

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, June 17, 1942 at 2:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on Wednesday, June 3, 1942 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Mrs Percy V. Ketcham ~~#####~~ representing the American Red Cross addressed the Board in regard to the Life Guard situation in the Town of Riverhead.

A communication was read from Mr. Ward McCabe, Sec. of the Riverhead Merchants Association stating that the Association approves the bus stop at the corner of Main Street and Peconic Avenue. They recommended, however, that the white lines be further extended in order that the buses will have plenty of room to park. It was the opinion of the Board that the Merchants Association be advised that the bus stop at that corner be approved under the present situation (or for the present), however if, in the future, the bus stops at this corner create a traffic problem, it may be necessary to make a change (at a future time.)

Supervisor Kelly submitted his report for the month of May, 1942 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes submitted a <sup>final</sup> report of the amount of taxes collected as of June 15, 1942 and on motion and vote the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was resolved that George Wells be appointed a Life Guard at the Howell M. Reeve Park, to serve at the pleasure of the Town Board beginning June 29th, 1942, salary fixed at the rate of \$30. 00 per week. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Smith and seconded by Justice Zaleski it was resolved that Raymond Tuthill be appointed Life Guard in and for the Town of Riverhead, to serve at the pleasure of the Town Board beginning June 29th, 1942, salary fixed at the rate of \$25.00 per week. The resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the board.

A report of the Welfare Department for the month of May 1942 was submitted to the Board and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the Welfare bills for the month of May 1942.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, July 1, 1942 at 2:00 P.M. *Harry J. Krazoville*
