

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, August 7, 1946 at 2:00 P.M.

Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways was present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on Wednesday, July 17, 1946 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Long Island Rail Road Co. stating that effective Sunday, August 4th, an additional coach will be added to each of the two westbound trains leaving Riverhead at 5:50 P.M. and 9:35 P.M. on Sunday evenings during the summer months which will in their opinion provide seats for all passengers boarding the train at Riverhead. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Mrs John Bergfolk of Reeves Park urging the Board to provide signs of caution and speed limit on Park Road for the safety of children. The communication was ordered placed on file. *On motion and vote, the Board fixed a speed limit of 20 miles per hour on Park Road.*

A communication was read from Mrs Edward J. Kempf of Wading River, suggesting that some signs be placed on Sound Road, Wading River, limiting speed to 20 miles an hour. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Mrs Lester M. Emmett, Secretary of the Wading River Civic Association, expressing to the Board, the sincere appreciation of the Association in providing their community with a parking field, lifeguard at the beach and generally in complying with the petition of their representatives, who appeared before the Board early this summer. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Board of Supervisors advising that it had fixed Monday, November 25, 1946, as the date of the meeting at which taxes for the next fiscal year will be levied.

A communication was read from William Shaddock tendering his resignation as Police Patrolman of the Town of Riverhead, to become effective as of August 13, 1946. The communication was ordered placed on file,

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Warner it was resolved that the resignation of William Shaddock as Police Patrolman of the Town of Riverhead be accepted, effective as of August 13, 1946. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The matter, in regard to, heavy damage at Reeve's Park Beach caused by the deluge ^{of this morning} was referred to the Highway Committee and the Supt. of Highways.

Supt. of Highways Young advised the Board that he had been offered \$225.00 for the old Highway Oil Truck.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways be authorized to sell the old Highway Oil Truck for the sum of \$225.00 and that said sum be applied to the purchase price of a New Oil Distributor for the Highway Department. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The matter in regard to the petition of Thomas J. Quinn for the consent of the Town Board to the transfer of the Quinn Bus Franchise to Burkhardt Seidenschwarz was brought to the attention of the Board and on motion and vote was referred to the Town Attorney.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the Town Hall be closed on Friday, August 23, 1946 for the afternoon, during the New York State Volunteer Firemen's Convention Parade. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.


Supervisor Kelly presented his report for the month of July, 1946 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Police report for the month of July, 1946 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Yousik and seconded by Justice Leonard it was Resolved that Dewey Lewin of Calverton, New York be appointed School Director of the Town of Riverhead to fill the vacancy caused by the death of L. Gilson Griffing. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all Town bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, August 21, 1946 at 2:00 P.M.
