

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, September 11, 1940 at 2:00 P.M.

Solomon Raffe, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board held on August 21, 1940 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Mr. Reginald C. Smith, Attorney, representing Mr. Howard H. Downs of South Jamesport addressed the Board advising that neither South Jamesport Ave. nor Point Street extends to either the waters of Peconic Bay or to the highwater mark of Peconic Bay. He submitted a statement regarding the above matter and requested that it be made a part of the records of the Town. The statement was ordered placed on file and referred to the Town Attorney.

Notice of Public Hearing upon proposed one-way Street Ordinances was read.

Proof of publication of the above notice was submitted to the Board and ordered placed on file.

Town Attorney Raffe, advised the Board that Section 90 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, subdivision 1 was amended by the Laws of 1940, c771, and became effective July 1, 1940. It provides that the legislative body of a Town of the second class having a population in excess of 25,000 people is authorized to designate highways in which vehicles shall pass in one direction only. Therefore in his opinion, the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead is helpless to create one-way streets.

A certification was read from Supervisor Sawyer to Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes stating that the Supervisor had received the sum of \$689.25 for penalties in full on tax collections of 1939-40 Tax Warrant. The certification was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Albin Zaleski tendering his resignation as Special Policeman of the Town of Riverhead dated August 29, 1940. On motion and vote the resignation was accepted and ordered placed on file.


On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Boutcher it was Resolved that John Flynn be and he hereby is appointed special policeman for the Town of Riverhead to serve on school duty at Jamesport and it is further,

Resolved that the said special policeman serve at the pleasure of the Town Board between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 9:00 A.M., 11:00 A.M. and 1:00 P.M., and 3:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M., under the direction and supervision of the Town Board of Riverhead, salary at the rate of 50 cents per hour, said resolution retroactive as of September 3, 1940. The Vote, Justices Warner, Boutcher, Kelly and Zaleski, Yes, Supervisor Sawyer Yes. Total Vote, Yes 5, No 0. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Supervisor Sawyer submitted his report for the month of August 1940 and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The Town Board then convened as a Board of Audit and examined the bills for the month of August 1940.

There being no further business on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Friday, September 13, 1940 at 9:00 A.M.
