Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall, Riverhead, New York, on Tuesday, June 9th, 1970 at 10:30 A. M.

At this point of the meeting, Supervisor Zaloga asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following responded:

Mrs. James Janzen, Overlook Drive, Wading River, stated she had contacted Mr. Horton on numerous occasions making complaint about the town sump adjoining her property, which constantly overflows and mires her driveway - she had lost one driveway and had another rebuilt and even though it was raised, it is being eroded by the overflow from the sump.

Mrs. Janzen further stated that the sump needs to be drained and cleaned and suggested it be corrected by installing pipes and asked the Board to make an inspection.

Supervisor Zaloga informed Mrs. Janzen that Mr. Horton has advised that the sump has a poor bottom and to correct it would involve much time and money and asked Mrs. Janzen's indulgence to permit the Board to resolve the matter.

Edward Purcell, Past American Legion Commander of Post 273, commended the Town Board on behalf of the Suffolk County American Legion and the local Post 273, on granting permission to the Police Department to wear the American Flag insignia on their uniforms.

Mr. Purcell read a poem on the Flag of the United States of America, entitled, "You Remembered".

Supervisor Zaloga thanked Mr. Purcell and commented on a telephone call from Newsday regarding the flag insignia worn by the members of the Police Force and stated emphatically that he is proud that the Town of Riverhead Police Department have expressed the desire and willingness to display the American Flag insignia on their uniforms.

Councilman Young read a statement making rebuttal to the Newsday article headlined "Chip on the Shoulder".

Excerpts from statement: "Our flag is the symbol of our Constitution, of this government and our democratic way of operating.

Our policemen are our law officers. It is their sworn duty to administer the law of the land. In other words, to see that each person living in this town has the freedom and the protection guaranteed by the Constitution.

The Riverhead Police Force is proud to wear this flag. They feel privileged to do so, and this Councilman is proud to be on the Town Board that authorized it.

This Councilman thanks God for the "Chip on the Shoulder" that gives newspapers in America the right to publish and the American public the right to read editorials no matter what their content." (Statement filed).

PERSONAL APPEARANCES continued:

Franklin Gold, Wading River, N. Y., spoke to the Town Board asking for a long range plan on improving certain roads (Hulse Avenue) in Wading River.

Supt. of Highways Alex E. Horton stated that the residents in the area of Hulse Avenue had expended approximately \$6000 in recent years to improve the roads and discontinued the project. He advised that an additional \$3000 would bring the roads up to standard.

Mr. Gold stated that an amount of \$3000 would be impossible to raise at this time as all of the residents are not willing to pay a share of the costs and added that perhaps an additional \$1000 could be raised.

After further discussion, Town Justice Costello suggested that the residents of the area get together and decide what they are willing to do to resolve the matter.

Mr. George Mottern, resident of Hubbard Avenue Trailer Park, spoke to the Board on the new set of regulations issued by the new owners of the Park. He pointed out that the new regulations require that all storage sheds, steps, etc. be removed and replaced with types as specified by the new owner.

Mr. Mottern further pointed out that the costs of the replacements are prohibitive as the families residing within the Park are in the limited income bracket. That the new owner is asking a price of \$216.00 for a storage shed that can be purchased at Grants for \$79.00. Steps will cost \$90. that can be purchased for \$16 or \$17.

Mr. Mottern further stated that new sewage lines are being constructed and this is creating a hazardous condition as there is no lighting in the Park now. The Park is completely dark.

Mr. Mottern asked the Town Board to look into the situation and arrive at a solution to the problem facing these families.

Supervisor Zaloga advised Mr. Mottern that the members of the Board will look into the matter.

NEW BUSINESS

Town Justice Costello reported that he had meetings with representatives of the Long Island Lighting Company and outlined a plan for dividing the presently existing ten (10) Lighting Districts, plus the newly formed one in Aquebogue, into five (5) Districts namely; Wading River, Calverton, Riverhead, Aquebogue and Jamesport.

Judge Costello asked the members of the Board to consider the plan as outlined.

Supervisor Zaloga made proposal that perhaps these existing Districts be consolidated into two (2) Districts.

After discussion, the matter was postponed for further study by the members of the Board.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

RESOLUTIONS

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

WHEREAS, said John J. Munzel was heard before the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead on said application on May 19, 1970, and

WHEREAS, the petitioner has stipulated that the exterior of the building shall not be expanded,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the petition of John J. Munzel for a Special Permit for use of premises known as 548 Roanoke Avenue as a multiple residence pursuant to Section 207A 2B of Ordinance 26 of the Town of Riverhead be granted and the necessary building permits be issued.

Town Justice Leonard offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Costello.

RESOLVED, That James Schondebare, be and is hereby appointed Special Police Patrolman, pursuant to Section 158 of the Town Law, effective June 10, 1970, to be compensated at the rate of \$3.00 per hour, payable bi-weekly and to serve at the pleasure of the Town Board.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

RESOLVED, That the Long Island Lighting Company be and is hereby authorized to make a survey of Fresh Pond Avenue and Route 25, and Fresh Pond Avenue and Sound Avenue, for the installation of street lights.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

WHEREAS, due to excessive demand for electricity, the Long Island Lighting Company has applied for a permit to construct a 138KV Transmission Line within the Town of Riverhead adjacent to an existing 69KV Overhead Transmission Line as indicated on sketch filed in the office of the Town Clerk,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby consents that the Long Island Lighting Company be permitted to construct a 138KV Overhead Transmission Line within the Town of Riverhead adjacent to an existing 69KV Overhead Transmission Line as per sketch filed in the office of the Town Clerk.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

RESOLUTIONS

Town Justice Leonard offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Costello.

RESOLUTION GRANTING SPECIAL PERMIT FOR GARDEN APARTMENTS TO OLD COUNTRY BUILDING CORP. (w/s Roanoke Avenue opposite Hospital).

WHEREAS, Old Country Building Corporation, 1355 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York, made application for a Special Permit pursuant to Art. II, Section 303-A, Par. 3 of Town Zoning Ordinance No. 26, to construct 6 additional Garden Apartments at a site on the west side of Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, opposite Central Suffolk Hospital, in a Business 1 Use District; and

WHEREAS, that the water, sewer and parking arrangements were satisfactory to the Superintendent of Water, the Superintendent of Sewer, and the Building Inspector, respectively, and that the plot plan, plans and specifications were satisfactory to the Building Inspector; and

WHEREAS, after due deliberation, the Town Board determined that the construction of the garden apartments as set forth in the plans submitted would be in the best interest of the Town, and were in accordance with the principles set forth in the Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board approved the application by Resolution dated August 6, 1968; and

WHEREAS, building permits were issued on September 13, 1968 bearing numbers ZB 974, ZB 975, ZB 976, ZB 977, ZB 978, ZB 979; and all bearing expiration date March 12, 1970, and

WHEREAS, the buildings have not been erected pursuant to the permit granted by the expiration date of March 12, 1970, and

WHEREAS, the applicant has re-applied for an extension of said permit; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the permits numbered ZB 974, ZB 975, ZB 976, ZB 977, ZB 978, ZB 979 be extended to bear expiration date of March 11, 1971, and said extension is retroactive to March 1, 1971.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

RESOLUTIONS

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

WHEREAS, an application was made to the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead for a Special Permit under Article 3 Section 301L and of Article 2 Section 204A subdivision 2A of the Town Ordinance #26 for a Special Permit to operate an airport facility by L. Leon Fanning and Joseph W. Brush, Jr., on premises located at the southwesterly corner of Sound Avenue and Union Avenue, Riverhead, New York; and

WHEREAS, the matter was taken under consideration by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead; and

WHEREAS, an amendment to the petition has been received by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, which amendment requests that the Special Permit be limited to a small general utility airport with an existing sod runway to be utilized by propeller aircraft of 12,500 pounds or less and further that the Riverhead Airpark be limited to the permanent basing or storage of no more than 18 aircraft and that all repairs to aircraft be of a minor classification; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held at the Town Hall, Town of Riverhead on May 19, 1970, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has taken the matter under due consideration,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the application of the said L. Leon Fanning and Joseph W. Brush, Jr., is hereby denied in all respects.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Leonard, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Zaloga, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Leonard.

WHEREAS, G. Irving Wells residing at Main Road, Aquebogue, New York, is desirous of making a donation of Four Hundred (\$400.00) Dollars to the Jamesport Lighting District, and

WHEREAS, Section 64 Subdivision 8 of the Town Law authorizes the Town Board to accept said funds and deposit them to any valid stipulated use by the donor, and

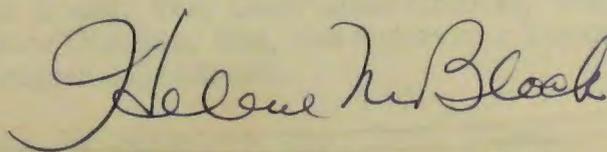
WHEREAS, the proposed donation by G. Irving Wells to the Jamesport Lighting District is a proper use,
