

Minutes of a Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, May 4, 1965 at 10:30 A. M.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held in the Town Hall on April 20, 1965 be approved as submitted.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Messrs. William Conklin and Leonard Griffing appeared before the Board on behalf of the Reliables Company of the Riverhead Fire Department and presented to Supervisor Vojvoda a donation of \$25.00 for the Riverhead Community Ambulance Fund.

Supervisor Vojvoda expressed appreciation on behalf of the Ambulance Committee to the Reliables Company for the aforesaid donation.

It was learned that the total amount collected to date for the Ambulance Fund was \$15,398.51, and that a sum of \$1.49 would bring the fund up to \$15,400.00.

A collection was hastily taken and the additional sum of \$1.49 was realized.

Police Chief Grodski appeared before the Board stating that the Police Department is receiving many complaints from persons who have had their cars cut-up and also complaints on abusive uses of Junior licenses and requested the Board's permission to contend against offenders through the media of newspaper and radio releases.

The Board assured its cooperation and support to the Police Chief in his endeavor to combat the violations.

Josephine Szumczyk, 33 Further Lane, Riverhead, N. Y., dated May 4, 1965, making application for Construction of Curbs and Gutters. Referred to Alden W. Young and Supt. of Highways Alex E. Horton. Filed.

Petition from residents of Mill Road, J. T. Boulevard, Fanning Street and Industrial Boulevard, requesting improved street lighting. Referred to Lighting Committee. Filed.

Zoning Board of Appeals, dated May 3, 1965, advising that Appeal of Edmund Hodun who requested permission to erect two residences on property on Doctors Path was denied. Filed.

The Board held a discussion on the matter of Mr. Hodun's request to change the Zoning Ordinance and it was decided that Mr. Hodun be advised to submit a petition requesting the desired change.

The Town Board recessed at 11:00 A. M., for a Public Hearing.

After being duly advertised Notice of Public Hearing was read and submitted to the Board relative to the matter of Petition of Quinn's Bus Line for extension of service along certain highways in the Town of Riverhead.

Notice was ordered filed.

Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to be heard in favor of or in opposition to the aforesaid Petition.

Martin B. Ashare, Attorney for Petitioner John Archambault d/b/a Quinn's Bus Line appeared before the Board and outlined the location of certain streets for the extension of service as contained in the Petition and earnestly requested the Board to give its favorable consideration to said Petition.

A discussion was held on matters of bus line routes and the time element entailing arriving and leaving schedules of the bus lines.

Justice Zaloga stated that the present Bus Stop location is not adequately suitable to accommodate the Bus Lines at one time and that a Bus Station is needed to regulate the flow of Bus Lines.

Justice Zaloga inquired of Mr. Ashare that perhaps Mr. Archambault may be willing to share in the costs of such an accommodation.

Mr. Ashare replied that he would offer this proposition to Mr. Archambault for his consideration.

At this point of the Hearing Mr. John Archambault appeared before the Board Justice Costello inquired of Mr. Archambault if the fares would remain the same.

Mr. Archambault replied in the affirmative stating that any contemplated changes would have to be approved by the Public Service Commission.

It was the consensus of the Board that matters of time schedules, bus stop space and route agreements be formulated before a "Consent" to this Petition is approved.

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications having been received thereto, Supervisor Vojvoda adjourned the Hearing to May 18, 1965 at 11:00 A.M.

Justice Zaloga called to the attention of the Board that he has received many complaints about the offensive odor emanating from Jacob's Creek which he believes was caused by persons dumping potatoes from graders and other foreign matter in said Creek. He further stated that the intolerable smell is not conducive to the well being of the residents of the area.

The matter was discussed by the Board and it was resolved that Police Chief Grodski be directed to make an investigation to determine the persons responsible for creating the condition and to render a report on the findings to the Board.

Justice Costello called to the attention of the Board the matter of the Building Inspector's Report on the residence on Osborn Avenue, stating that this matter has been pending and should be resolved at the earliest possible time.

Town Attorney Shepard M. Scheinberg replied to Justice Costello stating that he has arranged a meeting with the heirs and is hopeful of resolving the matter within a few days.

RESOLUTIONS:

For the sum of \$100.00 to reimburse the Town for the cost of materials.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the above stated applications be approved and that Curbs and Gutters be constructed pursuant to contract and agreement forms submitted by the aforementioned applicants, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Supervisor be authorized to sign the said contracts in behalf of the Town when the moneys to be paid by above said applicants are turned over and the contracts have been signed, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Superintendent of Highways be directed to perform the work.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

RESOLVED, That Ann McKay, be and is hereby appointed Part-Time Clerk in the Office of the Receiver of Taxes, effective May 10, 1965 and to be compensated at the rate of \$10.00 per day.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Grodski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the expenses in the amount of \$14.10 incurred by Sophie Waski in attending two meetings with the Welfare Department, be approved for payment.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Costello.

RESOLVED, That expenses in the amount of \$30.00 incurred by the Police Department in connection with attending FBI Training School on April 28, and 29, 1965, be approved for payment.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Costello.

RESOLVED, That a Public Hearing be held at 11:15 A. M., on May 18, 1965, at the Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Town of Riverhead, New York, to consider Proposed Ordinance #33-Parade, Assembly and Address, said Proposed Ordinance to read as follows:

PARADE, ASSEMBLY AND PUBLIC  
ADDRESS ORDINANCE NO. 33

SECTION 1. No parade or assembly shall be permitted upon the sidewalks, streets, avenues, highways or parkways, or other public places in the Town of Riverhead unless a permit shall have been obtained from the Chief of Police of the Town of Riverhead, after application therefor in writing to said Chief of Police.

SECTION 2. All assemblies, warranted by law, held in any of the streets, roads, avenue, highways or parkways in the Town of Riverhead, where public discussions are held, shall have an American Flag, the dimensions of which shall be not less than 36 inches by 60 inches, conspicuously displayed at all times during the holding of such assemblies. No red or black flag, and no banner, ensign or sign having upon it any inscription opposed to organized government, or which is sacrilegious or which may be derogatory of public morals shall be displayed at any such assembly or in any public place or carried through the streets of the Town of Riverhead in any procession or parade. This provision shall not apply to the flag of any nation friendly to the United States, when same is displayed along with the flag of the United States of America.

SECTION 3. No person or persons shall be permitted to broadcast, live or recorded, speech, sound or music from a public address or sound amplified system, whether mobile or stationary, unless a permit shall first have been obtained from the Chief of Police of the Town of Riverhead after application therefor in writing to said Chief of Police. This section shall apply to original broadcasts by the speaker, as well as to reproductions of speech, sound or music by means of recordings thereof. If such permit be granted, it shall be made subject to such conditions and safeguards as may be imposed by the Chief of Police to preserve the health, welfare, safety and morals of the community.

SECTION 4. Any person who shall violate any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and conviction therefor shall be punishable by imprisonment in the County Jail for a term not to exceed six months or by a fine not to exceed \$50.00, or by both fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 5. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this section shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk be and is hereby directed to publish a Notice of Public Hearing in the May 6, 1965 issue of the News-Review.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Costello.

RESOLVED, That a Public Hearing be held at 11:30 A.M., on May 18, 1965 at the Town Hall, 220 Roanoke Avenue, Town of Riverhead, New York, to consider Proposed Ordinance #34-Good Order, said Proposed Ordinance to read as follows:

GOOD ORDER ORDINANCE NO. 34

SECTION 1. No person or persons shall consume alcoholic beverages from any container while operating any kind of a vehicle, or as a passenger of any kind of vehicle, or as a pedestrian on any Town or County highway within the Town of Riverhead. No person or persons shall consume alcoholic beverages while in a Town owned or leased parking field or town owned or leased park from any type of a container.

SECTION 2. Any person who shall violate any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and conviction therefor shall be punishable by imprisonment in the County Jail for a term not to exceed six months or by a fine not to exceed \$50.00, or by both fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 3. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this section shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk be and is hereby directed to publish a Notice of Public Hearing in the May 6, 1965 issue of the News-Review.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That the Long Island Lighting Company be and it is hereby authorized to install street lighting on North Griffing Avenue and School Street in the Riverhead Lighting District, as per letter and plan dated April 23, 1965, outlining added cost to said District of \$2110.50 per annum.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That the Long Island Lighting Company be and it is hereby authorized to install street lighting on Raynor Avenue, in the Riverhead Lighting District, as per letter and plan dated April 23, 1965, outlining added cost to said District of \$164.10 per annum.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes; Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That the Long Island Lighting Company be and it is hereby authorized to make a survey for the installation of street lighting in the areas of Mill Road, J. T. Boulevard, Fanning Street and Industrial Boulevard.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills submitted on Warrants dated May 4, 1965 as follows: General Town -\$6,886.84, General Repairs Item No. 1-\$475.38, Machinery Item No. 3-\$587.85 and Miscellaneous Item No. 4-\$124.60.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

RESOLVED, That the General Town bills as submitted in the amount of \$6,886.84, be approved for payment, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That General Repairs Highway Item No. 1 bills in the amount of \$475.38, Machinery Highway Item No. 3 bills in the amount of \$587.85, and Miscellaneous Highway Item No. 4 bills in the amount of \$124.60 be approved for payment.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned at 11:45 A. M., to meet on Tuesday, May 18, 1965 at 10:30 A. M.
