

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, March 15, 1955 at 10:00 A.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on March 1, 1955, were submitted and on motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik, it was Resolved that the minutes be approved as submitted. The Vote--- Justices Leonard, Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The resolution was thereupon dedared duly adopted.

A communication dated March 1, 1955 was read from Jehn T. O'Neill, Colonel, Cerps of Engineers, U. S. Army, concerning the application for a Department of the Army permit by the Northville Deck Corporation to install submarine pipe lines, ship mooring buoys and to construct a pier in Long Island Sound near Riverhead and advising that as the proposed work is not considered inimical to the interests of general navigation and the regimen of the waterway, a Department of the Army permit has been issued under authority of the Secretary of the Army by the District Engineer on March 1, 1955. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On metion made by Justice Pike and seconded by Justice Leonard it was RESOLVED that the Town Clerk be instructed to write to the appropriate State Departments again veicing the opposition of the Town of Riverhead to the proposed oil terminus within the Town of Riverhead on Long Island Sound, ^{namely the Northville Deck Corporation}. The Vote--- Justices Leonard, Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Supervisor's Report for the month of February 1955 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

A communication was read to the Board from Pierre G. Lundberg, Secretary, Riverhead Yacht Club requesting the Town Board to take action on the following resolution passed at the annual meeting of the Club: "WHEREAS, the Town of Riverhead has recently acquired a large parking place on the north side of Peconic River just east of Peconic Avenue and bordering on Peconic River; and WHEREAS, said River is becoming an increasingly popular waterway and during at least eight months of the year is frequented by work and pleasure boats from all over Long Island and neighboring states; and WHEREAS, said Riverhead has been

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unimproved by way of bulkheading and like improvements for many years; and WHEREAS, said River is most valuable natural asset to the Town of Riverhead; NOW, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Riverhead Yacht Club, at its annual meeting held at the Court Restaurant on February 24, 1955, petition the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead to bulkhead and improve the north side of Peconic River along the frontage acquired by the said Town as a parking place. " The communication was ordered placed on file and the Town Clerk instructed to write Pierre Lundberg that the matter will be given careful consideration.

A communication was read from the director of the New York State Traffic Commission advising that a check is being made of conditions relative to Stop Sign on Court Street at its intersection with Route 25. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Director of the New York State Traffic Commission advising that a check of conditions is being initiated on the erection of No U Turn signs on Route 25, between Osborne Avenue and Ostrander Avenue. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Proof of Publication of Notice of Public Hearing on the purchase of one (1) 5-8 Ton Tandem Roller for the Highway Department was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Kelly thereupon declared the Hearing open and anyone who wished could be heard at that time.

No one wishing to be heard, the Hearing was thereupon declared closed.

The bids were referred to M. C. Young, Supt. of Highways, Alden W. Young and the Town Attorney.

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On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was RESOLVED that the Town of Riverhead purchase for the Riverhead Town Highway Department one (1) 5-8 Ton Tandem Roller for a cost of \$4,716.00 from George Malvese & Co., Inc., New Hyde Park, N.Y. The Vote---Justifies Leonard, Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read from Dewey Lewin in Baiting Hollow enclosing maps for certain road dedications situate on his property in Wading River. The matter was referred to the Planning Board.

Extensive reports were submitted from Gerdon K. Ahlers, Inspector for enforcement of Town Ordinance #21 relative to unsafe structures and fire hazards in the Town of Riverhead, namely the Yetter & Moore Building, the Farmers Market Building on West Main Street and the Peconic Bay House in South Jamesport. The matter was referred to the Town Attorney.

The bids were referred to the Superintendent of Highways and the Town Attorney.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Pike it was Resolved that the bid of the Welch Asphalt Company, Riverhead, N.Y. be accepted for the MC-1, MC-2 and RC-2 road oil, amount 200,000 gallons, at a cost of .1020 per gallon for the Year 1955, pursuant to specifications outlined by Myron C. Young,

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Superintendent of Highways. The Vote---Justices Leonard, Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills to date, the total of which was as follows: General Town Fund---\$2,685.29 and Highway Machinery Fund---\$3,752.05. On motion and vote it was resolved that the bills be approved as rendered.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Tuesday, April 5, 1955 at 10:00 A.M.
