

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, September 21, 1954 at 10:00 A.M.

Henry M. Zaleski, Town Attorney, Myron C. Young, Superintendent of Highways, Stephen J. Grodski, Police Chief, Alden W. Young, Supt. of Sewers, John Riesdorff, Asst. Supt. to Water District and Roselle Benjamin, Water Plant Superintendent, were also present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on September 7, 1954 were read and on motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the minutes be adopted as read. The Vote---Justices Leonard, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Pike, Absent. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Supervisor's Report for the month of August 1954 was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

Justice Warner made the following motion which was seconded by Justice Leonard:

Upon reading and filing the dedication dated September 16, 1954, and release dated September 21, 1954 of Joseph P. Celic and others, and duly acknowledged, dedicating and releasing the necessary lands for certain proposed town highways to be known as "Broad Avenue, Linda Avenue, Victor Street and Cove Street, be it

RESOLVED, that consent be and the same hereby is given that the Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Riverhead, make an order laying out the aforesaid Town Highways to consist of the lands described in the said dedication and release and to extend as delineated upon the map annexed to said application, all in accordance with the provisions of Section 171 of the Highway Law of the State of New York.

The Vote---Justices Leonard, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Pike, Absent. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A request was made for permission to hold a carnival on the Fairgrounds by the Polish National Alliance for two weeks commencing on June 13, 1955.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Yousik, it was Resolved that the request of the Polish National Alliance for permission to hold a carnival on the

Fairgrounds for two weeks commencing on June 13, 1955, be granted, subject to the rules and regulations governing the use of Town controlled property for bazaars, carnivals and circuses. The Town Clerk be instructed to notify the Polish National Alliance that whenever permission is granted by the Town Board to use the Fairgrounds, the sponsoring organization will be held responsible for the proper conduct of the contracting firm. If any violations are reported, the Town Board will refuse the use of the Fairgrounds to said sponsoring organization. The Vote---Justices Leonard, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Pike, Absent. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication dated September 9, 1954 was read to the Board from the Board of Trustees of Aquebogue School, District No. 8, requesting that the present sidewalk and curbing be extended on the Cedar Avenue side of the school approximately 600 feet southerly to the end of the school property. The communication was ordered placed on file and the matter referred to the Chairman of the Highway Committee and the Superintendent of Highways.

Supervisor Kelly declared the adjourned public hearing on the matter of contracts for fire protection for the Riverhead Fire Protection Districts open and anyone who wished could be heard at that time.

No one wishing to be heard, the hearing was declared closed.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the sum of \$6,000.00 be appropriated for the purpose of purchasing fire protection for the Riverhead Fire Protection Districts for the year 1955, The Vote---Justices Leonard, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Pike, Absent. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Charles A. Wood, Wading River, N.Y. appeared before the Board with an offer to dedicate to the Town of Riverhead for public streets, the streets shown on the map entitled, "Map of Streets at Wading River, Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, dated August 1954," being the lands presently owned by him.

Justice Leonard offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Yousik:

Upon the application of Charles A. Wood and upon reading and filing the deed of dedication to the Town of Riverhead by the said Charles A. Wood dated September 17th, 1954, duly acknowledged, dedicating and releasing the necessary lands for the proposed Town Highways connecting North Country Road and North Wading River Road, at Wading River, Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, and bounded and described as follows:

ALL those certain plots, pieces or parcels of land, situate, lying and being in the Town of Riverhead, County of Suffolk, State of New York, known and designated as all the land lying within the lines of the Remsen Road, Overlook Drive, West

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Woodland Drive, High Hill Road, East Woodland Drive and Rocklein Road, as said streets are laid out and shown on a certain map entitled "Map of Streets at Wading River, Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, New York, dated August 1954", and being the lands presently owned by Charles A. Wood, Wading River, New York, which is shown on the map hereto annexed,

RESOLVED, that consent be and the same is hereby given that the Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of Riverhead make an order laying out the aforesaid Town Highways as described in the deed from Charles A. Wood to the Town of Riverhead, dated September 17th, 1954, above referred to connecting North Country Road and North Wading River Road, as shown on a survey of Alden W. Young, C. E., dated August 1954, and hereto annexed, all in accordance with the provisions of section 171 of the Highway Law of the State of New York.

The Vote---Justices Leonard, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Pike, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Leonard made the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Warner:

RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead that Anthony F. Gadzinski, Town Clerk, Town of Riverhead be, and hereby is authorized to dispose of record items number 1,2,3,18,29,30,31,32,33,34,40,42,43,44,45,46,47,48,49,50,51,52,53,54,55,56,57,59,61,62,64,66,70,71,74,75,76,77,81,82,83,84,86,87,88,89,90,91,93,97,136,138,145,166,167,169,174 and two additional requests as attached on Records Disposition Request List Number 22-tc-1 issued pursuant to Section 114 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of this Board be, and hereby is, directed to furnish a certified copy of this Resolution to Anthony F. Gadzinski, Town Clerk, Town of Riverhead, to be forwarded to the Commissioner of Education.

The Vote---Justices Leonard, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Pike, Absent. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that Harry Whitney, Riverhead, N.Y. he and he hereby is appointed School Traffic Officer at the rate of \$1.50 per hour, payable semi-monthly, retroactive as of September 8, 1954. The Vote---Justices Leonard, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Pike, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Warner, it was resolved that the Town Board meet at the Town Hall on Tuesday, October 5, 1954 at 10:30 A.M. at which time it will consider the purchase of a truck for the Riverhead

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Highway Department for a sum not to exceed \$8,000.00 and that the Town Clerk publish notice thereof pursuant to law. The Vote---Justices Leonard, Warner and Yousik, Yes; Supervisor Kelly, Yes; Justice Pike, Absent. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town Bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund---\$733.14 and Highway Machinery Fund---\$2,099.77.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Tuesday, October 5, 1954 at 10:00 A.M.
