RESOLVED THAT THE APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE MEETINGS OF  
THE TOWN BOARD HELD ON DECEMBER 20, 1960 AND DECEMBER 30, 1960  
BE DISPENSED WITH.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES,  
JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION  
WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

THE TOWN CLERK REPORTED THAT AT 9:15 A.M., THIS DATE, HE  
RECEIVED THE FOLLOWING COMMUNICATION FROM OTIS G. PIKE.

"I SUBMIT HERewith MY RESIGNATION AS A JUSTICE

WHILE I HAVE RECEIVED NO EXPRESSION FROM THE  
GOVERNOR AS TO HIS WILLINGNESS TO CALL A  
SPECIAL ELECTION, I AM OBLIGED TO TAKE THIS  
STEP IN THE HOPE THAT IN FAIRNESS TO THE  
PEOPLE OF THE TOWN AND ESPECIALLY TO THE  
SOLE REMAINING JUSTICE, A SPECIAL ELECTION  
WILL BE CALLED.

PLEASE EXPRESS TO THE MEMBERS OF THE TOWN  
BOARD AND ALL OF THE TOWN'S EMPLOYEES MY  
DEEP APPRECIATION FOR THEIR FRIENDLY COOPER-  
ATION THROUGH THE YEARS."

JUSTICE ZALOGA OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS  
SECONDED BY SUPERVISOR LEONARD.

WHEREAS, THE RESIGNATION OF JUSTICE OF THE PEACE OTIS G. PIKE,  
HAS BEEN FILED WITH THE TOWN CLERK AND IS EFFECTIVE THE 3RD DAY  
OF JANUARY, 1961, AND

WHEREAS, A VACANCY THEREFORE EXISTS IN THE OFFICE OF JUSTICE  
OF THE PEACE OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, AND IT IS IN THE BEST  
INTERESTS OF THE TOWN TO FILL SAID VACANCY, NOW THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, IN ORDER TO FILL SAID VACANCY, JOSEPH V.  
KELLY BE AND HE IS HEREBY APPOINTED AS JUSTICE OF THE PEACE OF  
THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD TO FILL THE UNEXPIRED TERM CREATED BY THE

RESIGNATION OF SAID OTIS G. PIKE.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, No, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, No, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY DEFEATED FOR LACK OF MAJORITY VOTE OF THE BOARD.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

RESOLVED THAT PIERRE LUNDBERG, RIVERHEAD, BE AND HE IS HEREBY APPOINTED AS JUSTICE OF THE PEACE OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD TO FILL THE UNEXPIRED TERM CREATED BY THE RESIGNATION OF OTIS G. PIKE.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, No, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, No. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY DEFEATED FOR LACK OF MAJORITY VOTE OF THE BOARD.

WHEREAS, OTIS G. PIKE, HAS RESIGNED AS JUSTICE OF THE PEACE OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, SAID RESIGNATION BEING EFFECTIVE THE 3RD DAY OF JANUARY, 1961, AND

WHEREAS, THE BOARD HAS ATTEMPTED TO FILL THE VACANCY, EXISTING BY VIRTUE OF SAID RESIGNATION, BY THE APPOINTMENT OF A PERSON TO FILL THE UNEXPIRED TERM OF OTIS PIKE, AND

WHEREAS, BY VIRTUE OF A TIE VOTE THE TOWN BOARD IS UNABLE TO FILL SUCH VACANCY, AND

WHEREAS, THE TOWN BOARD NEVERTHELESS CONSIDERS IT TO BE IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE TOWN TO FILL SAID VACANCY IN ANY CASE BECAUSE OF THE AMOUNT OF JUSTICE COURT WORK TO BE DONE AND THE NECESSITY OF REACHING A PROPER MAJORITY TO CONDUCT THE BUSINESS OF THE TOWN.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THIS TOWN BOARD DOES AND IT HEREBY REQUESTS THE HONORABLE NELSON A. ROCKEFELLER, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, TO MAKE PROCLAMATION OF A SPECIAL ELECTION TO FILL SAID VACANCY.

A NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING FROM THE NEW YORK PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD. THE PETITIONER BEING, LONG ISLAND TRANSIT SYSTEMS, INC., AND THE DATE OF HEARING BEING JANUARY 17, 1961 AT 10 A.M.

PETITIONER REQUESTS A CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY FOR THE TEMPORARY OPERATION OF AN OMNIBUS LINE BETWEEN RIVERHEAD, SUFFOLK COUNTY, AND THE PORT OF NEW YORK AUTHORITY BUS TERMINAL IN THE BORO OF MANHATTAN, AS DESCRIBED IN PETITION VERIFIED DECEMBER 6, 1960.

A COMMUNICATION DATED DECEMBER 19, 1960 FROM THE LONG ISLAND RAIL ROAD WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"UNDER DATE OF DECEMBER 7, 1960 THE LONG ISLAND RAIL ROAD COMPANY FILED AN APPLICATION PURSUANT TO SECTION 50A OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE LAW SEEKING TO SUBSTITUTE FOR AND SUPPLEMENT EXISTING RAIL SERVICE IN SUFFOLK COUNTY WITH BUS SERVICE. ENCLOSED HEREWITH FOR YOUR INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE IS A COPY OF THE AFOREMENTIONED APPLICATION.

SECTION 50A OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE LAW REQUIRES THAT A RAILROAD SEEKING TO INSTITUTE SUCH A BUS OPERATION FIRST OBTAIN THE CONSENT OF THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES OF EACH CITY, TOWN OR VILLAGE AFFECTED. THE LAW DEPARTMENT OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION ALSO ADVISED THAT UNDER PSC 50A NO PUBLIC HEARING WOULD BE REQUIRED. THEREFORE, I WOULD APPRECIATE YOUR ACCEPTING THIS LETTER AS A REQUEST TO HAVE THIS MATTER SUBMITTED AT THE NEXT MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD FOR AN APPROPRIATE RESOLUTION. IF ANY ADDITIONAL INFORMATION IS REQUIRED, PLEASE CONTACT ME AND I WILL FURNISH WHATEVER IS DESIRED."

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED DECEMBER 21, 1960 FROM LONG ISLAND TRANSIT SYSTEMS, INC., WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"WE HAVE RECENTLY RECEIVED INFORMATION THAT THE LONG ISLAND RAILROAD HAS REQUESTED THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION TO ISSUE A CERTIFICATE WHEREBY THE RAILROAD MAY OPERATE A BUS RAIL ROUTE WITHIN THE AREA OF YOUR TOWNSHIP. THEIR NEXT STEP WILL BE THE REQUEST TO YOUR BOARD FOR THE ADOPTION OF A RESOLUTION APPROVING OF SUCH AN OPERATION.

WE FEEL THAT IN LIEU OF A RECENT FRANCHISE GRANTED US BY YOUR BOARD FOR THE OPERATION OF A COMPLETE BUS SERVICE OVER A SIMILAR ROUTE SERVING THE PUBLIC IN YOUR AREA TO A GREATER ADVANTAGE, WE SHOULD BE GIVEN AN

OPPORTUNITY TO DISCUSS THIS MATTER WITH YOUR BOARD BEFORE ANY DECISION CAN BE MADE ON THIS ISSUE. AT THE VERY OUTSET IT WOULD SEEM THAT THE OPERATION OF A BUS-RAIL SERVICE BY THE LONG ISLAND RAILROAD WOULD EVENTUALLY LEAD TO A COMPLETE ABANDONMENT OF RAIL SERVICE BY THEM WHEREAS THE OPERATION OF A BUS SERVICE BY ONE COMPANY WILL BE AN ADDITIONAL TRANSPORTATION SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY. MAY WE REQUEST THAT YOUR CLERK ADVISE US OF THE SCHEDULED DATE OF SUCH DISCUSSION SO THAT WE CAN BE PRESENT TO TALK MORE FULLY WITH YOU ON THIS MATTER." END.
