

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, May 18, 1949 at 2:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on May 4, 1949 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Communications were read from James A. O'Beirne and Robert E. Richard making applications for the positions of Life Guards at the beaches at Wading River and Reeve's Park, respectively, and were ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that James A. O'Beirne be appointed Life Guard at the Wading River Beach and that Robert E. Richard be appointed Life Guard at the Reeve's Park Beach from June 25, 1949 to Labor Day, inclusive, for seven days a week, hours from 11:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M., salary at the rate of \$40.00 per week. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

Supervisor Kelly advised the Board that the Hunt Bros. Circus had signed an agreement to pay the Town of Riverhead \$25.00 for holding their circus on June 22, 1949 on the property in the rear of the highway barn.

Certificates of Public Liability Insurance were filed by the Prudent's Amusement Shows and the Carnival Shows, Inc. \$50,000.00 any one person, \$100,000.00 any one accident or occurrence while showing in the Town of Riverhead during the season of 1949. The certificates were ordered placed on file.

A resolution from the Town of Riverhead Planning Board recommending the acquisition of the parcel from Talmage, Gushman and Young and the Riverhead Water District for widening of Old Country Road and further recommending that Parkway Street be extended westerly to the land of the Riverhead Water District across the lands of Talmage, Gushman and Young, and that the street be extended southerly to Old Country Road across the lands of Talmage, Gushman and Young, and the Riverhead Water District. The resolution was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the Supt. of Highways be authorized to widen the paved area on Pulaski Street between Osborn Avenue and Marcy Avenue according to plans and specifications drawn By Alden W. Young, Surveyor. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

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Justice Zaleski offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Warner

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 535, Laws of 1945, amended by Chapter 436, Laws of 1946, the Superintendent of Public Works, State of New York, has prepared plans and estimates of the cost for the construction of three jetties on the beach near Edwards Avenue and three jetties on the beach near Pier Avenue located on Long Island Sound, Town of Riverhead, New York, at a total cost not to exceed \$46,600.00, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the plans and estimates of cost submitted for the construction of said jetties, be and hereby are approved, now therefore be it further

RESOLVED, that it is the intention of the Town of Riverhead to participate in sharing the cost of such construction to the extent of 25% of the total cost. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

The Committee on the dedication of Grangabell Park reported that arrangements have been made for the Decoration Day Parade to stop at the Park for not more than ten minutes for the dedication services at which time a member of the Griffing Family and the Supervisor will speak.

The Supervisor's Report for the month of April 1949 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Receiver of Taxes submitted a report of the amount of taxes collected as of May 16, 1949 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the Long Island Lighting Company be authorized to place 100 C.P. street lights on Pole #22 and Pole #24 on Ackerly Street in the Riverhead Lighting District. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the Town of Riverhead purchase a 1949 Hudson Automobile, 6 cylinder, 2 door sedan, 121 horsepower for the Riverhead Town Police for a sum not to exceed \$625.00 plus the trade in value of \$1100.00 for the present 1947 Chevrolet Police car. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

The matter in regard to the change of time of day when parking meters are effective was discussed by the Board and referred to the Police Committee and the Chief of Police for study and report.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town and highway machinery bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, June 1, 1949 at 2:00 P.M.
