

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, March 18, 1942 at 2:00 P. M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on March 4, 1942 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

A communication was read from the Department of Audit and Control in regard to adopting the Retirement System for the Riverhead Water District and the Riverhead Sewer District. The communication was ordered placed on file and the matter was referred to the Water and Sewer District Committees.

Mr. Robert R. Brown of Greenport, N. Y., addressed the Board and submitted application for the renewal of his franchise for a period of ten years. The application was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Smith, it was RESOLVED that a public hearing be held on the application of Robert R. Brown to operate a bus line in the Town of Riverhead and further

RESOLVED that the said hearing be held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, April 1, 1942 at 2:00 P. M. and further

RESOLVED that the Town Clerk publish said notice in the official paper pursuant to law. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

A communication was read from Forrest A. Yeager in regard to a sidewalk on West Main Street from King Kullen's old building, west to Myrus Park an area from which many children attend our public schools. The matter was referred to the Highway Committee and Supt. of Highways to investigate and report.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes, submitted a report of the amount of Taxes collected as of March 16, 1942 and on motion and vote the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Supervisor Kelly submitted his report for the month of February, 1942 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Zaleski, it was RESOLVED that the Supervisor be authorized to transfer the sum of \$1,000.00 from the Current Surplus Account to the Miscellaneous Parking Space Account for the purpose of paying rentals and making improvements on parking spaces as per Special Election held March 6th, 1942. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board canvassed the vote of the Special Election held on March 6, 1942 upon the proposition of renting parking fields for the Town of Riverhead. The result of the canvas was as follows: One Hundred and Eleven Votes cast - 99 voted Yes, and 12 voted No. The report was thereupon signed by the members of the Board and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that in view of the vote of the Electorate in favor of a parking field, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead do acquire for parking purposes for the year 1942, the property described in the resolution of February 4th, 1942, and be it further

RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to sign leases therefor, and pay as rental for the year 1942 the following sums:

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to pay to Florence Hallett the sum of \$40.00 and to John Dombek, the sum of \$8.56, to cover the rental for their respective properties for the balance of the year 1941. The vote, Justices Zaleski, Smith, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Kelly, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that WHEREAS certain new parking restrictions on Roanoke Avenue and generally in the Village of Riverhead are desirable, it is hereby

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 12 of Ordinance 3 of the Town of Riverhead no automobile or other vehicle shall be parked on the West side of Roanoke Avenue between Main Street and Second Street, and it is further

RESOLVED that no automobile or other vehicle shall stop in the restricted areas on either side of Main Street where designated by the Riverhead Town Board as 10-minute parking areas for more than 10 minutes between the hours of 9:00 A. M. and 9:00 P. M., and it is further

RESOLVED that a violation of any of the above restrictions shall constitute a violation of Section 12 of Ordinance 3 of the Town of Riverhead. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Boutcher and seconded by Justice Smith, it was RESOLVED that the parcel of land dedicated to the Town of Riverhead by George E. Hart of Wading River for the purpose of straightening Parker Road be and the same is hereby accepted. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Lighting Committee reporting on the application for a street light on Parkway Street, recommended that one (1) 80 C. P. be placed on Pole #8 on Parkway Street.

On motion made by Justice Smith and seconded by Justice Boutcher, it was RESOLVED that the Long Island Lighting Company be authorized to place one (1) 80 C. P. Street Lamp on Pole #8, Parkway Street in the Riverhead Lighting District. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

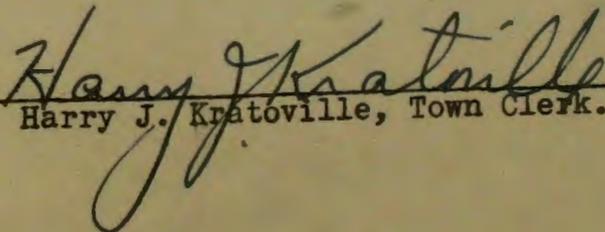
The Welfare Department report for the month of February, 1942 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Warner, it was RESOLVED that the salary of Paul L. Brown, Special Policeman be increased from the base rate of \$1200.00 per annum to the base rate of \$1500.00 per Annum, effective April 1, 1942. The vote, Justices Zaleski, Smith, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Kelly, Yes. Total vote, Yes 5, No. 0. The resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Smith, it was RESOLVED that the Long Island Lighting Company be authorized to place 4 - 250 C. P. Lamps and 3 - 100 C. P. lamps in the parking field between Griffing Avenue and Roanoke Avenue in the Town of Riverhead. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Welfare bills for the month of February, 1942.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, April 1, 1942 at 2:00 P. M.
