COUNCILMAN BELL OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS

RESOLVED THAT IN THE ABSENCE OF THE SUPERVISOR, JUSTICE BRUNO F.  
ZALOGA, JR., BE AND HE IS HEREBY DESIGNATED TEMPORARY CHAIRMAN FOR  
THIS MEETING.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES,  
JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD,  
ABSENT. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN BELL OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS  
SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

WHEREAS, JOSEPH V. KELLY HAS RENDERED OUTSTANDING PUBLIC SERVICE  
TO THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD AND THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK AS A PUBLIC  
OFFICER AND CIVIC MINDED CITIZEN,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THIS TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD EXTENDS ITS SINCEREST SYMPATHY AND CONDOLENCES TO THE FAMILY OF THE LATE JOSEPH V. KELLY, AND FURTHER

RESOLVED THAT THIS RESOLUTION BE ENTERED IN THE MINUTES OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THIS MEETING, AND BE IT FURTHER

RESOLVED THAT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION BE FORWARDED TO THE FAMILY OF THE LATE JOSEPH V. KELLY.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, ABSENT. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

POLICE REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH, 1961 WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MARCH 31, 1961 FROM THE SUFFOLK COUNTY CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"THIS WILL ACKNOWLEDGE RECEIPT OF YOUR LETTER OF MARCH 28, RELATIVE TO THE RIVERHEAD TOWN BOARD'S REQUEST FOR A NEW POLICE LIEUTENANT PROMOTION EXAMINATION. A COMMUNICATION DATED APRIL 3, 1961 FROM LAWRENCE TAYLOR, RIVERHEAD, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD REQUESTING THAT HE BE CONSIDERED FOR THE JOB OF PATROLLING THE BAY AND SOUND WATERS IN THE EVENT THE TOWN SHOULD PURCHASE A BOAT FOR THIS PURPOSE.

THE TOWN CLERK WAS INSTRUCTED TO INFORM MR. TAYLOR THAT THERE IS NO OPENING FOR THIS POSITION AT THIS TIME, AND FURTHER, THAT HIS COMMUNICATION WILL BE KEPT ON FILE FOR CONSIDERATION IN THE EVENT THIS POSITION IS CREATED BY THE BOARD.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

RESOLVED THAT THE SUPERVISOR BE AUTHORIZED TO PURCHASE ONE AUTOMATIC PROJECTOR GUN FOR USE ON DOGS, COMPLETE WITH SUPPLIES, FROM THE PALMER CHEMICAL AND EQUIPMENT COMPANY, ATLANTA, GEORGIA, AT A COST NOT TO EXCEED \$400.00.

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THIS ITEM BE CHARGED TO BUDGET ITEM - DOG WARDEN - OTHER EXPENSES.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, ABSENT. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MARCH 31, 1961 FROM STANLEY B. KOWALSKI, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"I AM ANTICIPATING BUILDING A HOME ON MY LOT IN THE NEAR FUTURE. IT IS LOCATED IN SOUTH JAMESPORT. I HAVE OWNED AND PAID TAXES ON THIS PROPERTY SINCE 1933. THE EXACT LOCATION IS ON THIRD STREET, EAST OF GREEN STREET. AS IT STANDS NOW, I AM UNABLE TO REACH THIS LAND WITH A CAR. I WOULD LIKE TO HAVE THE TOWN BOARD APPROVE OPENING THE THIRD STREET SECTION EAST OF GREEN STREET. I APPRECIATE YOUR TAKING THIS INTO CONSIDERATION. THANK YOU VERY MUCH."

MATTER REFERRED TO THE HIGHWAY COMMITTEE AND THE TOWN ATTORNEY. COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MARCH 28, 1961 FROM JUSTICE BRUNO F. ZALOGA, JR., WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"THERE SEEMS TO BE SOME INTERNAL CONFLICT IN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT, TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, OF WHICH I FEEL THAT ALL OF US ARE FULLY AWARE. I FEEL THAT I CAN NO LONGER CONTINUE IN THE POSITION AS POLICE COMMISSIONER OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, BECAUSE OF THIS. AS OF THIS DATE, MARCH 28, 1961, I AM RESIGNING FROM THE ABOVE MENTIONED POSITION."

JUSTICE COSTELLO ASKED JUSTICE ZALOGA TO RECONSIDER AND CONTINUE AS POLICE COMMISSIONER.

JUSTICE ZALOGA STATED THAT HE HAD CAREFULLY WEIGHED THIS MATTER AND THAT HE WOULD NOT WITHDRAW HIS RESIGNATION.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT JUSTICE ZALOGA'S RESIGNATION AS POLICE COMMISSIONER BE ACCEPTED WITH REGRET.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

JUSTICE COSTELLO OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

RESOLVED THAT WILLIAM J. LEONARD, SUPERVISOR, BE AND HE IS HEREBY DESIGNATED TO SERVE AS POLICE COMMISSIONER OF THE RIVERHEAD TOWN POLICE DEPARTMENT, ALL PURSUANT TO SECTION 150, PARAGRAPH 2, OF THE TOWN LAW, EFFECTIVE THIS DAY.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, ABSENT. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MARCH 31, 1961 FROM THE CHIEF OF DETECTIVES, SUFFOLK COUNTY POLICE, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"I SHOULD LIKE TO EXPRESS OUR APPRECIATION FOR THE SPLENDID WORK DONE BY YOU AND YOUR DEPARTMENT DURING THE INVESTIGATION OF THE DEATH OF JOSEPH KELLY. YOUR FINE SPIRIT OF COOPERATION WAS IN THE

BEST TRADITION OF MODERN LAW ENFORCEMENT. OF SPECIAL NOTE WAS THE EXCELLENT CRIME SCENE PROTECTION AFFORDED BY THE FIRST OFFICER AT THE SCENE. DET. SGT. PALMER SHOULD ALSO BE COMMENDED FOR HIS EFFICIENCY AND KNOWLEDGE OF LOCAL CONDITIONS. PLEASE BE ASSURED OF OUR DESIRE TO COOPERATE IN ALL MATTERS OF MUTUAL INTEREST."

RESOLVED THAT THE SUPERVISOR, PURSUANT TO SECTION 29, PARAGRAPH 15, OF THE TOWN LAW, BE AND HE IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO DESIGNATE AND EMPLOY, IN BEHALF OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, A BOOKKEEPER, AND THAT THE PERSON SO EMPLOYED SHALL RECEIVE AS COMPENSATION FOR SERVICES, THE SALARY OF \$3500. PER ANNUM, PAYABLE SEMI-MONTHLY.

RESOLVED THAT KENNETH G. ROWLAND, RECREATION DIRECTOR, BE AND HE IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO ATTEND THE NEW YORK STATE RECREATION SOCIETY CONFERENCE TO BE HELD AT SYRACUSE, NEW YORK, APRIL 23 THROUGH APRIL 26, 1961, AND THAT NECESSARY EXPENSES INCIDENTAL TO THIS ATTENDANCE BE PAID FROM BUDGET ITEM - RECREATION.

WHEREAS, THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD IS ACQUIRING BY CONDEMNATION, PROPERTY AT EAST CREEK, JAMESPORT, IN THE SAID TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, AND

WHEREAS, THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK IS PRESENTLY ENGAGED IN DREDGING SAID EAST CREEK TO MAKE IT NAVIGABLE AND CONVENIENT FOR THE SHELTERING OF BOATS, AND

WHEREAS, THE SAID COUNTY OF SUFFOLK WILL BE ENGAGED IN SAID DREDGING OPERATION FOR AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF TIME AND IT WILL BE NECESSARY TO KEEP THE AREA CLEAR TO PERMIT FREE ACCESS FOR THE DREDGING WORK TO BE COMPLETED,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, UNTIL THE SAID DREDGING WORK IS COMPLETED AND UNTIL PROPER RULES AND REGULATIONS ARE APPROVED BY THIS BOARD, NO PERSON SHALL BE PERMITTED TO TIE UP, STAKE OR SHELTER A BOAT OR BOATS IN SAID EAST CREEK.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION BE FORWARDED TO THE SUFFOLK COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FOR FURTHER ACTION CONCERNING SAME.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN CLERK BE AND HE IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO ADVERTISE FOR SEALED BIDS FOR ONE (1) 1961 INDUSTRIAL TRACTOR WITH BUCKET LOADER FOR USE OF THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT.

BIDS TO BE RETURNABLE UP TO 10:15 A.M. ON APRIL 18, 1961.

SPECIFICATIONS TO BE PREPARED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, ABSENT. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A DISCUSSION WAS HELD RELATIVE TO A SITE OR LOCATION FOR THE TOWN POLICE DEPARTMENT.

CHIEF OF POLICE GRODSKI REPORTED THAT THE SECURITY NATIONAL BANK BUILDING ON WEST MAIN STREET MAY BE AVAILABLE FOR LEASE OR SALE BY THE END OF THE YEAR AS A NEW SECURITY NATIONAL BANK IS TO BE CONSTRUCTED ON E. MAIN STREET.

JUSTICE ZALOGA REFERRED THE MATTER TO COUNCILMAN BELL AND

THE CHIEF OF POLICE FOR STUDY AND REPORT.

JUSTICE ZALOGA REPORTED THAT THE LOCAL POST OF THE VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS HAD REQUESTED THAT IT BE ALLOWED TO INSTALL CLAMPS ON CERTAIN PARKING METER POSTS WITHIN THE TOWN FOR THE DISPLAY OF THE FLAG ON CERTAIN HISTORICAL OCCASIONS.

MATTER TABLED FOR FURTHER STUDY.

A COMMUNICATION FROM SUPERVISOR LEONARD WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

THE VOTE--- COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, ABSENT. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLAR- ED DULY ADOPTED.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS ON MOTION AND VOTE, THE MEETING ADJOURNED TO MEET ON TUESDAY, APRIL 18, 1961 AT 9:30 A.M.
