

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, January 5, 1954 at 10:00 A.M.

Henry M. Zaleski, Town Attorney, and Myron C. Young, Superintendent of Highways, were also present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on January 1, 1954 were read and on motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Pike it was Resolved that the minutes be adopted as read. The Vote, Justices Leonard, Pike and Yousik, Yes; Justice Warner, Absent; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Police Report for the month of December 1953 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

A communication dated January 2, 1954 was read from Supervisor Joseph V. Kelly certifying that he has received from Charles Allen Horton, Receiver of Taxes of the Town of Riverhead the following sums of money on account of Tax collections of the 1953-54 Tax Warrant: School District-\$102,533.18; Maintenance of Highways-\$26,500.00; Highway Machinery-\$10,920.00; Removal of Snow and Miscellaneous Purposes-\$10,313.34; Fire District-\$24,300.80; Fire Protection-\$14,000.00; and Sewer Districts-\$12,246.00. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Charles Allen Horton, Receiver of Taxes of the Town of Riverhead, submitted a report on the amount of taxes collected as of January 2, 1954; the report was ordered placed on file.

A communication dated December 29th, 1953 was read to the Board from S. Wentworth Horton, Senator, acknowledging receipt of resolution relative to the by-pass south of the Town of Riverhead, and the communication was ordered placed on file.

The report of the examination of the accounts and fiscal affairs of the Town of Riverhead was submitted to the Board together with a communication dated December 28, 1953 from Ralph H. Brackett, Senior Examiner of Municipal Affairs, New York State Department of Audit and Control. The report was examined by all the officials of the Town and ordered placed on file. As per Section 35 of the General Municipal Law, the Town Clerk shall give public notice that the such report has been received and is on file for public inspection.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Pike it was Resolved that the School Attendance Supervisors be paid monthly for the ten months (school year) for which they are employed. The Vote, Justices Leonard, Pike and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Warner, Absent. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Lawyer Isidore Scheinberg of Riverhead, N.Y., owner of the piece of property situate on the Northwest corner of Griffing Avenue and Second Street, offered said property to the Town of Riverhead for parking field purposes, subject to a lease agreeable to Mr. Scheinberg and the Town Board. Mr. Scheinberg offered the following proposal for lease: three year lease which could not be cancelled by Mr. Scheinberg in the first year, but could be cancelled any time within the second or third year. In the event this lease was cancelled by Mr. Scheinberg within the first nine months of the second year, he would pay to the Town the sum of \$500. If lease was cancelled between the start of the ninth month of the second year and the end of the third year, he would pay nothing to the Town. Mr. Scheinberg agreed to remove building and the Town would fill in the cellar hole and grade the property to make it suitable for parking. The rental for said property to be \$35.00 per month, or the payment of the property taxes on said property.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Pike it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to negotiate with Mr. Isidore Scheinberg, Attorney, Riverhead, N.Y. for the lease of the property situate at the northwest corner of Griffing Avenue and Second Street for parking field purposes. The Vote, Justices Leonard, Pike and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Warner, Absent. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Proofs of Publication and affidavits of posting Notices of Public Hearings in regard to the Dissolution of Riverhead Fire protection District; Extension of Riverhead Fire District; Establishment of Aquebogue Fire Protection District; Establishment of Calverton Fire Protection District; Establishment of Roanoke Fire Protection District; Establishment of Jamesport Fire District; Establishment of Wading River Fire District and the Extension of the Manorville Fire District, were submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Kelly thereupon declared the Hearing open and anyone who wished could be heard.

Mr. John Fafinski, Chief, Jamesport Fire Department, addressed the Board and expressed a desire to extend the proposed District 250 feet West of the proposed line to include the property of Perry Conklin. The request was left to the discretion of the Board, **AND EVENTUALLY DENIED.**

No one else wishing to be heard the Hearing was thereupon declared closed.

Frank Holt, Chairman of the Board of the Directors of the Jamesport Fire Department and Dennis Tasker, representing the Manorville Fire Department, were also present.

Q. Are you well acquainted with and familiar with the persons who are residents of the area included in the proposed Manorville Fire Extension District?

A. Yes.

Q. Do you know the total assessed valuation of all taxable real property within this proposed fire extension district?

A. Yes.

Q. What is the assessed valuation?

A. \$377,390.

Q. Do you know the total assessed valuation of all taxable real property within this proposed fire extension district owned by resident taxpayers of the area to be included with the fire extension district?

A. Yes.

Q. What is that assessed valuation?

A. \$103,740.

Q. Does the total assessed valuation of the real property owned by resident taxpayers, who signed the petition aggregate at least one-half of the total assessed valuation of all the real property owned by resident taxpayers in the area to be included in this fire extension district?

A. Yes.

Q. What is the total assessed valuation of the real property owned by resident taxpayers of the area to be included within the proposed Manorville Fire Extension District who signed the petition?

A. \$63,800.

Q. Are the assessed valuations as testified to by you those shown upon the latest completed assessment roll of the Town of Riverhead at the time of the filing of the petitions?

A. Yes .
