

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, August 20, 1947 at 2:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on August 6, 1947 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Proof of publication and affidavit of posting of the adoption of Refuse Ordinance No 13 were presented to the Board and on motion and vote were ordered placed on file.

Police Lieut. Stephan Grodski addressed the Board stating that many complaints have been received regarding the hazzardous situation which exists on Roanoke Avenue between Railroad St. and Second St. especially when cars are parked on both sides of Roanoke Avenue. He also called attention to the dangerous corner at Railroad St. and Roanoke Avenue and recommended that no parking be allowed on the West side of Roanoke Ave. from Railroad St. to Second St. and also no parking on the south side of Railroad St. for a distance of 75 feet west from the intersection of Roanoke Avenue and Railroad St.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that no automobile or other vehicle shall be parked on the west side of Roanoke Avenue, between Railroad Street and Second Street and that no automobile or other vehicle shall be parked on the south side of Railroad Street for a distance of 75 feet west from the intersection of Roanoke Avenue and Railroad street and that signs be placed to that effect. The Resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The matter in regard to the damage to the bath houses and toilets at Howell M. Reeve Park was called to the attention of the Board and on motion and vote was referred to the Highway Committee and the Supt. of Highways.

A communication was read from the New York State Public Service Commission giving notice that a public hearing will be held on the matter of the complaint of certain commuters residing between Ronkonkoma and Greenport against the srevice provided by the Long Island Rail Road Co. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the New York State Public Service Commission giving notice of a public hearing to be held at its office, 233 Broadway New York on the petition of the Long Island Lighting Co. for authority to make certain increases in its rates and charges for gas. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the certification of membership of the Wading River Fire Dept. Inc. dated August 14, 1947 be and the same is hereby confirmed and ordered placed on file. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from O. Halsey Corwin tendering his resignation as Police Patrolman of the Town of Riverhead. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was Resolved that the resignation of O. Halsey Corwin as Police Patrolman of the Town of Riverhead be accepted, effective as of August 7, 1947. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved that the Long Island Lighting Company be authorized to place one 80 C.P. Street Lamp on Pole #3, Woodcrest Avenue in the Riverhead Lighting District. The resolution was adopted by the Unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that Norman J. Bruen be and he hereby is appointed attendance Supervisor for School Districts Nos. 1,2,3,4,12 and 13 in the Town of Riverhead for the year 1947-48, and be it further

RESOLVED that Howard A. Wells be and he hereby is appointed Attendance Supervisor for School Districts Nos. 8,9,10 and 11 in the Town of Riverhead for the year 1947-48, and be it further

RESOLVED that their compensation be fixed at the rate of \$250.00 per school year each, payable in ten monthly payments, which compensation shall include all expenses other than those incurred when attending meetings outside of the Town of Riverhead, called by the District Superintendent of Schools, at which time actual expenses are to be paid by the Town of Riverhead. The Vote Justices Warner, Yousik and Leonard Yes, Justice Zaleski not voting, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes4, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways addressed the Board stating that he has an old 1932 International Truck which is obsolete and not in use, that the appraisal trade in value is \$200.00 and that he has an offer of \$300.00 for it and recommended that it be sold.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the Supt. of Highways be authorized to sell the 1932 International Highway truck, engine #14062 which is obsolete highway equipment for the sum of \$300.00. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to transfer the sum of \$664.11 from the Current Surplus Account to the following accounts:

The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

Justice Yousik called the Board's attention to the matter in regard to the property now used by the Riverhead Town Highway Dept. in the rear of the High School property. He stated that a definite boundary line should be established in order that responsibility may be definitely assumed.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that the Supervisor be authorized to pay the sum of \$100.00 to Elmer H. Bishop for rental of his property at Wading River for a town parking space for the period from July 1, 1947 to July 1, 1948. The Vote Justices Warner, Yousik and Leonard Yes, Justice Zaleski absent, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote, Yes 4, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town and highway machinery bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, September 3, 1947.
