JUSTICE ZALOGA OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS
SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

WHEREAS, THE LONG ISLAND RAIL ROAD COMPANY HAS FILED AN APPLICA-
TION WITH THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION PURSUANT TO SECTION 50A OF
THE PUBLIC SERVICE LAW SEEKING TO SUBSTITUTE FOR AND SUPPLEMENT
EXISTING RAIL SERVICE IN SUFFOLK COUNTY WITH BUS SERVICE, AND

WHEREAS, THE SAID LONG ISLAND RAIL ROAD COMPANY HAS SUBMITTED
TO THE RIVERHEAD TOWN BOARD A COPY OF THE AFOREMENTIONED APPLICA-
TION WITH THE REQUEST THAT THE MATTER BE SUBMITTED TO SAID TOWN
BOARD FOR AN APPROPRIATE RESOLUTION OF CONSENT TO SAID APPLICATION,
AND

WHEREAS THE APPLICATION HAS BEEN READ AND DULY FILED, AND

WHEREAS A PUBLIC HEARING WAS HELD BY THE TOWN BOARD AT THE TOWN
HALL IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD ON THE 14TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1961,
AT 10:00 A.M. ON THAT DAY, AFTER PUBLICATION OF NOTICE IN THE

NEWS-REVIEW, THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER OF SAID TOWN, SAID HEARING HAVING AFFORDED THOSE WISHING TO BE HEARD AN OPPORTUNITY TO APPEAR AND BE HEARD, AND

WHEREAS THIS BOARD FEELS THAT THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD WILL BE SERVED BY AN APPROVAL AND CONSENT OF THIS BOARD TO THE APPLICATION,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD DOES HEREBY APPROVE AND CONSENT THAT THE APPLICATION OF THE LONG ISLAND RAIL ROAD, REQUESTING THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION TO ISSUE A CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY TO SAID COMPANY FOR THE OPERATION OF AN OMNIBUS LINE FOR THE CARRIAGE OF PASSENGERS, PARCELS, BAGGAGE, MAIL, EXPRESS AND NEWSPAPERS BETWEEN GREENPORT, RIVERHEAD, HUNTINGTON AND RONKONKOMA, ALL IN SUFFOLK COUNTY, STATE OF NEW YORK, AND ALL INTERMEDIATE POINTS ALONG THE ROUTES DESCRIBED IN THE APPLICATION OR SUCH PART OF SUCH ROUTES AS MAY BE IN THE PUBLIC INTEREST AND TO CONDUCT CHARTER TRIPS BY OMNIBUS BETWEEN ALL POINTS ON LONG ISLAND AND BETWEEN SUCH POINTS AND THE CITY OF NEW YORK AND FROM ALL POINTS ON LONG ISLAND TO ALL POINTS IN THE STATE OF NEW YORK, BE GRANTED.
