

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, August 2, 1955 at 10:00 A.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on July 19, 1955 were submitted and on motion made by Justice Pike and seconded by Justice Yousik, it was Resolved that the minutes be adopted as submitted. The Vote---Justices Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Leonard, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read to the Board from Warren H. Gilman, Assistant Attorney General, N.Y. State Department of Law, Albany, N.Y. indicating that the Standing Committee of the Board of Commissioners of the Land Office will hold a hearing on the remonstrance of the Town of Riverhead against the application of the Northville Dock Corporation for a grant of easement for a pier, submarine pipe lines and buoy ship mooring on land under water in Long Island Sound at Riverhead, Suffolk County, on Thursday, August 4, 1955, at 11 a.m. in the office of Warren H. Gilman, Asst. Att. General, Room 490, 80 Centre St. N.Y. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Mrs. Dorothy L. Matthews of Sound Shore Road, Riverhead, owner of property on the East side of the Northville Dock Corporation appeared before the Board and mentioned that her Attorney was going to appear at this hearing in opposition to the granting of the application.

On motion made by Justice Pike and seconded by Justice Yousik, it was Resolved that Oliver Hubbard, Town Attorney, appear against the Northville Dock Corporation on August 4, 1955 at a public hearing in the office of Warren H. Gilman, Asst. Att. General in New York City and that any other member of the Board who could avail himself be present at the above mentioned hearing, with all necessary expenses being paid. The Vote---Justices Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Leonard, Absent. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication dated July 29, 1955 was read to the Board from Sigal Realty Company, Riverhead, N.Y. indicating a desire to have

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a street sign placed at the intersection of East Main Street and McDermott Avenue. The communication was ordered placed on file and the matter referred to the Superintendent of Highways.

The Police Report for the month of July 1955 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

A letter dated July 27, 1955, was received from the Department of Agriculture and Markets indicating the excessive number of unlicensed dogs in the Town of Riverhead. It was suggested that the Justices of the Peace issue a summons to each delinquent dog owner, The Town Clerk turned over to each justice a list of delinquent owners.

A communication dated July 25th was read advising that the County Board of Supervisors passed a resolution that the County Board fixes November 28, 1955, as the date when they will levy taxes for the next fiscal year. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A letter dated July 25, 1955 was received from Attorney John O'Keefe representing George E. Hart of Wading River, N.Y.. Enclosed was check for \$6,000--as a guarantee that the roads known as Dogwood Road, Bayberry Road, Cliff Road, Old Orchard Road, Long View Road, Cedar Street, Pine Street and Peach Street, dedicated to the Town of Riverhead would be completed as per recommendations of the Superintendent of Highways and indicated in Attorney O'Keefe's letter. The Town Clerk was instructed to notify Mr. Hart to have his check certified.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Pike it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to borrow the sum of \$5,000 on a budget note for the purpose of snow removal. The Vote---Justices Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Leonard, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town Bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund---\$5787.31 and Highway Machinery Fund---\$47.84. On motion and vote it was Resolved that the bills be approved as rendered.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Tuesday, August 16, 1955 at 10:00 A.M.
