COUNCILMAN STOTZKY REPORTED THAT MR. ALBERT P. WARNER HAS OFFER-  
ED TO THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD A TRIANGULAR PARCEL OF LAND, BOUNDED  
WEST BY DALY DRIVE, SOUTH BY FURTHER LANE AND NORTHEASTERLY BY  
MEADOW LANE. THE ACCEPTANCE OF THIS OFFER WAS REFERRED TO THE  
PLANNING BOARD FOR THEIR RECOMMENDATION.

JUSTICE PIKE OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

RESOLVED THAT ATTORNEY SETH A. HUBBARD BE AND HE IS HEREBY RETAINED AS SPECIAL ATTORNEY RELATIVE TO:

1. IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION FOR A REVIEW UNDER ARTICLE 7 OF THE REAL PROPERTY TAX LAW OF A TAX ASSESSMENT BY THE SAMUEL AND JULIA BERNSTEIN FOUNDATION, PETITIONER - AGAINST - BOARD OF ASSESSORS OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, SUFFOLK COUNTY, NEW YORK, RESPONDENT.

2. IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION FOR A REVIEW UNDER ARTICLE 7 OF THE REAL PROPERTY TAX LAW OF A TAX ASSESSMENT BY NORTHVILLE DOCK CORPORATION, PETITIONER - AGAINST - BOARD OF ASSESSORS OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, SUFFOLK COUNTY, NEW YORK, RESPONDENT.

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE ZALOGA.

WHEREAS, THE CERTIFICATES OF DEPOSIT OF THE GENERAL REPAIRS ITEM No. 1 HIGHWAY ACCOUNT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$25,000.00 AND OF THE TOWN HIGHWAY GARAGE ACCOUNT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$6,800.00 DEPOSITED AT THE SUFFOLK COUNTY NATIONAL BANK, RIVERHEAD, N.Y., AND THE GENERAL TOWN ACCOUNT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$39,500.00 DEPOSITED IN THE FRANKLIN NATIONAL BANK, RIVERHEAD, N.Y., WILL MATURE ON THE 20TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1960 AND

WHEREAS, THE FUNDS OF THESE DEPOSITS ARE NEEDED TO MEET CURRENT OPERATING COSTS, BE IT THEREFORE,

RESOLVED, THAT THE SUPERVISOR IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO REDEEM THESE CERTIFICATES OF DEPOSITS AND THAT THE PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST BE DEPOSITED IN THE RESPECTIVE ACCOUNTS.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

COUNCILMAN BELL READ AND SUBMITTED FOR THE RECORD THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT CONCERNING THE DREDGING OF EAST CREEK, THE PURCHASE OF THE STARK-TUTHILL PROPERTY, AND THE ADDITIONAL PURCHASE OF THE ADJACENT CONKLIN PARCEL:

"IN CONSULTING NUMEROUS VOTERS IN THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, IN REFERENCE TO THE DREDGING OF EAST CREEK AND THE PURCHASE OF ADJACENT LAND TO THIS CREEK, I FOUND THAT THERE WAS AN OBJECTION BY MANY TO THE EXPENDITURE OF MONEY FOR THIS PURPOSE. MOST OF THEM FELT THAT IF SUCH A PROJECT IS TO BE INITIATED, IT SHOULD INCLUDE NO MORE THAN THE \$15,000 PURCHASE OF THE "STARK-TUTHILL" PROPERTY, AND, ONLY IF IMPERATIVE, THE ADDITION OF A RIGHT-OF-WAY THROUGH THE "CONKLIN" PARCEL. THE MAJORITY OF THOSE I APPROACHED FELT THAT THE \$27,000 PURCHASE OF THE TWO PARCELS WOULD BE AN ESPECIALLY FOOLISH VENTURE IF THE TAXPAYER IS PRESSED INTO PAYING ADDITIONAL TAX DOLLARS FOR DREDGING A "HOLE IN THE MEADOW" AT EAST CREEK, WHEN AT NO TIME WILL THERE BE PLANS TO IMPROVE THIS PROPERTY SO THAT IT CAN HOPE TO PAY FOR ALL OR ANY PORTION OF ITS OWN WAY AS A USEFUL MARINA.

AS THE PROJECT IS OUTLINED NOW, THIS DREDGED AREA IN JAMESPORT OFFERS LITTLE TO THE BOAT OWNERS OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD. I FEEL THAT OUR VOTERS WOULD BE MORE IN FAVOR OF USING TAX DOLLARS FOR OTHER NEEDED IMPROVEMENTS IN OUR TOWN SUCH AS ADDITIONAL PARKING, THE BETTERMENT OF PRESENT BEACH PROPERTIES, OR THE ACQUISITION OF ADDITIONAL BEACH PROPERTY.

IF PLANS FOR THE USE OF THE EAST CREEK AREA SHOULD BE ALTERED TO INCLUDE A PROJECT WHICH WILL FORWARD A CALENDAR OF SCHEDULED IMPROVEMENT OF THIS AREA, SO THAT IN TIME IT WILL BECOME A MARINA WHICH WILL ANSWER THE NEEDS OF THE MANY BOAT OWNERS WHO LIVE IN OUR TOWN, I WOULD FAVOR SUCH A PROPOSAL IF IT MEETS WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MAJORITY OF THE VOTERS OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD BY MEANS OF A REFERENDUM. I FEEL THAT:

1. THE NEWSPAPER RELEASES, WHICH PRECEDED THE ADVERTISEMENT FOR A PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM ON THE EAST CREEK DREDGING PLAN, FAILED TO PRESENT THE WHOLE PICTURE OF THE PROJECT TO THE PUBLIC.
2. I APPROVE OF THE PURCHASE OF THE 17 ACRE "STARK-TUTHILL" PARCEL FOR THE SUM OF \$15,000. IN RETURN FOR THIS INVESTMENT, THE COUNTY WILL DREDGE A 300' X 1500' SHELTER FOR BOATS IN EAST

CREEK. BECAUSE WE SUPPORT THIS INITIAL PLAN, THE COUNTY WILL ALSO DREDGE THE PECONIC RIVER, WHICH IS OUR PRIMARY OBJECTIVE.

3. I CANNOT APPROVE OF THE EXPENDITURE OF AN ADDITIONAL \$12,000 FOR THE "CONKLIN" TRACT OF LAND UNLESS A PLAN FOR IMPROVING THIS DREDGED AREA AS A MARINA IS PRESENTED TO AND APPROVED BY THE MAJORITY OF THE VOTERS OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD IN A REFERENDUM.

TO SUM IT UP, I FEEL THAT \$15,000 IS A GOOD INVESTMENT, BUT AN EXPENDITURE OF \$27,000 WOULD BE POOR JUDGEMENT."

STATEMENT ORDERED FILED.

JUSTICE PIKE REPLIED TO COUNCILMAN BELL AS FOLLOWS:

"FIRST, SOME OF YOUR FACTS ARE WRONG.

SECOND, IF YOU FELT THAT THE ADVERTISEMENTS AND NEWSPAPER STORY RELATIVE TO THE PERMISSIVE REFERENDUM ON THE EAST CREEK DREDGING PLAN WERE IMPROPER OR FAILED TO PRESENT THE WHOLE PICTURE, WHY DIDN'T YOU SAY SO AT THAT TIME.

THIRD, YOU APPEARED ON TELEVISION LAST FALL AND STATED THAT WE SHOULD HAVE BETTER PARK AND RECREATION FACILITIES IN THE TOWN. WE HAVE TALKED IN GENERALITIES ABOUT BETTER PARK AND RECREATION FACILITIES. HERE IS A SPECIFIC ITEM AND AN OPPORTUNITY TO GET A GOOD PARK AND HARBOR FOR THE TOWN AND YOU OPPOSE IT.

FOURTH, THE COST OF THIS PROJECT TODAY IS \$27,000. IT COULD EASILY BE \$35,000. IN TWO YEARS OR \$50,000. IN TEN YEARS. WE ARE BEING SHORTSIGHTED NOT TO PURCHASE BOTH PARCELS NOW.

I AM GLAD TO HAVE COUNCILMAN BELL'S STATEMENT ON THE RECORDS. OVER A PERIOD OF TIME, WE WILL SEE THAT THIS HAS BEEN A GOOD INVESTMENT."

COUNCILMAN STOTZKY OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN BELL.

WHEREAS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SNOW REMOVAL DURING THE EARLY PART OF THE PRESENT YEAR, EXTRA EXPENSES WERE INCURRED IN THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, AND

WHEREAS THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD HAS REQUESTED THE TOWN BOARD TO AUTHORIZE THE BORROWING OF MONEY TO FINANCE SAID EXTRA EXPENSES,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. THAT THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD FOR THE SPECIFIC PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FOR PAYMENT OF EXPENSES FOR THE REMOVAL OF SNOW AND ICE HERETOFORE OR HEREAFTER TO BE INCURRED, PURSUANT TO SECTION 29.00 OF THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW, DOES HEREBY AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF ITS BUDGET NOTE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$7600.00 DOLLARS, TO FINANCE SUCH COST AND EXPENSES.

2. SUCH NOTE SHALL BE DATED APPROXIMATELY OCTOBER 5, 1960, AND

THE POWER TO FIX AND DETERMINE THE EXACT DATE OF SUCH NOTE IS HEREBY DELEGATED TO THE SUPERVISOR. SUCH NOTE SHALL BE NUMBERED 1 AND SHALL MATURE IN THE YEAR 1961. THE POWER TO FIX AND DETERMINE THE DATE UPON WHICH SUCH NOTE SHALL BECOME DUE AND PAYABLE IS ALSO DELEGATED TO THE SUPERVISOR.

3. SUCH NOTE SHALL BE ISSUED IN BEARER FORM, SHALL NOT CONTAIN A POWER TO CONVERT TO REGISTERED FORM, AND SHALL BEAR INTEREST AT A RATE NOT EXCEEDING 3% PER ANNUM PAYABLE ANNUALLY.

4. SUCH NOTE SHALL BE IN SUBSTANTIALLY THE FOLLOWING FORM:

THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, IN THE COUNTY OF SUFFOLK, A MUNICIPALITY OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGES ITSELF INDEBTED AND FOR VALUE RECEIVED PROMISES TO PAY TO THE BEARER OF THIS NOTE THE SUM OF

, ON THE 5TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1961, TOGETHER WITH INTEREST THEREON FROM THE DATE HEREOF AT THE RATE OF TWO (2%) PER CENTUM PER ANNUM, PAYABLE AT MATURITY. BOTH PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THIS NOTE WILL BE PAID IN LAWFUL MONEY OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AT THE OFFICE OF THE FRANKLIN NATIONAL BANK, RIVERHEAD, NEW YORK.

THIS NOTE MAY NOT BE CONVERTED TO REGISTERED FORM.

THIS NOTE IS THE ONLY NOTE OF AN AUTHORIZED ISSUE IN THE AMOUNT OF

THIS NOTE IS ISSUED PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF A RESOLUTION DULY ADOPTED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD ON OCTOBER 4TH, 1960.

THE FAITH AND CREDIT OF SUCH TOWN OF RIVERHEAD ARE HEREBY IRREVOCABLY PLEDGED FOR THE PRINCIPAL PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THIS NOTE ACCORDING TO ITS TERMS.

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED AND RECITED THAT ALL CONDITIONS, ACTS AND THINGS REQUIRED BY THE CONSTITUTION AND STATUTES OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK TO EXIST, TO HAVE HAPPENED AND TO HAVE BEEN PERFORMED PRECEDENT TO AND IN THE ISSUANCE OF THIS NOTE, EXIST, HAVE HAPPENED AND HAVE BEEN PERFORMED, AND THAT THIS NOTE, TOGETHER WITH ALL OTHER INDEBTEDNESS OF SUCH TOWN OF RIVERHEAD IS WITHIN EVERY DEBT AND OTHER LIMIT PRESCRIBED BY THE CONSTITUTION AND LAWS OF SUCH STATE.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, NEW YORK, HAS CAUSED THIS NOTE TO BE SIGNED BY ITS SUPERVISOR, AND ITS CORPORATE SEAL TO BE HEREUNTO AFFIXED AND ATTESTED BY ITS TOWN CLERK AND THIS NOTE TO BE DATED AS OF THE 5TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1960.

5. THE SUPERVISOR IS HEREBY DELEGATED THE POWER TO PREPARE SUCH NOTE AND TO SELL SUCH NOTE AT PRIVATE SALE AT NOT LESS THAN PAR AND ACCRUED INTEREST, AND AT SUCH SALE TO FIX THE INTEREST RATE TO BE BORNE BY SUCH NOTE WITHIN THE LIMITATIONS SET FORTH IN THIS RESOLUTION.

6. THE SUPERVISOR SHALL DELIVER SUCH NOTE TO THE PURCHASER THEREOF ONLY AGAINST CASH OR CERTIFIED CHECK. THE PROCEEDS OF SALE OF THE NOTE SHALL BE DEPOSITED IN A SPECIAL BANK ACCOUNT AND EXPENDED ONLY FOR THE OBJECT OR PURPOSE FOR WHICH SUCH NOTE WAS ISSUED AS REQUIRED BY SECTION 165.00 OF THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW.

7. THE FAITH AND CREDIT OF SAID TOWN ARE HEREBY IRREVOCABLY PLEDGED FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST OF SUCH NOTE AND AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT TO PAY SUCH NOTE AND THE INTEREST THEREON SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE NEXT ANNUAL BUDGET OF SAID TOWN.

8. THIS RESOLUTION SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.

RESOLVED THAT NECESSARY EXPENSES INCURRED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF HIGHWAYS WHILE ATTENDING A MEETING OF THE NEW YORK STATE ASSOCIATION OF HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENTS AT NIAGARA FALLS ON SEPTEMBER 21, 22, 23, 1960, BE, AND THEY ARE HEREBY APPROVED FOR PAYMENT FROM THE HIGHWAY FUND.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

JUSTICE ZALOGA OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY JUSTICE PIKE.

RESOLVED THAT THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD DOES, AND IT HEREBY APPROVES, AN "AGREEMENT FOR USE OF ARMORY UNDER SECTION 183, MILITARY LAW", DATED SEPTEMBER 12, 1960, SAID STATE ARMORY BEING SITUATE AT 1045 OLD COUNTY ROAD, RIVERHEAD, N.Y., FOR USE AS A "TEEN-CENTER-GAMES AND DANCES AND DOG OBEDIENCE COURSES",

FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE SUPERVISOR BE AND HE IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED, TO SIGN SAID AGREEMENT IN BEHALF OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD.

THE VOTE---COUNCILMAN BELL, YES, COUNCILMAN STOTZKY, YES, JUSTICE PIKE, YES, JUSTICE ZALOGA, YES, AND SUPERVISOR LEONARD, YES. THE RESOLUTION WAS THEREUPON DECLARED DULY ADOPTED.

JUSTICE PIKE OFFERED THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WHICH WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN STOTZKY.

CAPITAL NOTE RESOLUTION

WHEREAS THIS TOWN BOARD DID BY PREVIOUS RESOLUTION APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF APPROXIMATELY 17 ACRES OF LAND AT EAST CREEK, JAMESPORT, IN SAID TOWN AND PROVIDE THEREIN FOR THE FINANCING OF SAME BY THE ISSUANCE OF A CAPITAL NOTE NOT EXCEEDING THE SUM OF \$15,000,

Now, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. THAT THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, FOR THE SPECIFIC PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FOR PAYMENT OF PURCHASE PRICE OF SAID LAND PURSUANT TO SECTION 28.00 OF THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW DOES HEREBY AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF ITS CAPITAL NOTES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$15,000.00, TO FINANCE SUCH COST AND EXPENSES.

2. SUCH NOTES SHALL BE DATED APPROXIMATELY OCTOBER 8, 1960, AND THE POWER TO FIX AND DETERMINE THE EXACT DATE OF SUCH NOTES IS DELEGATED TO THE SUPERVISOR. SUCH CAPITAL NOTES SHALL BE NUMBERED 1 AND 2 AND SHALL MATURE IN NUMERICAL ORDER IN TWO EQUAL INSTALLMENTS IN THE YEARS 1961 AND 1962 RESPECTIVELY.
