

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD
HELD IN THE TOWN HALL ON TUESDAY, MAY 16, 1961 AT 9:30 A. M.

COUNCILMAN BELL OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS
SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

RESOLVED THAT THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD
HELD IN THE TOWN HALL ON TUESDAY, MAY 2, 1961 BE APPROVED AS
SUBMITTED.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES,
JUSTICE ZALOGA, ABSENT, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR
LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY
ADOPTED.

MR. WILLIAM WANAT, PRESIDENT OF THE CAL-HOLLOW TAXPAYERS ASSOC-
IATION APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD WITH A LARGE GROUP OF ASSOCIATION
MEMBERS AND OTHERS.

MR. WANAT STATED AS FOLLOWS:

"WE APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD ABOUT TWO MONTHS AGO
WITH A PETITION RELATIVE TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A
PUBLIC RECREATION AREA AT OR NEAR EDWARDS AVENUE IN
BAITING HOLLOW.

WE UNDERSTAND A COUNTER PETITION IS BEING CIRCULATED
STATING THAT THIS PROJECT IS NOT IN THE BEST INTEREST
OF THE TOWN. MOST OF THE PEOPLE CIRCULATING THIS
COUNTER PETITION ARE NOT TAXPAYERS AND WE ARE HERE
TO RE-AFFIRM OUR REQUEST FOR A BEACH AND RECREATION
AREA AT BAITING HOLLOW.

MOST OF US ARE LIFELONG RESIDENTS OF RIVERHEAD AND
WE ARE DENIED THE PRIVILEGE OF USING THE BEACH AREA
WE USED FOR MANY YEARS. IT SEEMS THAT PEOPLE LIVING
IN THE AREA WANT THE BEACH FOR THEMSELVES. THEY AND
THEIR FRIENDS ALSO PARK CARS ON THE ROAD AND ALMOST
COMPLETELY BLOCK OFF THE ROADWAY.

OUR TAXES COULD PAY FOR ADDITIONAL BEACH PROPERTY.

ON THE EAST SIDE OF EDWARDS AVENUE, A BUNGALOW IS BUILT TO AN INCH OF EDWARDS AVENUE."

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY REPLIED AS FOLLOWS:

"WE ESTABLISHED THE HIGH WATER MARK IN THE AREA AND PLACED A MARKER ACCORDING TO THE U.S. COAST AND GEODETIC SURVEY. WE CAN ASSURE YOU THAT NO FENCE WILL BE CONSTRUCTED BEYOND THIS MARKER.

WE ARE STUDYING THE PARKING SITUATION.

RELATIVE TO THE BUNGALOW BEING BUILT WITHIN AN INCH OF THE ROAD, THIS BUNGALOW IS ON THE OWNERS PROPERTY AND IS NOT WITHIN THE ROAD LINE.

WE SENT A LETTER TO THE BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA HOPING THAT WE COULD MAKE A DEAL WITH THEM AND PURCHASE A PORTION OF THEIR LAND. WE RECEIVED A REPLY STATING THEY ARE NOT INTERESTED IN SELLING ANY OF THEIR PROPERTY.

AS AN ALTERNATE MEASURE, THE PLANNING BOARD HAS SUGGESTED THAT WE ACQUIRE BY PURCHASE OR CONDEMNATION, THREE BUNGALOWS TO THE WEST OF EDWARDS AVENUE ON THE BEACH OWNED BY THE LEWIN FAMILY AND OTHERS. SUPERVISOR LEONARD AND MYSELF ARE TRYING TO NEGOTIATE WITH SAID BUNGALOW OWNERS TO ESTABLISH IF THE PRICE IS REASONABLE OR PROHIBITIVE OR IF THEY WOULD SELL."

SUPERVISOR LEONARD REPLIED AS FOLLOWS:

"IF IT SHOULD BECOME IMPOSSIBLE TO COME TO TERMS WITH THE OWNERS OF SAID BUNGALOWS, POSSIBLY THE TOWN COULD LEASE THE BEACH AREA IN FRONT OF SAID BUNGALOWS AND THEN THE TOWN COULD PURCHASE REAR LAND FOR PARKING PURPOSES."

ATTORNEY IRVING KAHN, REPRESENTING THE CAL-HOLLOW ASSOCIATION APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND STATED:

"I WROTE TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE BOY SCOUT COUNCIL ALONG THE SAME LINES AS THE TOWN BOARD DID AND ALSO ASKED HIM ABOUT A LEASE ARRANGEMENT. THERE MUST HAVE BEEN SOME MISUNDERSTANDING AS FAR AS THE BOY SCOUTS ARE CONCERNED AS WE ONLY WANTED THE EASTERLY PORTION OF THEIR LAND FOR PURCHASE OR LEASE.

I ASKED THE BOY SCOUT COUNCIL, ALSO, FOR A CONFERENCE. AS YET I HAVE NOT RECEIVED A REPLY.

THE CAL-HOLLOW TAXPAYERS ASSOCIATION WANT THE BOARD TO KNOW THAT THERE IS NO ANIMOSITY AGAINST THE BOARD. THEY WANT TO AVOID CALLING THE POLICE AND KEEP A PEACEFUL ATMOSPHERE AT THE AREA.

MAYBE THE TOWN BOARD COULD ALSO ASK THE BOY SCOUT COUNCIL FOR A CONFERENCE AND DISCUSS LEASING A PORTION OF THEIR LAND EVEN ON A TEMPORARY BASIS."

ATTORNEY ROBERT L. TOOKER APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND STATED:

"AS FAR AS THE FRESH POND BEACH ASSOCIATION IS CONCERNED ITS PEOPLE DO NOT WANT A PUBLIC BEACH IN THE AREA.

THEY HAVE A PETITION WHICH ALREADY HAS ABOUT 165 SIGNATURES AND WHICH I HAVE IN MY OFFICE. IF THE SUBJECT KEEPS COMING UP MY PEOPLE WILL START TO COME IN.

THE ESTATE OF SARA WELLS SAYS THEY DO NOT WANT TO SELL THEIR PROPERTY. PRICE IS NOT A FACTOR. THEY WANT IT TO BE PRIVATE LAND. A PUBLIC BEACH IN THE AREA IS CONTRARY TO THEIR PLANS.

A PUBLIC BEACH IN THE AREA WOULD MEAN PARKING, REFRESHMENT STANDS, REST ROOMS, LIFEGUARDS, ETC. THEY DON'T FEEL THAT A PUBLIC BEACH IN THE AREA IS IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE TOWN."

SUPERVISOR LEONARD STATED THAT PEOPLE OWNING BUNGALOWS NEVER OBJECTED IN THE PAST TO PEOPLE USING THE BEACH IN FRONT OF THEIR BUNGALOWS.

ATTORNEY IRVING KAHN FURTHER STATED:

"I MAKE ONE SUGGESTION. CAL-HOLLOW ASSOCIATION HAS FILED ITS PETITION. IF MR. TOOKER HAS A COUNTER PETITION, THEN IT SHOULD BE PRESENTED. I UNDERSTAND THAT MR. TOOKER'S PETITION HAS SIGNATURES OF MATTITUCK PEOPLE. WE SHOULD ALL HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO LOOK AT ALL PETITIONS."

MRS. ANN MILOSKI APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND STATED:

"I HAVE SEEN THE COUNTER PETITION AND I WISH IT WAS PRESENTED AS I THINK IT MISREPRESENTS THE FACTS. THERE ARE FOUR PEOPLE WHO HAVE BEEN CONSTANTLY CHASING US OFF OF THE BEACH."

MRS. ANGELO TOSCANO APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND STATED:

"WE SHOULD HAVE USE OF THIS BEACH. IT'S FOR OUR CHILDREN. IT'S FIVE MILES TO THE NEAREST PUBLIC BEACH AND WE ALL DO NOT HAVE CARS TO TAKE THE CHILDREN TO THE BEACH. HERE, MOST CHILDREN CAN WALK TO AND FROM."

MRS. THEODORE OKULA APPEARED BEFORE THE BOARD AND STATED:

"WE SHOULD HAVE ASH CANS AND REST ROOMS AT THIS BEACH."

MR. WILLIAM WANAT FURTHER STATED:

"WE WISH TO THANK THE BOARD FOR THEIR EFFORTS AND WE WOULD LIKE TO HAVE SOME INFORMATION ON THIS MATTER BY THE END OF THE MONTH IF POSSIBLE."

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 12, 1961 FROM THE OAK HILLS ASSOCIATION, INC., WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD OPPOSING THE PROPOSED ROAD AND BEACH TO BE ESTABLISHED AT BAITING HOLLOW.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 1, 1961 FROM MRS. ALFRED F. TUTHILL, JAMESPORT, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD.

SHE REQUESTED THE INSTALLATION OF A FULL STOP SIGN ON THE

CORNER OF TUTT'S LANE AND FOURTH STREET, JAMESPORT.

THIS MATTER WAS REFERRED TO THE CHIEF OF POLICE.

MRS. TUTHILL REQUESTED TO BE ADVISED AS TO WHAT THE TOWN PLANS FOR THE MARINE BASIN AT EAST CREEK.

THE TOWN CLERK WAS INSTRUCTED TO ADVISE HER THAT THE DREDGING AT EAST CREEK HAS NOT BEEN COMPLETED AND AT THE PRESENT TIME PLANS CALL FOR GRADING AND A SUITABLE PARKING AREA. FURTHER, AS FUNDS ARE AVAILABLE, THE PLAN IS TO HAVE A FULLY USABLE MARINA WITH BULKHEADING AND PROPER LANDSCAPING.

SHE ALSO COMPLAINED THAT THE OPERATION OF THE COUNTY DREDGE IN EAST CREEK CAUSED SULFUR GASES TO DISCOLOR AND PEEL THE PAINT ON HER HOME.

THIS MATTER WAS REFERRED TO THE SUFFOLK COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 12, 1961 FROM THE SUFFOLK COUNTY TREASURER WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD REQUESTING THE RENTAL OF THE BURROUGHS SENSIMATIC TAX EXTENSION COMPUTER OWNED BY THE TOWN.

THE TOWN CLERK WAS INSTRUCTED TO REPLY THAT AFTER A CONFERENCE WITH THE TAX OFFICE AND DUE TO THE FACT THAT THE MACHINE WOULD HAVE TO BE MOVED, IT WAS THE UNANIMOUS DECISION OF THE BOARD THAT THIS REQUEST BE DENIED.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 3, 1961 FROM THE RIVERHEAD YACHT CLUB WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

"THE OFFICERS AND BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE RIVERHEAD YACHT CLUB, RESPECTFULLY REQUEST THAT THE TOWN BOARD CONSIDER A SHORTENING OF THE SEWER DISCHARGE INTO THE PECONIC RIVER. IF THE DISCHARGE PIPE WERE MOVED BACK 20 FEET, AND 15 FEET OF BULKHEADING BUILT ON EACH SIDE, OR A TOTAL OF 30 FEET, THE SHORE FRONT WOULD BE MORE IN A STRAIGHT LINE. THEN THE YACHT CLUB WOULD HAVE A NUCLEUS TO WORK FROM IN ORDER TO EXTEND THE BULKHEADING A SUFFICIENT DISTANCE EITHER EAST OR WEST TO ACCOMODATE DOCKING OF YACHT CLUB MEMBERS OR TRANSIENTS. HOPING TO RECEIVE A FAVORABLE REPORT AT YOUR CONVENIENCE."

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 1, 1961 FROM THE SUFFOLK COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD RELATIVE TO THE "VAN LARE ACT".

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 11, 1961 FROM THE SUFFOLK COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD RELATIVE TO A SUMMARY OF BUILDING CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES IN THE COUNTY FOR THE PAST YEAR.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 2, 1961 FROM SENATOR KENNETH B. KEATING WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD RELATIVE TO THE PROPOSED LOCATION OF A POTATO STARCH PLANT ON NAVY PROPERTY AT CALVERTON.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 4, 1961 FROM THE LOCAL AMERICAN LEGION POST WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD REQUESTING THE BOARD TO ATTEND MEMORIAL DAY SERVICE TO BE CONDUCTED BY SAID POST.

THE TOWN CLERK WAS INSTRUCTED TO REPLY THAT BOARD MEMBERS WOULD ATTEND.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 3, 1961 FROM THE WADING RIVER CIVIC ASSOCIATION WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD RELATIVE TO TRAFFIC AND PARKING CONDITIONS AT THE TOWN OWNED PARKING FIELD IN WADING RIVER.

MATTER REFERRED TO THE CHIEF OF POLICE AND THE HIGHWAY COMMITTEE.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED MAY 12, 1961 FROM THE BROOKHAVEN NATIONAL LABORATORY WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD COMMENDING THE POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR ASSISTING IN THE RAPID PROCUREMENT OF A BOX OF BLOOD FROM THE CENTRAL SUFFOLK HOSPITAL.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

TOWN ATTORNEY HARDING REPORTED ON THE MATTER OF THE REQUEST OF THE AQUEBOGUE CEMETERY ASSOCIATION FOR USE OF ADDITIONAL LAND FOR CEMETERY PURPOSES.

HE STATED THAT HE CONTACTED THE SECRETARY OF THE ASSOCIATION, LESLIE H. CORWIN, AND ADVISED HIM THAT THIS MATTER MUST BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE SUFFOLK COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE COSTELLO.

WHEREAS JOHN KALBA WAS PREVIOUSLY APPOINTED AS A MEMBER OF THE ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS TO HOLD OFFICE FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS, COMMENCING JUNE 1, 1959, AND

WHEREAS HIS TERM WILL EXPIRE AS OF JUNE 1, 1961, AND IT IS THE DESIRE OF THE TOWN BOARD TO APPOINT HIM FOR A REGULAR TERM,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT JOHN KALBA IS APPOINTED AS A MEMBER OF THE ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS TO HOLD OFFICE FOR THE TERM OF FIVE (5) YEARS, COMMENCING JUNE 1, 1961.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, ABSENT, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

JUSTICE COSTELLO OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

RESOLVED THAT PATRICIA S. TORMEY IS (AGAIN) DESIGNATED AS CHAIRMAN OF THE ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS, TO SERVE FOR A PERIOD OF ONE YEAR, COMMENCING JUNE 1, 1961.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, ABSENT, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

RESOLVED THAT THE BID FOR THE PURCHASE OF DIESEL OIL REQUIREMENTS FOR USE OF THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT FOR THE TERM OF ONE YEAR, JUNE 1, 1961 TO JUNE 1, 1962, BE AND IT IS HEREBY AWARDED TO DOLAN'S FUEL SERVICE, 33 SUNRISE AVENUE, RIVERHEAD, N.Y., AT A DELIVERED PRICE TO RIVERHEAD TOWN HIGHWAY GARAGE, OSBORNE AVENUE, RIVERHEAD, OF \$.138 PER GALLON, SUBJECT TO ITS BID AND SPECIFICATION FORM SUBMITTED, DATED MAY 8, 1961.

RESOLVED THAT THE FOLLOWING BE AND THEY ARE HEREBY APPOINTED LEADER AND ASSISTANT LEADER RESPECTIVELY TO SERVE ON THE PLAYGROUNDS, RECREATION DEPARTMENT, EFFECTIVE JULY 10, 1961 TO AND INCLUDING AUGUST 18, 1961, TO BE PAID SEMI-MONTHLY: LINDA REEVE--

\$7.50 PER SESSION AND ANITA PETERS--\$4.50 PER SESSION.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, ABSENT, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

SUPERVISOR LEONARD OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

WHEREAS, THERE IS A SHORTAGE OF PERSONNEL IN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT DUE TO NEW CIVIL SERVICE REGULATIONS, AND

WHEREAS THE LOW BID DOES NOT CONFORM TO SPECIFICATIONS,

BE IT RESOLVED THAT ALL BIDS RECEIVED ON MAY 2, 1961, FOR ONE (1) BOAT, COMPLETE WITH MOTOR AND TRAILER FOR USE OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT BE AND THEY ARE HEREBY REJECTED.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, ABSENT, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

AN APPLICATION FROM WALTER C. LINNEN, OSTRANDER AVENUE, RIVERHEAD, FOR CURBS, GUTTERS AND SIDEWALK WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD.

MATTER REFERRED TO THE HIGHWAY COMMITTEE.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY REPORTED ON THE REQUEST OF DANIEL ROCHE, SOUND AVENUE, RIVERHEAD, RELATIVE TO THE DRAINAGE PROBLEM IN THAT AREA.

HE STATED THAT HE HAD CONTACTED MR. FRANKLIN YOUNG ON SOUND AVENUE AND THAT MR. YOUNG STATED HE WOULD BE RECEPTIVE TO ANY PROGRAM TO RELIEVE SAID DRAINAGE PROBLEM, AND THAT THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT COULD LAY A PIPE UNDER THE ROAD TO DRAIN INTO HIS PROPERTY.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY FURTHER STATED THAT WRITTEN EASEMENTS SHOULD BE OBTAINED FROM MR. YOUNG FOR THIS PROJECT.

THE TOWN ATTORNEY STATED THAT HE WOULD PREPARE EASEMENTS FOR MR. YOUNG'S SIGNATURE AS SOON AS DEFINITE PLANS WERE COMPLETED AND HE RECEIVED A DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPERTY INVOLVED.

SUPERVISOR LEONARD OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

RESOLVED THAT SGT. ROBERT G. LEONARD BE AND HE IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO ATTEND A POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL AT ST. LAWRENCE UNIVERSITY, JULY 16, 1961 THROUGH JULY 21, 1961 AND THAT ALL NECESSARY EXPENSES INCLUDING TUITION BE PAID.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, ABSENT, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

SUPERVISOR LEONARD OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE COSTELLO.

RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN CLERK BE AND HE IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED

TO ADVERTISE FOR SEALED BIDS FOR ONE (1) 1961 CAR FOR USE OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT.

SPECIFICATIONS TO BE PREPARED BY THE CHIEF OF POLICE.

BIDS TO BE RETURNABLE UP TO 10 A.M. ON JUNE 6, 1961.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, ABSENT, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

THE TOWN BOARD CONVENED AS A BOARD OF AUDIT AND EXAMINED ALL BILLS TO DATE, THE TOTAL OF WHICH WAS AS FOLLOWS: GENERAL TOWN---\$58,746.58 AND MACHINERY FUND---\$1,452.91. ON MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT THE BILLS BE APPROVED AS RENDERED.
