

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held at the Town Hall, Riverhead, New York, on Tuesday, January 14, 1969 at 10:30 A.M.

The meeting was called to order at 10:36 A.M., by Supervisor Vojvoda.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Minutes of a Special Meeting of the Town Board held on December 31, 1968, be approved as submitted.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Zaloga, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

Supervisor Vojvoda asked if anyone wished to be heard and the following person  
responded:

Mrs. Irene Muller addressed the Board and stated that for a number of years  
she has been doing volunteer work for the North Fork Association of Retarded Children.  
That recently the Association had rented quarters at 125 Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, to  
carry on vocation training for young adults under 21 years of age.

Mrs. Muller continued saying that the Association is dependent upon volunteers  
who assist in this work and they are experiencing difficulties in finding parking spaces  
for their cars.

Mrs. Muller requested the Board to give its consideration in having a space  
marked off for three, possibly four cars, in the Roanoke Avenue Parking Field, during  
Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 9 A.M. to 4 P.M.

Mrs. Muller further stated that the Association hopes to put the program on a  
five day basis very soon.

Supervisor Vojvoda assured Mrs. Muller that the Board together with the Police  
Chief will take the request under consideration.

HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS

Police Chief Grodski informed the Board that Blair Patterson, Administrator  
of the Central Suffolk Hospital has advised him that the matter of blood tests will be  
taken up at the Hospital Meeting to be held on January 20th.

HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS continued:

Police Chief Grodski also stated that in the meanwhile he has the name of a registered nurse who is qualified and willing to undertake the work.

Town Justice Zaloga stated that this may not work out too well as she may not be available at all times.

After some discussion it was decided that Town Justice Zaloga and Police Chief Grodski attend the January 20th Meeting to discuss the matter with the hospital authorities.

Police Chief Grodski asked the Town Board for a clarification on authorizations of requisitions by the Budget Committee.

Supervisor Vojvoda stated that the Budget Committee will set up ground rules and all departments will be so advised.

Supervisor Vojvoda recessed the meeting to hold a Public Hearing.

PUBLIC HEARING-10:45 A.M.

Town Clerk submitted affidavits of posting and publishing Notice of Public Hearing in the matter of the adoption of amendment to Town Ordinance No. 3, Traffic Control and Parking.

The affidavits were ordered filed.

Town Attorney Haugaard explained that the amendment applies to the north side of North Country Road in Wading River and prohibits parking on the north side in the area of the Post Office, the reason being that some local people and the postmaster have been in favor of this legislation because the road is too narrow for the people getting in and out of cars.

Supervisor Vojvoda stated that people at last night's meeting of the Wading River Boating Association were in favor of this amendment.

Supervisor Vojvoda thereupon asked if anyone wished to be heard in favor of or against the aforesaid amendment.

Police Chief Grodski asked why the north side was selected and not the south side as the people have a tendency to park in front of the post office.

The Town Attorney explained that the north side was selected because the people stop on the south side for other purposes like ice skating and to feed the ducks.

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing closed and re-opened the meeting.

OLD BUSINESS

It was decided that the Town Attorney meet with Councilman Grodski, Jacob Harding and Patricia Tormey on the matter of the Code of Ethics Ordinance.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Zaloga.

No. 3, Traffic Control and Parking.

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, has caused all matters and things to be done which are required by the Town Law and other statutes made and provided in connection with the adoption of amendment to Town Ordinance No. 3, Traffic Control and Parking,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED and this Town Board hereby ordains and enacts the following amendment to said Town Ordinance No. 3, Traffic Control and Parking:

1. Section 4(a). "Prohibition of Parking" of Town Ordinance No. 3, "Traffic Control and Parking Ordinance", is amended by adding thereto a new subsection 24, as follows:

"24. On the north side of North Country Road from its intersection with the east side of Sound Road to a point fifty feet to the east of the east property line of the lot occupied by the Wading River Post Office."

This amendment shall take effect ten days after publication and posting by the Town Clerk.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Zaloga, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Costello.

BE IT RESOLVED, That Joanne M. Brodie, be and is hereby appointed to serve in a supervisory capacity in the Town of Riverhead Recreation Department, effective January 27, 1969, to be paid at the rate of \$6500 per annum, payable bi-weekly, and to serve at the pleasure of the Town Board.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Zaloga, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

RESOLUTIONS continued:

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Zaloga.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Supervisor be and is hereby authorized to place the following sums of moneys not currently needed for operating expenses on Time Certificates of Deposits for a period of nine (9) months:

Town Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Costello.

WHEREAS, The Town of Riverhead has requested the County of Suffolk to dredge in Peconic River, Town of Riverhead, and

WHEREAS, The County of Suffolk proposes to do said dredging of Peconic River, in the Town of Riverhead, at a nominal cost to the Town of Riverhead, and

WHEREAS, in order to accomplish said dredging, plans, specifications, agreements and other documents must be executed on behalf of the Town of Riverhead, now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to execute, on behalf of the Town of Riverhead, all necessary plans and specifications, spoil area agreements, assurances to the County of Suffolk, license and/or dredging permit applications to Federal and State Agencies and all other documents that may be required to accomplish said dredging work.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Zaloga, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Zaloga.

WHEREAS, It is necessary to prepare bids for the parking field on Hulse Landing Road, Wading River, N. Y.,

BE IT RESOLVED, That Gordon K. Ahlers, P. E., be and is hereby retained to prepare the necessary bids and specifications, for the preparation of the Parking Area on Hulse Landing Road, Wading River, N. Y., to be compensated at a fee not to exceed \$2,000.00.

RESOLUTION continued:

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Zaloga, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Town Justice Costello.

WHEREAS, Two bids for the purchase of approximately fifty new tires or more for use by the Riverhead Town Police Vehicles for the year 1969, were received and filed by the Town Clerk on January 3rd, 1969, and

WHEREAS, The Town Board upon the recommendation of Police Chief Grodski deems it necessary to separate the awarding of certain items in order that awards be made to the lowest bidder, now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, That Long Island Produce Company/Agway, Inc., P.O. Box 539, Riverhead, New York, 11901, be awarded the bid for New Tires at a cost of \$21.00 each, plus the mounting charge of \$2.00 and the repairing of same at a cost of \$2.00, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That Van Dyck and Yousik, Inc., 1165 East Main Street, Riverhead, New York, 11901, be awarded the bid for Snow Grip Tires at the rate of \$14.75 each at no charge for mounting and \$1.00 for repairs of snow tires.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Zaloga, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

WHEREAS, The Town Proposition #1 - namely; "Shall the Town of Riverhead petition the legislature and take other steps to create and erect a County of Peconic from the five eastern towns of Suffolk County", was presented to the public at the last General Election and overwhelmingly endorsed, and

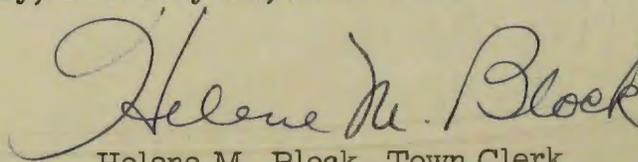
WHEREAS, A similar proposition was passed by the majorities in favor from other towns, namely; Southold, Shelter Island, Southampton and East Hampton,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Honorable Perry B. Duryea, Speaker of the Assembly and the Honorable Leon E. Giuffreda, the Senator from the First Senatorial District,

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board urges the Speaker, Perry B. Duryea and Senator Leon E. Giuffreda to support, implement and bring into fruition the creation of Peconic County during this Session of the Legislature.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Town Justice Zaloga, Yes, Town Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned at 11:00 A.M., to meet on Tuesday, February 4th, 1969 at 10:30 A.M.
