

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD HELD IN THE TOWN HALL ON JANUARY 5, 1960 AT 9:30 A.M.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

RESOLVED THAT THE APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD HELD ON DECEMBER 29, 1959 BE DISPENSED WITH.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, ABSENT, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

JUSTICE ZALOGA OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY SUPERVISOR LEONARD.

RESOLVED THAT JACOB HARDING, RIVERHEAD, BE AND HE HEREBY IS APPOINTED TO THE OFFICE OF TOWN ATTORNEY, EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 1960, AND HIS SALARY IS FIXED AT THE ANNUAL SUM OF \$3500.00, PAYABLE IN EQUAL MONTHLY INSTALLMENTS DURING HIS TERM OF OFFICE.

COUNCILMAN BELL OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

RESOLVED THAT W.CORWIN TUTHILL, RIVERHEAD, BE AND HE IS HEREBY RE-APPOINTED A MEMBER OF THE TOWN PLANNING BOARD, FOR A FIVE YEAR TERM COMMENCING JANUARY 1, 1960.

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PURSUANT TO SECTION 284 OF THE HIGHWAY LAW, THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS SUBMITTED AN "AGREEMENT FOR THE EXPENDITURES OF HIGHWAY MONEYS" FOR THE YEAR 1960, AND SAID "AGREEMENT" WAS APPROVED BY THE TOWN BOARD SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS.

A COMMUNICATION DATED JANUARY 3, 1960 FROM EMMA GROUT, 636 NORTHVILLE TURNPIKE, RIVERHEAD, WAS READ TO THE BOARD COMPLAINING ABOUT THE NUISANCES CAUSED BY DOGS THAT ARE ALLOWED TO RUN LOOSE.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT THIS MATTER BE GIVEN CONSIDERATION WITH THE POSSIBILITY OF ENACTING A DOG ORDINANCE. MATTER REFERRED TO THE TOWN ATTORNEY.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED JANUARY 2, 1960 WAS RECEIVED FROM THE PLANNING BOARD STATING THAT PUBLIC HEARINGS HAD BEEN HELD ON THE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR "REQUIREMENTS FOR THE APPROVAL OF SUBDIVISION PLATS IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, NEW YORK" AND FOR "GENERAL RULE OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD PLANNING BOARD PRESCRIBING CONDITIONS AND LIMITATIONS TO BE APPLIED TO OPEN DEVELOPMENT AREAS ESTABLISHED WITHIN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD BY THE TOWN BOARD" AND REQUESTING THAT THE TOWN BOARD APPROVE AFORESAID RULES AND REGULATIONS, SO THAT THE PLANNING BOARD MIGHT ADOPT SAME.

A COMMUNICATION DATED JANUARY 2, 1960 WAS RECEIVED FROM THE RIVERHEAD TOWN PLANNING BOARD STATING THAT THEY HAVE FIXED THE AMOUNT OF \$9,000.00 FOR A PERFORMANCE BOND TO RUN FOR 2 YEARS, TO INSURE THE COMPLETION OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF ROADS IN A SUBDIVISION, DESIGNATED AS "ROANOKE HOMES", SEC.1, BEING DEVELOPED BY NADEL BUILDING CORP., 999 FLANDERS ROAD, RIVERHEAD, N.Y.

COMMUNICATION ORDERED FILED.

AN INVENTORY-RECEIPT OF TOWN MACHINERY AS OF DECEMBER 31, 1959, PREPARED AND SIGNED BY FORMER SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS, MYRON C. YOUNG, ALSO SIGNED BY HIS SUCCESSOR, THADDEUS ZEMBKO, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD.

WHEREAS NO PROVISION WAS MADE IN THE BUDGET, RECENTLY APPROVED BY THE TOWN BOARD, FOR THE COMPENSATION OF THE DEPUTY TOWN SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS, AND

WHEREAS THIS BOARD HAS BEEN INFORMED BY THADDEUS ZEMBKO, SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS, THAT THE DEPUTY SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS, WHO SERVES AT THE PLEASURE OF THE SAID SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS, HAS BEEN RELIEVED FROM HIS OFFICE, AND

WHEREAS SAID SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS EXPRESSES, TO THE BOARD, HIS DESIRE TO PERFORM THE FUNCTIONS OF HIS OFFICE WITHOUT THE SERVICES OF A DEPUTY,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE OFFICE OF DEPUTY TOWN SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS, HERETOFORE ESTABLISHED BY THIS BOARD, BE AND THE SAME IS HEREBY ABOLISHED.

A COMMUNICATION DATED DECEMBER 29, 1959 FROM JOSEPH W. HALPER, DIRECTOR OF RECREATION, OCEANSIDE PUBLIC SCHOOLS, WAS READ TO THE BOARD COMMENDING OUR RECREATION DIRECTOR KENNETH ROWLAND FOR HIS FINE RESEARCH WORK ON BEHALF OF THE COMMUNITY OF OCEANSIDE, WHILE MR. ROWLAND WAS A GRADUATE STUDENT OF NEW YORK UNIVERSITY.

STATEMENT OF TAX COLLECTIONS DATED JANUARY 4, 1960 FROM CHARLES ALLEN HORTON, TAX RECEIVER, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND ORDERED PLACED ON FILE.

COUNCILMAN BELL OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

RESOLVED THAT J. HARRY BROWN, RIVERHEAD, BE AND HE IS HEREBY APPOINTED LOCAL TOWN HISTORIAN TO SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE BOARD WITHOUT ANY COMPENSATION.

RESOLVED THAT CHIEF OF POLICE STEPHEN J. GRODSKI, BE AND HE IS HEREBY APPOINTED "BINGO ENFORCEMENT OFFICER", WITHOUT ANY EXTRA COMPENSATION.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, ABSENT, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

A COMMUNICATION FROM KENNETH H. TAYLOR, RIVERHEAD, WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD RELATIVE TO CHILDREN ICE SKATING ON THE DRAINAGE BASIN SITUATE BETWEEN LINDA AVENUE AND BROAD AVENUE, AQUEBOGUE.

MR. TAYLOR STATED THAT THE DRAINAGE BASIN WAS RECENTLY POSTED WITH NO TRESPASS SIGNS BY THE CHIEF OF POLICE, BUT IN HIS OPINION THIS BASIN COULD SAFELY BE USED BY THE CHILDREN IN THE AREA FOR ICE SKATING WHEN IT WAS FROZEN.

IT WAS THE CONSENSUS OF THE BOARD THAT THIS BASIN MIGHT BE USED FOR ICE SKATING PROVIDED THE USE THEREOF WAS SUPERVISED BY A MALE ADULT AT ALL TIMES.

RESOLVED THAT ALL PRIOR YOUTH AND/OR RECREATION COMMISSIONS HERETOFORE ESTABLISHED ARE ABOLISHED AND THE TERMS OF APPOINTMENT

OF MEMBERS THEREOF, SERVING AT THE PLEASURE OF THE TOWN BOARD, ARE HEREBY TERMINATED, AND

RESOLVED THAT PURSUANT TO THE TOWN LAW AND SECTIONS 95 AND 243 OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW, THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD DOES HEREBY ESTABLISH THE "RIVERHEAD RECREATION COMMISSION", SAID COMMISSION TO CONSIST OF FIVE PERSONS WHO ARE RESIDENTS OF SAID TOWN TO SERVE FOR TERMS OF FIVE YEARS OR UNTIL THEIR SUCCESSORS ARE APPOINTED, EXCEPT THAT THE MEMBERS OF SUCH COMMISSION FIRST APPOINTED SHALL BE APPOINTED FOR SUCH TERMS THAT THE TERM OF ONE COMMISSIONER SHALL EXPIRE ANNUALLY THEREAFTER, AND FURTHER

RESOLVED THAT THEREUNDER THE FIRST APPOINTMENTS SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS:

MARY FAIRLEY IS HEREBY APPOINTED FOR A TERM OF FIVE YEARS, COMMENCING JANUARY 1, 1960.

JOHN H. BENEDICT IS HEREBY APPOINTED FOR A TERM OF FOUR YEARS, COMMENCING JANUARY 1, 1960.

RITA SIMANDL IS HEREBY APPOINTED FOR A TERM OF THREE YEARS, COMMENCING JANUARY 1, 1960.

ROBERT BURNS IS HEREBY APPOINTED FOR A TERM OF TWO YEARS, COMMENCING JANUARY 1, 1960.

LAURENCE F. SCUDDER IS HEREBY APPOINTED FOR A TERM OF ONE YEAR, COMMENCING JANUARY 1, 1960.

THAT THE MEMBERS OF SUCH COMMISSION SHALL SERVE WITHOUT PAY.

THAT THE OBJECT OF THE COMMISSION IS TO ADVISE, PLAN AND AID IN ORGANIZING A YEAR ROUND RECREATION PROGRAM FOR ALL RESIDENTS OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD UNDER THE AUTHORITY GRANTED BY THE TOWN BOARD, AND FOR THE PURPOSE OF COORDINATING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE ACTIVITIES OF PUBLIC AND PRIVATE AGENCIES DEVOTED IN WHOLE OR IN PART TO THE WELFARE AND PROTECTION OF YOUTH.
