

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, April 4, 1951 at 2:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on March 21, 1951 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Creighton Family of West Main Street asking the Board to enforce Ordinance No. 8 relating to Junk and Auto-wrecking yards to the property west of theirs. The Chief of Police was instructed to give a copy of Ordinance No. 8 to all persons to whom it pertains and notifying them that they have thirty days in which to clean-up or comply with the ordinance.

The proprietor of Connie's Taxi Service appeared before the Board and requested the privilege of allowing one car in front of his property on the south side of East Main Street in lieu of the Parking Meter Ordinance. The Town Board explained that if it should allow that privilege to one person, then every property owner along Main Street would certainly have the same privilege which would kill the purpose of the Parking Meter Ordinance therefore the request was denied.

A communication together with an Order/^{was read}from the New York State Traffic Commission advising of the establishment of a 30 MPH restriction on Route 25 through the unincorporated villages of Jamesport and Aquebogue and that the State Dept. of Public Works will install the necessary signs. The communication and order were ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Francis R. Creighton, Chief of the Riverhead Fire Department asking permission to change the date of their Bazaar from the week of August 20th to begin on the night of August 16th and continue through the week of August 20th. On motion and vote the request was granted.

A communication was read from the Polish National Alliance asking permission to change the date of their carnival from the last week in May to the week beginning on June 23rd. On motion and vote the request was granted.

A communication was read from the Jamesport Athletic Club stating that it is forming a baseball league to be known as the^b North Fork Little League for small boys only and asked the Board if they could not obtain some financial aid from the Youth Program as set up in the Town of Riverhead. The communication was referred to the Youth Program Committee.

A communication was read from Richard Raffle making application for the position Life Guard at Reeve's Beach for the summer season of 1951. The communication was ordered placed on file.


On motion made by Justice Gatz and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that Richard Raffle be appointed Life Guard at the Reeve's Park Beach beginning on the 29th day of June, 1951 and ending on Labor Day, salary fixed at the rate of \$40.00 per week. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik and Gatz Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Police report for the month of March, 1951 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Receiver of Taxes submitted a report of the amount of taxes collected as of April 3, 1951 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town bills to date, the totals of which were as follows: General Town Fund-\$2689.37, Highway Machinery Fund-\$3324.09.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, April 18, 1951 at 2:00 P.M.
