

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, January 21, 1942 at 2:00 P. M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on January 8, 1942 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes submitted a report of taxes collected as of January 16th, 1942 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Elmer J. B. Sawyer, Director of Civil Defense Council, Town of Riverhead, stating that at a meeting of the Council, it was recommended that the Town enforce the two-hour parking regulations. The communication was ordered placed on file.

The matter in regard to establishing an Industry Committee for the Town of Riverhead was discussed by the Board.

On motion made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Smith, it was RESOLVED that an Industry Committee for the Town of Riverhead be appointed consisting of the following men; Albert W. Conklin, John Gee, Walter C. Stark, Henry R. Talmage, William Morell, Maxim Bobinski and Supervisor Joseph V. Kelly. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Zaleski, it was RESOLVED that the salary of the Superintendent of the Town Dump be fixed at the rate of \$4.00 per day. The vote, Justices Zaleski, Smith, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Kelly, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Smith and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that the sum of \$1000.00 be appropriated from the Town Welfare Fund for the purpose of establishing a revolving fund for the sale of Food Stamps. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that this Board favors the establishment of a Police School to be conducted for regular and auxiliary police of the Town and further RESOLVED that the Supervisor is hereby authorized to expend a sum not to exceed \$100.00 for the necessary expenses of conducting the same. The vote, Justices Zaleski, Smith, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Kelly, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.


A request was made by the Riverhead Polish Independent Club that Edmund Buziak be appointed Special Policeman for the reason that he is employed by them to police their premises evenings.

On motion made by Justice Smith and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that Edmund Buziak be appointed Special Policeman for the Town of Riverhead to serve at the pleasure of the Town Board without compensation. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be authorized to transfer the sum of \$635.26 from the Current Surplus Account to the Miscellaneous-Town's Share Retirement System Account. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Welfare bills for the month of December, 1941.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, February 4, 1942 at 2:00 P. M.
