks.

Supervisor Leonard informed Mr. Riesdorff that the chicken place was just issued its Certificate of Occupancy.

Mr. Riesdorff asked the reason for restricting the parking in this area.

Police Chief Grodski explained that it is because the area is residential - the property is zoned for business but was never established and now since a business has established there, there is more of an exposure and there is a curb there also. The Town Board is merely asking for a survey on parking restriction because it is a State Highway. Beyond that point towards the railroad tracks there are residential homes and there is no exposure there.

Mr. Riesdorff asked how this restriction will benefit the area.

Police Chief Grodski said it will give the people a greater distance of observation when coming out to the State Highway.

After discussion, the Town Board decided to delete the following portion from "Item No. 33: Along the north curb line of East Main Street (Rte. 25) from its intersection with Ostrander Avenue curb line to a point (east) ending 217 feet."

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Leonard declared the hearing closed and re-opened the meeting.

REQUEST FOR SURVEY TO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

The Town Board decided to include the deletion from proposed amendments namely; "Item No. 33: Along the north curb line of East Main (Rte. 25) from its intersection with Ostrander Avenue curb line to a point (east) ending 217 feet", in a request for survey on "Prohibition of Parking" to the State of New York Department of Transportation.

INDIAN ISLAND

Police Chief Grodski reported that due to the many activities on Indian Island there is a possibility that because of the increase of traffic we may have to restrict parking either on one side or both sides of the Riverside Drive portions of the road.

No action taken at this time.

RESOLUTIONS

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

RESOLVED, That Highway bill on Abstract dated August 15, 1972 as follows: Highway Item No. 1 - Asphalts, Inc., bill dated July 17, 1972, in the amount of \$690.00; be and the same is hereby approved for payment.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

BUDGET NOTE RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, NEW YORK, ADOPTED AUGUST 15, 1972, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF A NOTE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,500.00, FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAIVING COSTS OF SNOW FENCE.

WHEREAS, The Superintendent of Highways has advised the Town Board that an amount of \$2,500.00, is needed to finance costs of snow fence for use of the Town Highway Department, and has requested the Board to authorize borrowings of said amount of \$2,500.00, to defray the costs,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead for the specific purpose of providing for payment of costs for snow fence, pursuant to Section 29.00 of the Local Finance Law, does hereby authorize the issuance of its Budget Note in the amount of \$2,500.00, to finance such cost.

2. Such Note shall be dated August 17th, 1972, and its power to fix and determine the exact date of such Note is hereby delegated to the Supervisor. Such Note shall be numbered 2 and shall mature in the year 1973. The power to fix and determine the date upon which such Note shall become due and payable is also delegated to the Supervisor.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Leonard, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That William O'Haire is hereby appointed Lifeguard, effective August 4, 1972 to and including September 5, 1972, and to be paid by-weekly at the hourly rate of \$2.75 and to serve at the pleasure of the Town Board.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Leonard, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Leonard offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Costello.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, hereby requests the Department of Transportation, to make a survey for the purpose of Prohibition of Parking on State Highway #25, as follows:

"Beginning with the east curb line of Sweezy Avenue and its intersection with the north curb line of State Highway Route 25 to a point east 261 feet AND DIRECTLY ACROSS SH #25 from a point where a sign prohibits parking and reads "NO PARKING ON PAVEMENT" thence east along the south curb line of SH #25 to a point 210 feet where Prohibition of Parking starts. "

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Leonard, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Long Island Lighting Company be and is hereby authorized to make a survey for the installation of a street light on Pole #15, located at the eastern end of Second Street, South Jamesport, within the South Jamesport Lighting District.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Leonard, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at a Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held at the Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, on the 15th day of August, 1972, the following resolution was duly adopted:

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, State of New York, has caused all matters and things to be done which are required by the Town Law and other statutes made and provided in order that an amendment to Town Ordinance No. 3, "Traffic Control and Parking" adopted March 19, 1968 as amended may be adopted by the Town,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby ordains and enacts the following amendments to Ordinance No. 3, "Traffic Control and Parking", by adding certain new subdivisions to Section 4, Subdivision A (Prohibition of Parking), as follows:

- No. 31: Along the west curb line of Ostrander Avenue, beginning at its intersection with Northville Turnpike, to a point 40 feet (south) and along the south curb line of Northville Turnpike beginning with its intersection with Ostrander Avenue to a point 40 feet (west).
- No. 32: Along the entire curb line of a cul-de-sac (turn around) located at the east end of Louise Court, off Roanoke Avenue, in the hamlet of Roanoke.
- No. 33: Along the east curb line of Ostrander Avenue from its intersection with the north curb line of East Main Street to a point (north) 187 feet.
- No. 34: Along the south curb line of Old Country Road (Rte. 58) to a point 93 feet (west) from its intersection with the west curb line of Woodcrest Avenue, and along the south curb line of old Country Road to a point 100 feet (east) of its intersection with the east curb line of Woodcrest Avenue.

RESOLUTION continued:

No. 35: Along the east curb line of Howell Avenue to a point 375 feet (north) from its intersection with East Main Street (Rte. 25) north curb line.

By adding the following new subdivision to Section 4, Subdivision B, (Prohibition of Parking on School Days), as follows:

No. 8: Along the east curb line of Harrison Avenue from its intersection with the north curb line of School Street to a point 960 feet (north).

By adding the following new subdivision to Section 3, Subdivision A-1 (Stop and Yield Intersections), as follows:

RAILROAD CROSSING: All motor vehicles approaching RAILROAD CROSSINGS that intersect with Public Highways that are not protected by gates and/or signal devices, shall make a FULL STOP.

The adoption of the aforesaid amendments to Ordinance No. 3, "Traffic Control and Parking", of the Town of Riverhead shall take effect ten (10) days after publication and posting.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.




WHEREAS, The Town Attorney has read and approved all papers filed in this connection, now, therefore
