

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, August 6, 1947 at 3:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held on July 16, 1947 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Notice of Public Hearing on the proposed Refuse Ordinance was read.

Proof of publication of the above notice pursuant to law was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Kelly thereupon declared the hearing open and anyone who wished could be heard at this time.

No one having appeared in opposition to the adoption of the proposed Refuse Ordinance and no one else wishing to be heard, the Supervisor declared the hearing closed.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the following ordinance be and the same is hereby duly adopted:

REFUSE ORDINANCE

Section I. No person or persons, firm, association, or corporation may without a permit from the Town Board and subject to such regulations as the Town Board may adopt use any lands within the Town of Riverhead, except such place or places as have been and shall be from time to time provided by the Town of Riverhead, for the purpose of a public dump or dumping grounds.

Section II. No person or persons, firm association or corporation shall throw, cast, lay or direct, suffer or permit any servant or employee to throw, cast, or lay any waste material, refuse matter, garbage, tin cans, paper, filth, bottles, broken glass, crockery, or rubbish of any kind whatsoever, in any street either upon the roadway or sidewalk thereof or upon the property of another except such place or places as have been and may from time to time be provided for the purpose by the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead,

The following words as used in this section shall have the meaning hereinafter respectively ascribed to them:-

Street:- The word "Street" includes any street, avenues, road, alley lane, highway, culvert and every class of public road, square and place.

Roadway:- That portion of a street or highway between the regularly established curb lines or that part devoted to vehicular traffic.

Sidewalk:- That portion of the street between the curb lines and the adjacent property lines.

Section III. No person or persons, firm or corporation, shall carry, cart, transport or direct, suffer or permit any servant or employee to carry, cart or transport any waste material, refuse matter, garbage, tin cans, paper, filth, bottles, broken glass, crockery or rubbish of any kind over and upon any of the roads, streets, avenues or highways within the Town of Riverhead, without the same being properly covered, weighted or otherwise safely protected at the top, bottom and sides in such manner as to secure the same from dropping, falling or being blown on and into such road, avenue, street, highway or upon the properties adjacent thereto.

Section IV. Any person, persons, firm, association or corporation who shall violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not exceeding \$50.00 or thirty days in jail or both.

SECTION V. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its adoption by the Town Board. The foregoing resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion and vote it was Resolved that the foregoing Refuse Ordinance be published and posted pursuant to law.

A communication was read from Mr. Meade C. Dobson, Managing Director of the Long Island Association including a resolution duly adopted by the Roadside Committee objecting to the practice by many farmers in Nassau and Suffolk Counties of cutting up the road surfaces with their machinery thus creating hazards and causing additional expense to the highway authorities. The letter and resolution was ordered placed on file.

A notice of public hearing to be held by the New York State Public Service Commission at 233 Broadway, New York, N.Y. on August 12, 1947 at 2:00 P.M. on the petition of Henry W. Adelworth and Vitus F. Adelworth doing business as the Blue Line, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity for the operation of an omnibus line between Center Moriches and Riverhead. The notice was ordered placed on file.

A certified copy of a resolution duly adopted by the Suffolk County Board of Supervisors fixing Monday, November 24, 1947 as the date at which taxes for the next fiscal year will be levied was read and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to borrow on Tax Anticipation Certificates the sum of \$7,350.00 for snow removal. The Vote Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Supervisor's Report for the month of July was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Police Report for the month of July was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the New York State Traffic Commission be requested to prohibit "U" Turns on Main Street, Town of Riverhead, from the intersection of Osborn Avenue on the West to Union Avenue on the East and that "No U Turn" signs be placed at the following locations: one suspended under traffic signal light at the intersection of Main St. and Osborn Ave.; one suspended under traffic signal light at the intersection of Main St. and Griffing Ave.; one suspended under traffic signal light at the intersection of Main St. and Peconic Ave.; one suspended under traffic signal light at the intersection of Main St. and Roanoke Ave. and one suspended over the intersection of Main St. and Union Ave. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town and Highway machinery bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, August 20, 1947 at 2:00 P.M.
