

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, July 2, 1947 at 2:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney was present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on June 18, 1947 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Proof of Publication of the Notice to Bidders for the sale of the Riverhead Town Police Booth was presented to the Board and ordered placed on file.

Sealed bids were opened as follows: Roger Homan \$35.00; Harold H. Fanning \$50.25; Frank E. Benjamin \$51.00 and Anton Lovchko \$126.00. On motion and vote the bids were ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the bid of Anton Lovchko in the amount of \$126.00 for the Riverhead Town Police Booth be accepted. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

George W. Hildreth, President of the Board of Education of School District No. 5, Town of Riverhead addressed the Board and requested that a speed zone be established in the area adjacent to the Pulaski Street School.

Justice Yousik offered the following resolution which was seconded by Justice Warner,

WHEREAS, the attention of the Town Board has been called to the need of restricting the speed at which vehicles may proceed on along the town highways lying within the area hereinafter described and the restricting and prohibiting of the parking of vehicles on such town highways and

WHEREAS, said area is outside a city, village, town of the first class and town of the second class having a population in excess of twenty-five thousand and it has been determined that there is need for such restriction and /or prohibition, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to the Vehicle and Traffic Laws, Section 95-C, Speed and Parking Regulations, as amended by Chapter 210 of the Laws of 1947, a request be made of the State Traffic Commission for an order restricting the maximum speed limit to twenty miles per hour at which vehicles may proceed and the parking of such vehicles within the boundaries of the area hereinafter described on and along the following named Town Highways to wit:- Pulaski Street, Osborn Avenue, Hallett Street, Griffin Path and Griffing Avenue and for the purposes aforesaid to prescribe the location

and type of signs and markings which it may deem necessary for the Town Superintendent of Highways to provide to give adequate warning of such restricted speed and parking.

The area to be affected and above referred to is situate at Riverhead in the Town of Riverhead is bounded on the south by Lincoln Street, on the west by Osborn Avenue, on the east by Griffing Avenue and Griffin Path and on the north by a line running from Osborn Avenue to Griffin Path parallel to Pulaski Street and distant 250 feet northerly from the center line of the drive-way or bypass in the rear of the Riverhead High School Building, said area being the site of and adjacent to the Riverhead High School. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

Lester M. Emmett, Attorney, addressed the Board stating that a group of men in Wading River desire to form a Fire Company to be known as the Wading River Fire Department, Inc., however, in order for them to incorporate, they must have the permission of the Town Board to do so. He explained that the purpose of the Corporation is to act in case of an emergency.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the group of men ~~at Wading River, Town of Riverhead, New York~~ who desire to form a Fire Company be granted permission to incorporate under the name of the Wading River Fire Department, Inc. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that Police Chief, A. John Doscinski be authorized to attend the Police Chief School to be held in the F.B.I. National Police Academy at Washington, D.C. for a period of three months, beginning January 1948 and that all necessary expenses be paid. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The final report of the Receiver of Taxes was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Police report for the month of June was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Justice Zaleski was present.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the resolution dated June 18, 1947, appointing David Green as Life Guard at Reeves Beach be and the same is hereby rescinded and be it further

RESOLVED, that David Green be appointed Life Guard at the Iron Pier Beach as of June 29th to Labor Day inclusive, 6 days per week, at a salary of 6/7 of \$40.00 per week, and be it further

RESOLVED, that a Life Guard be appointed at Iron Pier Beach to serve 1 day a week, at a salary of 1/7 of \$40.00 per week. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved, that Philip Johnsen be appointed Life Guard at Reeves Beach, beginning July 3, 1947 to Labor Day inclusive at a salary of \$40.00 per week. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the Town Park Committee be authorized to purchase a row boat, three umbrellas and a set of life lines for the Wading River Beach. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Riverhead Associates, Inc. 131 Union Avenue, Riverhead, New York made application to the Town Board for acceptance, upon dedication of certain roads as shown on map entitled "Map of Mill Brook Gables, Riverhead, N.Y."

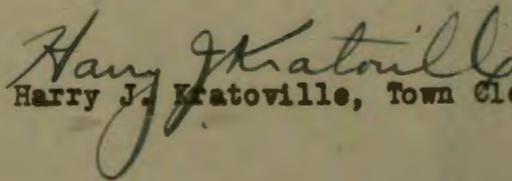
On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the Town Board, upon the dedication of Riverhead Associates, Inc. accepts Town Highways, the roads and parts of roads as shown on a certain map entitled "Map of Mill Brook Gables, Riverhead, Suffolk County, N.Y.", more particularly described in said dedication, subject to the approval of the Town Supt. of Highways that the said roads are in satisfactory condition for acceptance. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from June Buochell making application for sidewalks in the vicinity of Roanoke Ave. and Northville Turnpike. On motion and vote the communication was referred to the Highway Committee and Supt. of Highways.

The parking situation was discussed by the Board and on motion and vote a Committee composed of Supervisor Kelly, Justice Warner and Town Attorney Lundberg was appointed to study the matter and report at the next regular meeting.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town and Highway Machinery bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, July 16, 1947 at 2:00 P.M.
