

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, July 3, 1946 at 3:00 P.M.

Arthur H. Lundberg, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on June 19, 1946 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from Francis Creighton, Chairman of the New York State Volunteer Firemen's Association Parade to be held in Riverhead on August 23, 1946, inviting the Town Board to march in the parade. The communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the Town Board accept the invitation to participate in the parade of the New York State Volunteer Firemen's Association to be held in Riverhead on August 23, 1946. The resolution was adopted by unanimous vote.

A communication was read from Faulk & Co., Albertson, L.I.N.Y. in regard to the pruning of trees along the highways of the Town of Riverhead. On motion and vote the Supervisor was authorized to obtain further information regarding this matter.

A petition signed by 23 residents of the Camp Ground at Jamesport was submitted to the Board, requesting that a street light be placed in the Camp Grounds for public safety as the roadways through the Grounds are now used by the public. The petition was referred to the Lighting District Committee.

A certified copy of a resolution unanimously adopted at a regular meeting of the Wading River Civic Association was read, urging the Board to use every effort possible to expedite as erosion projects of (1) Straightening the Wading River Creek and permanently protecting and stabilizing same by bulkheads, jetties or other suitable constructions, and (2) protecting the Dune Properties and public highway to the south thereof, by the construction of an adequate jetty extending from the public landing a suitable distance into the water. The resolution was ordered placed on file.

A certified Copy of a resolution which was adopted by the Board of Supervisors of Suffolk County on June 24, 1946, relative to the charge back of public assistance to the various towns was read and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Leonard it

was Resolved that the Town of Riverhead discontinue renting the office in the Lee Building now used by the Town Welfare Dept. and all Town property be removed and telephones disconnected. The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total vote Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read from the New York State Public Service Commission advising the Board that a public hearing will be held in regard to the petition of Henry W. Adelwerth, for a temporary certificate of public convenience and necessity for the operation of an omnibus line between East Moriches and Riverhead, in the office of the Commission 233 Broadway, New York, N.Y. on July 9, 1946 at 10:00 A.M. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A Police report for the month of June, 1946 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Leonard and seconded by Justice Yousik it was Resolved, that the Supervisor be authorized to transfer the sum of \$204.95 from the Current Surplus Account to the following accounts:

Municipal Indebtedness/Interest on Debt. Acct.	\$50.00
Town Board/Other Expense	154.95

The Vote, Justices Warner, Yousik, Leonard and Zaleski Yes, Supervisor Kelly Yes. Total Vote Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined all town bills to date.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, July 17, 1946 at 2:00 P.M.
