

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, July 3, 1951 at 1:30 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on June 30, 1951 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Notice of public hearing in regard to the enactment of a proposed ordinance concerning the regulation and use of a public dump or disposal area in the Town of Riverhead was read.

Proof of publication and affidavit of posting the above notice was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote were ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Kelly thereupon declared the hearing open and anyone who wished could be heard at that time.

No one having appeared in favor or against the proposed ordinance the hearing was declared closed.

On motion made by Justice Gatz and seconded by Justice Yousik it was RESOLVED, that the following be and is hereby enacted, ordained and adopted as an Ordinance of the Town of Riverhead, New York, and shall take effect and be in force from and after July 23, 1951.

#### Ordinance No. 15

##### Public Dump or Disposal Area

No person shall dump, throw or place, in any manner, any rubbish, refuse, dirt or any material whatsoever, in or upon any public dump or disposal area except in the area or manner as may from time to time be indicated by signs placed or directions displayed in or upon such public dump or disposal area, or as directed by any person in charge of such public dump or disposal area, nor at a time excepting that indicated by such sign or signs or directions.

Any oral directions given by any person in charge of any public dump or disposal area shall take precedence over any sign or displayed directions.

No person shall deposit in or upon any public dump or disposal area any offensive matter, sewage, fecal matter, manure, offal, meat waste, blood, dead animals, tankage or any petrifiable organic matter or the contents of privies, cesspools, septic tanks or chemical tanks, either liquid or solid, or any other substances or liquids dangerous or prejudicial to health. Provided, however, that the carcass of any dead animal may be buried in such public dump or disposal area if immediately

interred by the person bringing such carcass to the dump or disposal area, in a ditch at least two feet deep with a covering of earth to the level of the surrounding area.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this ordinance, no person shall enter upon nor dump or deposit rubbish, dirt, refuse or any other material whatsoever, nor bury any animal carcass in any public dump or disposal area between the hours of sunset and sunrise.

No person shall start or kindle or cause to be started or kindled any fire or fires within any part of any public dump or disposal area nor deposit or throw or place any ignited or burning substance therein, except the person in charge of said public dump or disposal area.

No person shall remove, destroy, alter, deface or otherwise injure any sign or signs placed or erected within any public disposal area excepting upon and by the direction of the Town Superintendent of Highways.

Any violation of this ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a penalty of not more than \$10.00 for the first offense, a penalty of not less than \$25.00 for the second offense committed within a period of three months, a penalty of \$25.00 nor more than \$50.00 for a third offense if committed within a period of six months. The vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Gatz and Leonard Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Police report for the month of June, 1951 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.


On motion made by Justice Gatz and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead express its deep appreciation to the Lions Club of Riverhead for placing tables, benches and fire places on the picnic ground at the Howell M. Reeve Town Park. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the appointment of Henry Scheinberg as Life-guard at the Iron Pier Beach be retroactive as of June 25, 1951. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Gatz it was Resolved, that the Long Island Lighting Company be authorized to install 3-100 C.P. street lights on poles Nos. 19, 21, and 23 on Marcy Avenue in the Riverhead Lighting District. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills to date the totals of which were as follows: General Town-\$6760.38, Highway Machinery Fund-\$1230.33.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, July 18, 1951 at 2:00 P.M.
