

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, June 4, 1947 at 2:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on May 21, 1947 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

J. Harry Brown, Chairman of the Honor Roll Committee addressed the Board in regard to the World War II Honor Roll stating that the Committee is planning a campaign for funds in order to obtain a permanent bronze plate to replace the temporary individual plates.

On motion made by Justice Warner and Seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the Suffolk County Civil Service Commission be requested to allow the appointment of Part Time Employees in the Riverhead Police Department by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that a report be sent to the Suffolk County Civil Service Commission regarding the service records of John Doscinski and Stephen Grodski as candidates for Police Chief of the Town of Riverhead as follows:

John Doscinski, Patrolman from January 1, 1940 to December 31, 1941
Acting Chief from January 1, 1943 to date.

Stephen Grodski, Patrolman from January 1, 1940 to Dec. 31, 1941
In U.S. Service from March 11, 1942 to Dec. 19, 1945
Patrolman from August 15, 1946 to Dec. 31, 1946
Acting Police Lieut. from Jan. 1, 1947 to date.

As no formal service records have been kept, it is impossible to report a record in percentage amounts. However it is the opinion of this Board that both of these men have made excellent records during their employment by the Town and Stephen Grodski while in the Service of his country. We feel that both men are exceptionally well qualified for the position. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from Harry G. Penny, Secretary to the Riverhead Fire Department requesting the Town Board to place a 600 C.P. street light in front of the Fire House on Hamilton Avenue. The communication was referred to the Lighting District Committee.

The Police report for the month of May 1947 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Tax Receiver submitted a report of the amount of taxes collected as of June 2, 1947 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the following notice be published in the Riverhead Newspapers:

The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that 500 feet of wire fence be installed at the Town Dump along Young's Avenue at a cost not to exceed the sum of \$1,000.00. The Vote Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by ^{Justice} Leonard and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the following notice be published in the Riverhead Newspapers:
