

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on February 4, 1964 at 10:30 A. M.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That the minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held in the Town Hall on January 14, 1964, be approved as submitted.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Mr. John Lorimer of Wading River, N. Y., representing the Wading River Group appeared before the Board relative to the status quo of the Boat Ramp and Parking Facilities Matters.

Supervisor Vojvoda replied to Mr. Lorimer, stating that the Town Board is endeavoring to obtain name of manufacturer for purchase of mats, also a concept of a desirable location for the mats. He further informed Mr. Lorimer that the Parking Facilities matter has been referred to the Supt. of Highways and he was hopeful that a complete report will be submitted at the next meeting of the Board.

The Annual Report of Tort Claims pursuant to Article 4, Section 50-F of the General Municipal Law, for the year 1963 was presented to the Board and ordered filed.

Tax Receiver's Reports, dated January 16, 1964 and February 3, 1964 were presented to the Board and ordered filed.

Police Department Report for the month of January, 1964 was presented to the Board and ordered filed.

Building Inspector's Report for the month of January, 1964 was presented to the Board and ordered filed.

The Supt. of Highways "Agreement For the Expenditure of Highway Moneys", for the year 1964, pursuant to Section 284 of the Highway Law, was presented to the Board and ordered filed.

The Supervisor's Report for the month of January, 1964, was presented to the Board and ordered filed.

Recreation Department Reports for the months of December, 1963 and January, 1964 were presented to the Board and ordered filed.

The Town Clerk was directed to write a letter of appreciation to the Riverhead Lion's Club for the communal participation and assistance rendered to the Recreation Department in the Ice Skating Program.

Kenneth G. Rowland, Recreation Director, informed the Board that it will soon be time to hire Beach Attendants for the 1964 Season. He asked that the Beach Attendants be empowered with the proper authority to carry out their duties more effectively. He suggested that a change in title from Beach Attendant to Constable may be the solution to provide better means of enforcing the Beach Ordinance.

The Board directed Mr. Rowland to review the matter of change of title with the Suffolk County Civil Service Commission, the Towns of Southampton and Brookhaven and make report to the Board. "

A communication from the Legal Aid Society of Suffolk County, N. Y., 260 West Main Street, Bay Shore, N. Y., was read and ordered filed. The Town Clerk was directed to submit copies of said communication to Justices Zaloga and Costello.

A communication from John R. Wilson, Sound Shore Road, Riverhead, N. Y., requesting the Town of Riverhead to install pipes to protect loss of his water front property on Sound Shore Road was read, ordered filed and matter referred to the Supt. of Highways.

A communication from the State Traffic Commission relative to the Signal Light located on Route 25, Edgar Avenue, Aquebogue, N. Y., was read, ordered filed and referred to Justice Costello and Police Chief Grodski.

A communication from Faye Sause, Laurel, N.Y., requesting a street light be placed at the corner of Church Lane and Main Road, Aquebogue, N. Y., was read and ordered filed.

The Town Clerk was directed to advise Faye Sause that the request for the installation of a light cannot be granted for the reason that the Church Lane Area is not within a Lighting District.

Two Petitions in Opposition to the matter of the application of Rene Gendron to amend or change the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, signed by owners of real property or electors in the Town of Riverhead, were presented to the Board and ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Attorney Edwin S. Lapham, advising, "that Vincent L. Fox, Elizabeth V. Fox and Marion Fox Rowan, desire to withdraw their application for a zoning change, without prejudice." The communication was ordered filed.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, that the request of Vincent L. Fox, Elizabeth V. Fox and Marion Fox Rowan to withdraw their application for a zoning change, be and is hereby granted, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk be and is hereby directed to forward a copy of this request to the Town of Riverhead Planning Board.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

At 11:00 A. M. Notice of Public Hearing was read and submitted to the Board relative to the Matter of the Amendment of Town Ordinance No. 26 of the Town of Riverhead knowns as the "Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York". The Notice was ordered filed.

Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing open to anyone wishing to be heard in favor of or in opposition to said amendment.

Attorney Edgar Hills, representing the petitioners, appeared before the Board in favor of said change and stated that said change is a much needed one.

No one else wishing to be heard and no communications relative thereto having been received, Supervisor Vojvoda declared the Hearing closed.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Costello.

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, has caused all matters and things to be done which are required by the Town Law in order that amendments and changes to the Zoning Ordinance No. 26, more particularly to the Zoning Map incorporated therein, may be adopted for the Town.

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority invested in it by Law, after Public Hearing duly held in the matter on February 4th, 1964, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead hereby adopts the following amendments and changes to the Zoning Ordinance No. 26, more particularly to the Zoning Map incorporated therein, more particularly bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point on the westerly line of Roanoke Avenue, which said point is formed by the intersection of the division-line between the lands of Clarence Anderson and now or formerly of Louis Stakey and Raymond L'Hommedieu with the westerly line of Roanoke Avenue, and running thence from said point of beginning southerly along the westerly line of Roanoke Avenue 300 feet; thence westerly on a line parallel to the northerly line of Old Country Road 1047.29 feet to the land of Clarence Anderson; thence northerly along the easterly line of land of Clarence Anderson to a point distant 1050 feet as measured at right angles to the northerly line of Old Country Road; thence easterly and northerly along the line of the Farm 1 Use District to the Business 1 Use District; thence easterly along the Business 1 Use District to the westerly line of Roanoke Avenue; thence southerly along the westerly line of Roanoke Avenue 250 feet, more or less, to the point or place of beginning.

To include this property before described in Business 1 Use District, Subject to the Declarations of Covenants and Restrictions which are to be filed dated February 4, 1964.

The Town Board further RESOLVES and ORDAINS that the Town Clerk of the Town of Riverhead is hereby authorized and directed to enter this amendment and change in the minutes of the Town Board, to publish a copy thereof, exclusive of the changed Map incorporated therein, once in the News-Review, the official newspaper published in the Town, and to post a copy thereof, together with said changed Map, on the signboard

maintained by the Town Clerk pursuant to subdivision 6 of Section 30 of the provisions of the Town Law and to file in his office affidavits of said publication and posting and that this amendment and change to Ordinance No. 26, more particularly to the Map incorporated therein, shall take effect 10 days after such publication and posting.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Town Attorney Scheinberg informed the Town Board that the matter of the Claim of Bernard Langhorne against the Town of Riverhead and the County of Suffolk has been referred to the Insurance Company.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the Town of Riverhead lease from "Scheinberg and Wolf", Roanoke Avenue, Riverhead, New York for parking purposes, the property at the northeast corner of Griffing Avenue and Second Street, Riverhead, New York, at the annual rental of \$1000.00 for a period of one year, effective February 1, 1964, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Supervisor be authorized and directed to enter into said lease in the name of the Town and to pay the consideration for the same.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Town Clerk, within 10 days hereafter, shall post and publish a notice which shall set forth the date of the adoption of this resolution and contain an abstract of such act or resolution concisely stating as herein the purpose thereof and that the said resolution is subject to permissive referendum.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Supervisor Vojvoda declared a Recess for Lunch at 12:00 Noon, to reconvene at 1:30 P. M.

The Town Board reconvened at 1:30 P. M., with all members present.

Alden W. Young made a request that the Highway Committee schedule a meeting at the earliest possible time, to meet with him and the Supt. of Highways to discuss and resolve the many unfinished drainage projects problems.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Costello.

RESOLVED, that pages 20 and 21 of the Minutes of the Town Board Meeting of January 14, 1964, be and is hereby amended, relating to the Resolution covering Section 2, Roanoke Homes, Inc., performance bond as follows:

By deleting from the fourth paragraph the word "and" and by deleting from the fifth paragraph the words "WHEREAS, in order to obtain the aforesaid five (5) months extension of time with the several conditions, a Resolution is required from the Planning Board to that effect", by deleting from the sixth paragraph the words "strongly recommends that the Planning Board approve by means of a Resolution".

And inserting the words in the sixth paragraph after the words Town Board, "hereby approves".

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the amended aforesaid Resolution shall read as follows:

WHEREAS, "Roanoke Homes, Inc." of 67 Long Neck Blvd., Flanders, Riverhead, New York as principal and Continental Casualty Company, an Illinois corporation authorized to do business in the State of New York having an office and place of business at 76 Williams Street, New York, New York, as surety did bind and obligate themselves, their successors and assigns, jointly and severally in the sum of \$26,000. to the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York as obligee under a performance bond dated December 12, 1961, which was conditioned upon the principal for the period beginning December 12, 1961, and ending December 12, 1963, to well and truly keep and in every respect comply with and conform to the provisions of the Resolution passed at a meeting of the Planning Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, held on the 25th day of May, 1961, requiring improvements of highways in the area known as "Section 2 'Roanoke Homes', Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York," and

WHEREAS, The said "Roanoke Homes, Inc." as principal has not fully complied with the aforesaid May 25, 1961 Resolution of the Planning Board, and

WHEREAS, The aforesaid Bond is in default, and

WHEREAS, The Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, considers it in the best interest of the Town that the period in which "Roanoke Homes, Inc." as principal has had to comply with the aforesaid May 25, 1961 Resolution of the Planning Board, be extended for a period of five (5) months to, but not including, the 1st day of June, 1964, provided that all grading of roads must be completed by April 1, 1964, all curbs must be installed by May 1, 1964, and all oiling of pavements and all other work must be completed by June 1, 1964,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Town Board hereby approves an extension to the time set forth in the performance bond of "Roanoke Homes, Inc." and Continental Casualty Company covering highway improvements to the area known as "Section 2, 'Roanoke Homes', Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York," for a period of five (5) months to, but not including the 1st day of June, 1964, provided that the aforesaid performance bond carry a rider which requires all grading of highways to be completed by April 1, 1964; all curbs to be installed by May 1, 1964; and all oiling of pavements and all other work to be completed by June 1, 1964.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of the aforesaid amended Resolution be forwarded to the Continental Casualty Company, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of the aforesaid amended Resolution be forwarded to Roanoke Homes, Inc.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

RESOLVED, That the Long Island Lighting Company be and it is hereby authorized to change the present lighting on Long Island Lighting Pole #7, Corner of First and East Avenue, Riverhead, N. Y., and Long Island Lighting Pole #7, Corner of Second and East Avenue, Riverhead, N. Y., to Mercury Lights.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was there-upon declared duly adopted.

Justice Costello offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Grodski.

RESOLVED, That the Long Island Lighting Company be and it is hereby authorized to make a survey for lighting in the following locations:

Corner of Church Lane and Main Road, Aquebogue, N. Y.

Walkway-East Main Street, Riverhead, N. Y.

Parking Field, Peconic Avenue area, Riverhead, N. Y.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was there-upon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Young offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, That the Superintendent of Highways be and is hereby authorized to pay overtime compensation for snow removal for the period of January 14, 1964 to January 31, 1964, for 1,025 hours in the amount of \$2,484.15.

The vote, Councilman Young, Yes, Councilman Grodski, Yes, Justice Zaloga, Yes, Justice Costello, Yes, and Supervisor Vojvoda, Yes. The resolution was there-upon declared duly adopted.

Supt. of Highways Alex E. Horton, made a request for the appointment of a Full Time Clerk for the Highway Department Office.

Mr. Horton was asked by the Board if this appointment of a Full Time Clerk will be an addition to the presently employed Part-Time Clerk. Mr. Horton replied that it was his opinion that a Full Time Clerk in addition to the Part-Time Clerk is necessary for the proper functioning of his office.

After discussion, it was suggested that this matter of a Full Time Clerk for the Highway Department Office be tabled for the next meeting. Mr. Horton was directed to forward a duty statement showing percentage of work time for the position of Full Time Clerk, to the Suffolk County Civil Service Commission for approval.

The matter of assigning a Police Patrolman to Plainclothes Man Duty and a monetary increase of \$300.00 be given consideration to the individual so assigned, was brought to the attention of the Board.

Justice Costello voiced an opinion that inasmuch as the Town of Riverhead is being assessed for a share of the costs of the 7th Squad, said costs being approximately \$30,000 per annum, and services of the 7th Squad are available to the Town at all times, that he sees no need for the assignment of a Plainclothes Man. He further stated that the State Police are also available and equipped to assist the Town Police.

Chief of Police Grodski implored that he deems the assignment of a Plainclothes Man to his staff a vital necessity and asked the Board to consider this request favorably.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Young.

RESOLVED, That the salary of Reginald Underwood, Police Patrolman, be and is hereby increased from \$6800. per annum to \$7100. per annum, payable semi-monthly, effective February 1, 1964.
