Supervisor Zaloga asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

Edward Gadzinski made inquiry as to Agenda Item 22-Resolution - relating to reclassification of Highway Employee and suggested the "job" be posted on the Bulletin Board.

The Town Board assured Mr. Gadzinski that the resolution would not be entertained and the "job" will be posted.

John P. Riesdorff made recommendation that other Cable TV Systems be given franchises in the Town of Riverhead.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Alex E. Horton, Supt. of Highways reported on the unsound condition of the Bridge located on South River Road, Calverton in the Townships of Riverhead and Brookhaven.

Mr. Horton stated that he has discussed the matter with Rudy Kammerer, Commissioner of Public Works and it is expected the matter will be resolved.

During discussion on the matter a recommendation was made that a "Safe Load 5 Ton" sign be erected on the Town of Riverhead side of the Bridge.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT

Edward R. Munson, Building Inspector, informed the Town Board that some months ago the printer (A. Penny Associates) had started to print the Zoning Ordinance in booklet form but was asked to stop because some changes to the Zoning Ordinance were to be made and it was decided they be included in the printing.

Mr. Munson stated that the printer has several ton of lead tied up in this project and it is unfair to keep him waiting any longer.

After discussion, it was the consensus of the Board that the printer be allowed to proceed with the printing of the Ordinance.

Supervisor Zaloga recessed the meeting to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 11:00 A. M.

Town Clerk submitted affidavits of publication and posting Notice of Public Hearing on the matter of the proposed amendment to Ordinance No. 3-Traffic Control and Parking.

The affidavits were ordered filed.

Supervisor Zaloga thereupon declared the Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to be heard.

Police Chief Grodski stated that the proposed amendment reads "along the curbs immediately adjacent to the buildings at the Billy Blake Shopping Center" and informed the Board that the curbs along the Food Fair are so constructed and designed that they want the parking there and that this should be limited to the curbing of Billy Blake's main entrance.

Supervisor Zaloga asked why this matter was not looked into before the public notice for hearing was published.

Building Inspector Edward R. Munson stated that if there is to be a fire zone it shouldn't be only in front of the entrance, it should be in all areas where firemen have to enter to protect the building.

Police Chief Grodski stated that if this amendment is adopted it will mean there will be no parking allowed along any part of the building.

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Zaloga declared the Hearing closed and re-opened the meeting.

REPORT

Police Chief Grodski reported that Mr. Papson of the Riverhead Shopping Plaza has informed him that he had received estimates of \$350 for the printing of 25 signs from a local paint shop, however, through the co-operation of Mr. Horton's department, Mr. Papson will obtain the 25 signs at less than 1/3 of the costs as estimated by the local paint shop.

Supervisor Zaloga asked how the signs will be erected.

Police Chief Grodski informed the Supervisor that holes will be drilled in the pillars, and the signs will be 8 feet tall to prevent anyone from destroying them.

Supervisor Zaloga recessed the meeting to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING - 11:15 A. M.

Town Clerk submitted affidavits of publication and posting Notice of Public Hearing to amend Zoning Ordinance No. 26 (petition of T. & J. Doroski to change zone from Agr. A to Ind. A on premises located in Calverton, New York.)

The affidavits were ordered filed.

Supervisor Zaloga thereupon declared the hearing open and asked if anyone wished to be heard.

Herbert Smith, Calverton, made recommendation that the Town Board act favorably on the petition.

Philip Karlin, Calverton, made recommendation that the Town Board act favorably on the petition.

Robert Stein, Esq., representing petitioners, appeared before the Board and stated that the Planning Board recommended that the adjacent premises similarly divided between the Agriculture A District and Industrial A District be rezoned to Industrial A in the interests of good planning and asked the Town Board to consider the petition favorably.

John J. Munzel, Town Attorney advised the Board that he has examined the resolution adopting the amendment as prepared by Mr. Stein and finds that it is accurate and reflects the intent of the Planning Board.

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Zaloga thereupon declared the Hearing closed and re-opened the meeting.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

WHEREAS, an application for a building permit was made by one Joseph P. Lebkuecher, Jr., residing at P. O. Box 255, Herricks Lane, Jamesport, New York, for the erection of buildings for a labor camp to be located at:

The east side of Herricks Lane, south of property now or formerly of A. Downes, west of property now or formerly of H. and N. Schroeder and north of property now or formerly of H. and N. Schroeder. The entire area comprised of 7.007 acres, the description as follows:

BEGINNING at a point at the intersection of the easterly side of Herricks Lane and the northeasterly corner of premises now or formerly of H. and N. Schroeder running thence north 20 degrees 26' 30" west 455.93 feet to an iron rod. Running thence north 66 degrees 01' 50" east 671.37 feet along lands now or formerly of A. B. Downes to a fieldstone monument. Running thence south 21 degrees 33' 00" east 448.67 feet along lands now or formerly of H. and N. Schroeder to a point. Running thence south 65 degrees 27' 30" west 680.51 feet along land now or formerly of the family of H. and N. Schroeder to the place or point of BEGINNING.

The area comprises 7.007 acres, and

WHEREAS, said application is subject to a special permit of the Town Board, pursuant to Section 209A, paragraph 2 I and section 101 A, paragraph 45, of Ordinance No. 26 of the Town of Riverhead, and

WHEREAS, the Town Clerk was authorized to publish in the December 24th issue of the News-Review, the official paper of the Town of Riverhead, a public notice of a public hearing to be held by the Town Board at 11:30 in the forenoon of the 5th day of January, 1971, in the Town Board Room, Riverhead Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, and

WHEREAS, said public hearing was held thereon, and

WHEREAS, after due deliberation having been had thereon,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Building Inspector of the Town of Riverhead is hereby authorized to issue the necessary building permits for the erection of a labor camp pursuant to the application made by Joseph P. Lebkuecher, Jr.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes.

The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

RESOLUTIONS

Town Justice Leonard offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Costello.

WHEREAS a letter dated June 30th, 1970 from the Billy Blake Discount Dept. Stores, Inc. has requested to have the Town of Riverhead enforce the traffic regulations at the said Shopping Center, and

WHEREAS said enforcement is permitted pursuant to Section 1640-A of the Vehicle and Traffic Law,

WHEREAS the Town Board, Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, has caused all matters and things to be done which are required by the Town Law and other statutes made and provided in order that an amendment to Town Ordinance No. 3 "Traffic Control and Parking" adopted March 19, 1968 as amended may be adopted by the Town,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby ordains and enacts the following amendment to Ordinance No. 3-Traffic Control and Parking is amended by adding the following new sub-section to section 4, subdivision A Prohibition of Parking:

#30 Along the Curbs immediately adjacent to the buildings at the Billy Blake Shopping Center.

AND the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to enter the said amendment to Ordinance No. 3-"Traffic Control and Parking", as amended, in the Minutes of the Town Board, and to publish a copy once in the News-Review, the official newspaper published in the Town, and to post a copy of the same on the signboard maintained by the Town Clerk, pursuant to Subdivision 6 of Section 30 of the Town Law and file in her office affidavits of said publication and posting.

The adoption of the aforesaid amendment to Ordinance No. 3-"Traffic Control and Parking", as amended, shall take effect ten (10) days after such publication and posting.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

RESOLUTION AMENDING THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD WITH RESPECT TO THE CLASSIFICATION OF CERTAIN PROPERTIES LOCATED IN CALVERTON.

WHEREAS, Theodore Doroski and Jennie Doroski, his wife, have heretofore on the 30th day of June, 1970, filed with the Town Clerk a petition to rezone from AGRICULTURE A DISTRICT to INDUSTRIAL A DISTRICT, pursuant to ARTICLE V, Section 501 of the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Riverhead, certain properties more particularly described in said petition and

WHEREAS, said petition was referred to the Planning Board of the Town of Riverhead for review and recommendation, and

RESOLUTION continued:

WHEREAS, said Planning Board did on November 24th, 1970, recommend the rezoning as prayed for the petitioner and further recommended that adjacent premises similarly divided between the AGRICULTURE A DISTRICT and INDUSTRIAL A DISTRICT be rezoned to INDUSTRIAL A DISTRICT in the interests of good planning and best use of the lands involved, and

WHEREAS, on the 5th day of January, 1971, the Town Board did adopt a resolution directing that a public hearing be held on the aforesaid petition and recommendation of the Planning Board on the 19th day of January, 1971, and further directed the Town Clerk to post and publish notice of said public hearing in the manner prescribed in the Town Law of the State of New York, and

WHEREAS, such hearing was held pursuant to the notice aforesaid at the Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, on the 19th day of January, 1971, at which time all persons desiring to be heard with respect to said petition were heard, and the public hearing was closed and the decision reserved; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED BY THE TOWN BOARD that the following property located at Calverton in the unincorporated area of the Town of Riverhead and described as follows be and the same is hereby reclassified from an AGRICULTURE A DISTRICT to INDUSTRIAL A DISTRICT:

BEGINNING at a point on the westerly line of the land of A. Anasky, distant 1,000 feet northerly of the northerly line of Middle Country Road (N.Y.S. Route 25) said point being in the line of the existing Industrial A Zoning Use District, and running thence from said point of beginning northerly along the westerly line of land of A. Anasky, being along the line of the existing Industrial A Zoning Use District to the southerly line of the land of Long Island Lighting Company; thence easterly along the southerly line of the land of Long Island Lighting Company, crossing Edwards Avenue, Riley Avenue, Twomey Avenue and Middle Road to the Long Island Expressway; thence southerly along the Long Island Expressway to a point in the westerly line of the Long Island Expressway, distant 1,000 feet northerly of the northerly line of Old Country Road (C.R. #58), said point being in the line of the existing Industrial A Zoning Use District, thence westerly along the line of the Industrial A Zoning Use District, said line being 1,000 feet northerly of the northerly line of Old Country

Road (C.R. #58) and of the northerly line of Middle Country Road (N.Y.S. Route 25) to the point or place of beginning,

and, it is

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the necessary changes be made upon the Zoning and Departmental maps of the Town of Riverhead so as to indicate the location of said properties as being located in an INDUSTRIAL A DISTRICT as defined and regulated pursuant to the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance and Zoning Map of the Town of Riverhead, as amended; and it is

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and is hereby authorized and directed to give, publish and post the necessary notice of said amendment in accordance with the Town Law of the State of New York.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

RESOLUTIONS

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the Town of Riverhead Beach Sticker Fee be \$2.00 for the year 1971, and to be sold only to residents or taxpayers of the Town of Riverhead.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.


WHEREAS, It is the intention of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead to renew a Recreation Project for the Elderly, and
