

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, May 7, 1952 at 2:00 P.M.

Edward W. Connors, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were also present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on April 16, 1952 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Mr. Edward Lapham and Mr. Lester Emmett of the Legislative Committee of the Wading River Civic Association addressed the Board and made the following recommendations for the Hamlet of Wading River during the summer months: one fulltime Patrolman until Labor Day and one part-time Patrolman for Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays, Life Guard and a shack on the beach, reduce the speed limit on Sound Road from 25 miles per hour to 20 miles per hour, Stop signs on the southeast and southwest corners of the intersection of Sound Road and Creek Road, Parking Area marked in lanes and slow signs placed from the store to the Greenbrier Inn. They also recommended that Mrs Norman J. Bruen be appointed attendance Supervisor to fill the vacancy caused by the death of her husband and that Richard Heinan be appointed to the position of the part time Patrolman.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved, that Mrs Norman J. Bruen be and she hereby is appointed Attendance Supervisor for School Districts Nos. 1,2,3,4,12 and 13 in the Town of Riverhead to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Norman J. Bruen, and further

RESOLVED, that her compensation be fixed at the rate of \$250.00 per school year, payable in ten monthly payments, which compensation shall include all expenses other than those incurred when attending meetings outside of the Town of Riverhead, called by the District Superintendent of Schools, at which time actual expenses are to be paid. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read from R.W.Pease, Director of Dog Licensing inclosing a copy of suggested duties of Dog Wardens. The Communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Suffolk County Civil Service Commission advising the Board that it did not believe there is any age limit for a Life Guard, except as provided in the Labor Law, which requires working papers. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Gatz and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved, that Richard Johnson of Jamesport, N.Y. be appointed Life Guard at the Reeves Park Beach from June 28, 1952 to Labor Day, inclusive, subject to the rules and regulations of the Suffolk County Civil Service Commission, to serve at the pleasure of the Board, salary fixed at the rate of \$40.00 per week. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Supervisor's Report for the month of April, 1952 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Police Report for the month of April 1952 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Receiver of Taxes submitted a report of the amount of taxes collected as of May 1, 1952 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that

WHEREAS it is the intention of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead to establish a Youth Program, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Riverhead is about to submit an application for such a project to the New York State Youth Commission for its approval, and if approved, to apply subsequently to the State of New York for partial reimbursement of funds expended on said project, as provided by Chapter 556 of the Laws of 1945, as amended, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that such application is in all respects approved and Supervisor Joseph V. Kelly is hereby directed and authorized to duly execute and to present said application to the New York State Youth Commission for its approval. This resolution shall take effect immediately. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that Edward W. Connors, Town Attorney be authorized to make the necessary preparation for the Public Hearing before the Public Service Commission to be held at Riverhead, New York on May 20, 1952 relative to the hazardous Railroad crossings in the Town of Riverhead. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills to date, the totals of which ~~are~~ as follows: General Town Fund-\$3670.74, Machinery Fund-\$1010.75.

There being no further business on motion and vote, the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, May 21, 1952 at 2:00 P.M.
