

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, December 17, 1957 at 9:30 A.M.

Minutes of the meeting of the Town Board held on December 3, 1957, were submitted to the Board and on motion made by Councilman Benedict and seconded by Justice Stark, it was Resolved that the minutes be approved as submitted.

Statement of Tax Collections from the Receiver of Taxes, Charles Allen Horton, dated December 16, 1957, was read to the Board. Communication ordered placed on file.

Election Inspectors report of the annual election of officers for the Riverhead Fire District held on December 3, 1957, was submitted to the Board. Report indicated that Hubert F. Corwin was elected Fire Commissioner and Harry G. Penny was elected Fire District Treasurer.

Report ordered filed.

Election Inspectors report of the annual election of officers for the Jamesport Fire District held on December 3, 1957, was submitted to the Board. Report indicated that Leo Mitchell was elected Fire Commissioner and Stanley Franzik was elected Fire District Treasurer.

Report ordered filed.

Election Inspectors report of the annual election of officers for the Wading River Fire District held on December 3, 1957, was submitted to the Board. Report indicated that Edwin S. Lapham was elected Fire Commissioner and Paul L. Guyder was elected Fire District Treasurer.

Report ordered filed.

A letter dated December 10, 1957 from William J. Danowski, was read to the Board whereby he tendered his resignation as Police Patrolman of the Riverhead Town Police Department.

Justice Pike offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Stark.

RESOLVED that the resignation of William J. Danowski be accepted with regret and the Town Clerk be instructed to write a letter of appreciation to Patrolman Danowski for the fine service he has rendered the Town as a Patrolman.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A letter dated December 4, 1957 from the State Traffic Commission was read to the Board relative to the installation of portable school signs at the Aquebogue, Calverton and Jamesport Schools.

The Commission turned down the request for the installation of a portable school sign in front of the Calverton School.

Whereas the Calverton School Organization had initiated the request for this sign in front of its School, the Town Clerk was instructed to notify them of the decision of the State Traffic Commission.

Communication ordered filed.

Justice Pike offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Stark.

RESOLVED that Solomon Raffé, John Fafinski, Jr., Alfred Grossklaus, Shirley G. Smith, Patricia Tormey, Harold E. Burns, Jr., John Kobylenski, Malcolm Stewart, Charles Jehle, Lee Ellwood and Joseph Ogeka be and they are hereby appointed members of the Riverhead Town Zoning Commission, to make a preliminary report on a proposed zoning ordinance for the Town of Riverhead, including regulations, restrictions and boundaries; to hold public hearings on such preliminary report, and to submit a final report to this Town Board after holding such public hearings.

FURTHER RESOLVED that Solomon Raffé be and he is hereby appointed Chairman of this Zoning Commission.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A letter dated December 11, 1957 from Congressman Wainwright, was read to the Board as follows:

"I am informed that there will be no action by the House Armed Services Committee on the Grumman matter until after the Congress convenes in January." End.
Communication ordered filed.

A letter dated December 3, 1957 from the Suffolk County Dept. of Health was read to the Board relative to the procedure for issuing permits by the Health Department for the collection and disposal of offensive material.

Communication ordered filed.

A letter dated December 6, 1957 from the Suffolk County Dept. of Health was read to the Board relative to tentative standards for construction of individual water supply systems.

Communication ordered filed.

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Justice Stark offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Pike.

RESOLVED that Mrs. Eva Kapfer be and she is hereby appointed a clerk in the office of the Tax Receiver, to be compensated at the rate of \$8.00 per day, retroactive to December 6, 1957.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A petition signed by many residents of Wading River was submitted to the Board, whereby they requested that additional street lights be installed in Wildwood Acres, Wading River.

Supervisor Leonard also mentioned that he had a request for improved street lighting at the parking field across from the Catholic Church in Wading River and on Hill Street, pole #6, off of Sound Road in Wading River.

Justice Stark offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Benedict.

RESOLVED that the Long Island Lighting Company be authorized to make a survey for additional street lighting in Wildwood Acres, Wading River; for improved street lighting at the parking field across from the Catholic Church in Wading River; and for a street light on Hill Street, pole #6, off of Sound Road in Wading River, all in the Wading River Light District.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga; Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Benedict.

RESOLVED that Joseph Pipeczynski be and he is hereby appointed a Police Patrolman of the Town of Riverhead, on a provisional basis, subject to the rules and regulations of the Suffolk County Civil Service Commission, salary fixed at the rate of \$4000 per annum, payable semi-monthly, effective January 1, 1958.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

After being duly advertized, sealed bids for two (2) 1958 cars for use of the Police Department were opened as follows, on Wednesday, December 11, 1957 at 10 A.M.:

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Benedict.

RESOLVED that the bid for two (2) 1958 Police Cars be and it is hereby awarded to Island Motors, Riverhead, N.Y., in the amount of \$2413.84, as per their bid and specification form submitted.

FURTHER RESOLVED that an additional \$50.00 be paid to Island Motors for optional Police Pack units as stated on their bid and specification form.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A map and preliminary plan was submitted by Eugene R. Romano, regarding proposed dedication for highway purposes of Oakland Drive, North, West and South, Grove Street and Andrea Court.

The Town Board gave its preliminary approval to this plan. Final approval subject to usual regulations, now in effect for the dedication of highways.

At 10 A.M. Notice of Public Hearing regarding consent of John Archambault, doing business as Quinn's Bus Line, to operate a motor bus line on and along certain highways in the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, N.Y., was read to the Board.

Supervisor Leonard thereupon declared the Hearing open and anyone who wished could be heard at this time.

No one having appeared for or against this consent, Supervisor Leonard declared the Hearing closed.

Councilman Benedict offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Stark.

WHEREAS notice having been duly given and Public Hearing having been duly held and no one appearing in opposition thereto, now therefore, be it

RESOLVED that a franchise be granted to John Archambault, doing business as Quinn's Bus Line upon the payment of the franchise fee of \$25.00 for the first year.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Councilman Benedict offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Pike.

RESOLVED, that Supervisor, William J. Leonard, shall furnish an official undertaking in the amount of Forty Thousand (\$40,000) Dollars, for General Town Funds, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board approved the undertaking No. B-356063, William J. Leonard, principal, and the Great American Indemnity Company, surety, in the sum of Forty Thousand (\$40,000) Dollars, for General Town Funds, and it is further

RESOLVED, that a copy of this bond be filed with the Suffolk County Clerk.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Pike offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Zaloga.

RESOLVED, that Superintendent of Highways, Myron C. Young, shall furnish an official undertaking in the amount of Two Thousand (\$2,000) Dollars, and it is further

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RESOLVED, that the Town Board approves the undertaking No. B-350717-58, Myron C. Young, Superintendent of Highways, principal, and the Great American Indemnity Company, surety, in the sum of Two Thousand (\$2,000) Dollars, and it is further

RESOLVED, that a copy of this bond be filed with the Suffolk County Clerk.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Pike offered the following resolution which was seconded by Councilman Benedict.

RESOLVED, that Town Clerk, Anthony F. Gadzinski, shall furnish an official undertaking in the amount of One Thousand (\$1,000) Dollars, and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board approves the undertaking No. 113995, Anthony F. Gadzinski, Town Clerk, principal, and the Globe Indemnity Company, surety, in the amount of One Thousand (\$1,000) Dollars, and it is further

RESOLVED, that a copy of this bond be filed with the Suffolk County Clerk.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A letter dated December 10, 1957 from Kathryn M. McCollom was read to the Board regarding an increase in the rental fee for property owned by her and rented to the Town.

It was the consensus of the Board that the rental fee should not be increased and that an attempt be made to acquire this property by outright purchase.

Matter referred to Supervisor Leonard.

Justice Zaloga offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Pike.

RESOLVED that the Town Board meet on ~~Saturday~~ December 28th, 1957, at 9:30 A.M. for the purpose of the Annual Audit.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Pike offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Stark.

RESOLVED that the advertisement for bids for steel for a boat landing ramp at the Iron Pier Beach be advanced to a later date.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Pike offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Stark.

RESOLVED that the Town Clerk advertise for sealed bids for the

construction of a wooden bulkhead on Peconic River, in "Grangebel Park" at Riverhead. These bids to be returnable up to 11 A.M. on Tuesday, January 7, 1958.

Plans and specifications for this bulkheading to be drawn by Alden W. Young.

The Vote---Justices Stark, Pike and Zaloga, Yes; Councilman Benedict, Yes; and Supervisor Leonard, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town Bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town---\$7,564.73 and Machinery Fund---\$2,125.19. On motion and vote, it was Resolved that the bills be approved as rendered.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Saturday, December 28, 1957 at 9:30 A.M.
