

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, October 20, 1943 at 2:00 P. M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on October 5, 1943 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Smith, it was RESOLVED, that the resolution adopted at the meeting of the Town Board on the 4th day of August, 1943 with respect to the manner of handling relief in the Town of Riverhead be amended so that the same shall read as follows:

WHEREAS, the Town Welfare Officer of the Town of Riverhead has submitted "Plan for cash relief in the Town Welfare Office of the Town of Riverhead" dated August 4th, 1943; and

WHEREAS, by amendment of the Social Welfare Law made by Chapter 518 of the Laws of 1943, the legislature has authorized payment of relief in cash and issuance of individual checks to persons entitled to relief who are certified by the Town Welfare Officer; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the plan of the Town Welfare Officer for such cash relief is approved by this Board, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor shall without prior audit issue individual checks to persons as authorized by the Town Welfare Officer on forms prescribed or approved by the State Department of Social Welfare; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this plan shall be effective January 1, 1944. The vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Leonard and Smith, Yes, Supervisor Kelly, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Riverhead Merchant's Association advising that it strongly disapproves the Town Board permitting Amorette Smith to continue her assuming the prerogative of a policewoman and urged the Board to take immediate steps to correct this situation. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Riverhead Merchant's Association stating that it is opposed to any increase in the Town Budget at this time, due to the burden of increased Federal taxes. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A petition for sidewalks on the West side of Howell Avenue from East Main Street to and including the property of Hans Klatt, signed by several taxpayers of that vicinity was submitted to the Board and was referred to the Highway Committee and Supt. of Highways.

A petition from Henry W. Adelwerth for consent to operate a motor bus line over certain highways within the Town of Riverhead was submitted to the Board . The petition was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Smith and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that the following Notice of Public Hearing be published pursuant to law:

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING


Notice is hereby given, pursuant to the Transportation Corporation Laws, Section 66, that the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, Suffolk County, N. Y. will meet at the Town Hall, Second Street, Riverhead, N. Y., at seven O'clock in the Evening, Eastern War Time, on Thursday, November 4th, 1943, and will hold a public hearing upon the written application of Henry W. Adelwerth, filed with the said Town Board on October 20th, 1943, for a franchise to maintain and operate a motor omnibus route for public use and convenience and the transportation and conveyance of persons for hire, over, upon and along the following streets, avenues, highways and public places in the Town of Riverhead

Beginning at the intersection of the Riverhead and Southampton Town Line on Peconic Avenue: thence along Peconic Avenue to Main Street (State Route #25) thence westerly along Main Street to Griffing Avenue: thence Northerly on Griffing Avenue to the Suffolk County Court House. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board present.

Supervisor Kelly submitted his report for the month of September, 1943 and on motion and vote was duly adopted.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Welfare bills for the month of September, 1943.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Thursday, November 4, 1943 at 7:00 P. M.
