POLICE REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1961 WAS SUBMITTED TO  
THE BOARD AND ORDERED FILED.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1961 WAS SUB-  
MITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED OCTOBER 16, 1961 FROM THE WADING RIVER  
CIVIC ASSOCIATION WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD THAT READ IN PART AS  
FOLLOWS:

"THAT THE WADING RIVER CIVIC ASSOCIATION REQUEST  
THE RIVERHEAD TOWN BOARD TO MODIFY THE PRESENT  
ZONING ORDINANCE No. 26 TO INCLUDE THE FOLLOW-  
ING:

1. NO NEW TRAILER PARK OR MOBILE TRAILER  
PARK SHALL BE PERMITTED TO ESTABLISH  
ITSELF WITHIN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD.
2. ALL PRESENTLY ESTABLISHED TRAILER  
PARKS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO EXPAND."      END.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

MATTER REFERRED TO THE PLANNING BOARD.

TOWN ATTORNEY HARDING REPORTED THAT THE ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS  
HAD RECEIVED A "NOTICE OF MOTION" RETURNABLE IN THE SUPREME COURT -  
LEIGHTON HARDING VS THE ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS OF THE TOWN OF  
RIVERHEAD - RELATIVE TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A TRAILER PARK IN  
WADING RIVER.

HE STATED THAT THIS MATTER HAD BEEN ADJOURNED UNTIL THE 27TH  
DAY OF NOVEMBER 1961, AND THAT THE TOWN BOARD SHOULD APPOINT A  
SPECIAL ATTORNEY TO HANDLE THIS MATTER.

MATTER TABLED FOR FURTHER STUDY.

SUPERVISOR LEONARD OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS  
SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN CLERK BE AND HE IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO  
ADVERTISE FOR SEALED BIDS FOR POLICE APPAREL FOR USE BY THE POLICE

## DEPARTMENT.

BIDS TO BE RETURNABLE UP TO 10:15 A.M. ON NOVEMBER 21, 1961.

SPECIFICATIONS TO BE PREPARED BY THE CHIEF OF POLICE.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN BELL OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

RESOLVED THAT THE SUM OF \$4000. BE TRANSFERRED FROM HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT ITEM No. 4 TO HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT ITEM No. 3.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED OCTOBER 31, 1961 FROM THE JAMESPORT-SOUTH JAMESPORT CIVIC ASSOCIATION WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD RELATIVE TO THE HAZARDOUS RAILROAD CROSSING AT WASHINGTON AVENUE, JAMESPORT.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

WHEREAS, A HAZARDOUS TRAFFIC CONDITION EXISTS AT THE RAILROAD CROSSING ON WASHINGTON AVENUE, JAMESPORT, TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, AND

WHEREAS, THERE HAS BEEN LOSS OF LIFE AT SAID CROSSING, AND

WHEREAS, THIS CROSSING IS USED BY SCHOOL BUSES, AND

WHEREAS, THE JAMESPORT-SOUTH JAMESPORT CIVIC ASSOCIATION HAS REQUESTED THAT THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD ALLEVIATE THIS HAZARDOUS TRAFFIC CONDITION,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD HEREBY REQUESTS THE INSTALLATION OF AUTOMATIC RAILROAD BLINKER SIGNALS AT THE RAILROAD CROSSING ON WASHINGTON AVENUE, JAMESPORT, TOWN OF RIVERHEAD.

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT A CERTIFIED COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION BE FORWARDED TO THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK AND THE LONG ISLAND RAILROAD.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

THE TOWN BOARD CONVENEED AS A BOARD OF AUDIT AND EXAMINED ALL TOWN BILLS TO DATE, THE TOTAL OF WHICH WAS AS FOLLOWS: GENERAL TOWN---\$11,724.40. ON MOTION MADE BY JUSTICE ZALOGA AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL, IT WAS RESOLVED THAT THE BILLS BE APPROVED AS RENDERED. THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, JUSTICE COSTELLO, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.
