WHEREAS, In a move unprecedented in the history of legislation concerning conservation of game fish in New York, 18 assemblymen from all parts of the State, and representing three political factions have joined in co-sponsoring the striped bass gamefish bill (A-1550) just filed by Assemblyman John G. McCarthy of Huntington; and

WHEREAS, The McCarthy bill is a companion to the bill already pre-filed in the State Senate by its originator, Senator Bernard C. Smith of Northport (S 2912-A); and

WHEREAS, The bill is a rupture in the roadblock on striped bass legislation on having the striper made a gamefish and taken off the commercial market.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, SUFFOLK COUNTY, NEW YORK,

HEREBY ENDORSES the proposed legislation filed by Assemblyman John G. McCarthy of Huntington to have striped bass taken off the commercial market so as to eliminate the mass slaughter of a gamefish.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be forwarded to the Legislature now in session to the attention of the Honorable John G. McCarthy.

WHEREAS, The bond filed with the Town Board in the amount of \$45,000.00 indicated the Principal as EMJAY PROPERTIES, INC., and

WHEREAS, An Agreement dated the 17th day of January, 1970, of EMJAY PROPERTIES, INC., to the Riverhead Town Planning Board was, upon the request of the Town Attorney, filed with the Town which Agreement bound EMJAY PROPERTIES, INC. as well as JOYSAN DEVELOPMENT CORP. as Principals in conjunction with the completion of the improvements within said Section II, and

WHEREAS, The Town Attorney and the Supervisor of the Town of Riverhead did request that the said bond in the amount of \$45,000.00 with EMJAY PROPERTIES, INC. as Principal be replaced with another bond in like amount indicating JOYSAN DEVELOPMENT CORP. as Principal,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Surety Bond dated the 13th day of February, 1970, in the amount of \$45,000.00 naming JOYSAN DEVELOPMENT CORP. as Principal and BENJAMIN KASPER, CHARLES KASPER, RICHARD NELIN, JACOB STEIN and MAX STALLER as Co-Principals and the REPUBLIC INSURANCE COMPANY as Surety and the RIVERHEAD TOWN BOARD as Obligee, for the faithful performance of all conditions set forth in the Resolution of the Town of Riverhead Planning Board, dated the 30th day of April, 1969, with reference to the proposed subdivision to be known as "ROLLING WOODS AT ROANOKE, SECTION II", in Riverhead, New York, is satisfactory to the Town Board as to form, sufficiency, manner of execution and surety, for the completion of such improvements as are not constructed.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby proclaims July 5th through July 12th, 1970, as "Art Appreciation Week" in the Town of Riverhead.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, ~~Yes~~, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES

Supervisor Zaloga asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

(Large delegation of residents and non-residents made appearance regarding the matter of Fuel Desulphurization, Inc., application for zoning change on north of Sound Avenue and south of Sound Shore Road)

Donald A. Denis, 84 Meadow Lane, Riverhead stated he is President of the "It Stinks" Committee, outlined objections to the proposed oil refinery and submitted petitions containing 1612 signatures of residents, 702 signatures of non-residents and 561 signatures of students, said petitions indicating the feeling of the community regarding the proposed industry.

Mrs. E. Rawle, Chairman of the Conservation Commission of Madison, Conn. read statement approved by the Board of Selectmen of Madison on March 16th, urging the planning agency of Riverhead to disapprove the application of Fuel Desulphurization, Inc., for the proposed oil refinery.

Mrs. Rawle asked what type of stacks would be used to eliminate the odor of sulphur.

Mr. Donald Edgar, voiced objection to the proposed oil refinery and submitted a written invitation to the Town Board to attend open meeting of the Northville Beach Civic Association on April 12th at 2 P. M. at St. John's R. C. Church, Riverhead, for the purpose of obtaining information on rezoning of properties, the proposed industry and encouragement of industries to Riverhead Town.

Mr. Wickham Tyte, Riverhead, speaking for the Riverhead Conservative Party stated they wholeheartedly opposed the proposed oil refinery industry.

Mrs. Earl Granttham voiced her opposition to the proposed oil refinery.

John Riesdorff, former Supt. of Water District, expressed bewilderment that so many people came to protest about something they know little about.

Mr. Riesdorff spoke on salt water intrusion and pollution and stated that detergents are a contributing factor.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES continued:

Robert L. Tooker, Esq., stated that the Town needs industry but not the type of industry that is proposed by this application and urged the Board to turn it down.

Mrs. Shirley Smith, Calverton, stated she concurs with previous speakers who opposed the proposed industry.

Robert Hefter, Riverhead, spoke in opposition.

Stanley Hagler, Riverhead, stated he concurs with Mrs. Grantham.

Mrs. Virginia Wines, Sound Avenue, Riverhead, asked Supervisor Zaloga if this industry would pay all of the taxes of the Town of Riverhead would he want it located in Bay Woods.

Supervisor Zaloga declined to answer the question, stating this is not a public hearing on the issue.

Mr. G. E. Warner, Baiting Hollow, spoke in opposition.

Richard Carey, Middle Road, Riverhead, echoed the sentiments of previous speakers protesting that an oil refinery is not the industry needed in Riverhead.

Raymond Nelson, Riverside, spoke in favor of the proposed industry for the reason it would give the poor people employment.

Mrs. M. Carver, Riverhead, approved the industry as a source of employment.

Mrs. Louise Hills spoke in favor of the proposed industry as providing jobs for the poor people.

Unidentified persons made attempts to make replies to speakers favoring the industry.

Supervisor Zaloga interrupted, stating this is not a public hearing and he would not allow rebuttals.

Mr. Tooker congratulated the Town Board on displaying a wonderful example of intra-communication between the members of the Town Board and the community.

DEPARTMENT HEADS

Edward R. Munson, Building Inspector rendered report re application of Leonidas Papson for building permit and recommended the application be granted.

HIGHWAY MATTERS

Alex E. Horton, Supt. of Highways spoke to the Town Board about sand being carted from Zdunko's Sand Pit and expressed concern that heavy loads will damage (Town Roads) Sound Avenue and Osborne Avenue, being used to transport the sand.

After discussion, Supervisor Zaloga assigned Town Justice Leonard, Police Chief Grodski and Alex E. Horton, Supt. of Highways to resolve the matter.

RECREATION DEPARTMENT

Richard Frank and Michael Esposito appeared before the Board and asked for a ruling on the eligibility of non-residents having businesses within the Town to participate in softball and other activities of the Riverhead Recreation Department.

After discussion Supervisor Zaloga stated that a determination will be made and a report will be rendered at the next meeting of the Board.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned at 12:15 P. M., to meet on Tuesday, April 7th, 1970 at 10:30 A. M.
