Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, April 20, 1954 at 10:00 A.M.

Henry M. Zaleski, Town Attorney, Myron C. Young, Superintendent of Highways, Stephen J. Grodski, Police Chief, Alden W. Young, Supt. of Sewers, John Riesdorff, Asst. Supt. to Water District and Roselle Benjamin, Water Plant Superintendent, were also present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on April 6, 1954 were read and on motion made by Justice Pike and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the minutes be adopted as read. The Vote, Justices Leonard, Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Charles Allen Horton, Receiver of Taxes of the Town of Riverhead, submitted a report of the amount of taxes collected as of April 15, 1954 and also a report of the amount of penalties collected as of April 15th, 1954. The reports were ordered placed on file.

The Supervisor's Report for the month of March 1954 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Town of Riverhead Planning Board relative to the acceptance of highways through the property of Charles A. Wood at Wading River, New York, as Town Highways. The communication was ordered placed on file.

Justice Pike offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Leonard:

WHEREAS, by resolution made and adopted on March 22, 1954, the Town of Riverhead Planning Board recommended the acceptance by the Town of Riverhead as public highways, highways through the property of Charles a Wood at Wading River, New York, in the Town of Riverhead,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the recommendation of the Town of Riverhead Planning Board regarding these proposed public highways be accepted, and that said public highways be accepted by and dedicated to the Town of Riverhead at such time when the requirements as to the value of the adjacent property have been met and when the roads have been constructed all in accordance with the rules and regulations for the acceptance of highways within the Town of Riverhead. The Vote, Justices Leonard, Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Pike and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the Supervisor be empowered to employ Walter Stewart, Riverhead, N.Y., as Chief Life Guard at the Riverhead Town Beaches for the summer of 1954, subject to the rules and regulations of the Suffolk County Civil Service Commission, to be compensated at a salary of \$60.00 per week, duties and hours of employment to be determined and fixed by the Chairman of the Park and Beach Committee, Otis G. Pike. The Vote, Justices Leonard, Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the Cushman Police Motor Scooter be sold to Adam Ruthnowski for a sum of \$55.00. The Vote, Justices Leonard, Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that Inspection Officer for the Multiple Residence Law, Edward Painter, be paid a fee of \$10.00 for complete inspection of each Multiple Residence Dwelling effected by said Law. The Vote, Justices Leonard, Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Pike it was Resolved that the Assessors of the Town of Riverhead be paid travel expenses at the rate of 8 cents per mile for appraising dog damages in the Town of Riverhead. The Vote, Justices Leonard, Pike, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town--\$1,647.28 and Highways Machinery Fund--\$1505.29.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Tuesday May 4, 1954 at 10:00 A.M.
