

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, May 26, 1943 at 2:00 P. M.

Seth A. Hubbard, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

The Town Board together with representatives of the three Bus Companies discussed the matter of a bus terminal for the Town of Riverhead. After an expression of cooperation on the part of all concerned, an inspection tour was made to ascertain the most practical solution to this problem. The representatives of the Bus Companies stated that they wished to take the matter up with the Merchants Association before any definite steps were taken.

The Town Board then made an inspection tour of the Howell M. Reeve Park.


Justice Warner offered the following Resolution which was seconded by Justice Leonard

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Riverhead Town Board that the United States Army authorities are contemplating closing a considerable portion of the Westhampton-Riverhead Road to civilian traffic; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead wishes in every way possible to assist the army and all other governmental authorities in the efficient prosecution of the war in which our country is now engaged, but at the same time wishes to secure to the citizens of the Town of Riverhead as full use of public facilities as may conveniently be done without interfering with the war effort; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead does respectfully request that the United States Army authorities give due consideration to the possibility of closing the said portion of the Westhampton-Riverhead road to civilian use only at such times as the highway or adjacent properties under government control are being used in a manner making civilian travel over the said road either unsafe or undesirable. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Leonard and Smith, Yes, Supervisor Kelly, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, June 2, 1943 at 2:00 P. M.
