

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, February 8, 1939 at 2:00 P.M.

Minutes of a meeting held on January 25, 1939 were read and on motion and vote were duly adopted.

Forrest G. Downs, Receiver of Taxes submitted a statement of tax collections as of February 1, 1939 and on motion and vote was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from Adam Muller, Vice Chairman for Suffolk County-Long Island-at-the-Fair Committee in reference to a contribution of \$250.00 toward the four-point Program to put Long Island into the World's Fair. The Communication was ordered placed on file.

On motion made by Justice Kelly and seconded by Justice Boutcher it was Resolved that the Supervisor be and he hereby is authorized to expend the sum of \$250.00 for the purpose of advertising the Town of Riverhead through the four point Program to put Long Island into the World's Fair sponsored by the Long Island Association. The Vote, Justice Zaleski, No, Justices Kelly, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Homan, Yes. Total Vote, Yes 4, No 1. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Mr. Harry G. Penny, Treasurer of the Riverhead Fire Department submitted his annual report of the Riverhead Fire Department as provided in Section 181 of the Town Law and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from William N. Cook-Executor of the Estate of Hudson V. Griffing offering to sell to the Town two parcels of land either of which could be used for a Town Hall site. The communication was ordered placed on file.

A communication was read from the Hon. Elisha T. Barrett, Assemblyman in regard to reducing the existing dog license fees. The Board decided to take no action in the matter and the Clerk was directed to advise Assemblyman Barrett to that effect.

Justice Boutcher presented the bids for a new highway truck and advised the Board that he had recommended the purchase of a Dodge truck for the sum of \$1840.00, it being the lowest bid submitted.
