

Minutes of a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Riverhead, held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, March 9, 1938 at 2:00 P.M.

Seth A. Hubbard, Town Attorney and Myron C. Young, Supt. of Highways were present.

Mr. Sims of W.P.A. addressed the Board and asked if the Town would transport our relief workers to Greenport to work on their project.

Supervisor Homan asked what would be the status of our projects, if Riverhead should send all our Relief men to Greenport.

Mr. Sims answered that he did not think it wise to approve any projects in Riverhead until at least May or June to see what Relief load we had at that time.

Mr. Irving Williams, Suffolk County Supt. of Welfare, addressed the Board and stated that they do not like to freeze men on W.P.A. jobs when it is possible that farmers may need men during the spring and summer.

A communication was read from the Suffolk County Association, stating that the Association is developing an issue of Poster Stamps to be used to promote Suffolk County in connection with the Worlds Fair in 1939 and requested the Town of Riverhead to assist in underwriting this issue to the extent of \$100.00. The matter was referred to the Town Attorney.

A communication was read from the State Insurance Fund in regard to Policy No. A120656 advising that the annual date of said policy is changed to March 1st. of each year effective as of March 1, 1938. The letter was ordered placed on file and that it be acknowledged.

A communication was read from Mr. Elias H. Avram, Attorney in regard to releasing the bond of the former Supt. of Highways.

Seth A. Hubbard, Town Attorney recommended that no bonds should be released by the Board but rather allow them to expire under their own provisions.

The aforesaid letter was ordered placed on file and that it be acknowledged in accordance with the recommendation of the Town Attorney.

Supervisor Homan submitted his report for the month of February to the Board pursuant to law and on motion and vote was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Mr. William Edwards of Riverhead, N.Y. addressed the Board

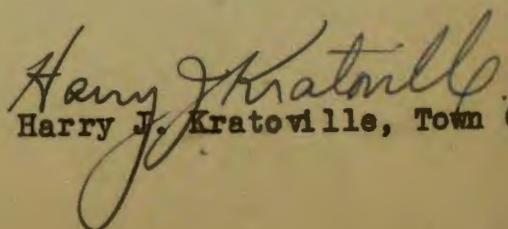
and requested that street signs be placed on all principle avenues and thorofores of the Town, stating that it would be a great help to strangers coming in Town to find their destination. The matter was referred to the Highway Committee.

Justice Kelly addressed the Board stating that the Long Island Lighting Co. has offered the Town the use of their property between the Sanitary Barber Shop and the Grant Store on Main St. for the purpose of erecting a police booth if the Town so desires. The Lighting Company's only stipulation being that in the event that they should build or sell the property, the Town would have to vacate.

On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved that the Police Committee be authorized to accept the offer of the Long Island Lighting Co. and be it further Resolved that said Committee be authorized to spend the sum not to exceed \$100.00 for the purpose of erecting a police booth on the aforesaid property. The Vote, Justices Zaleski, Kelly, Warner and Boutcher, Yes, Supervisor Homan Yes. Total Vote, Yes 5, No 0. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

Justice Kelly addressed the Board and recommended that a meeting be held and that the business men of the Town be especially invited to attend for the purpose of discussing the parking situation and seek their cooperation and receive their suggestions in order to relieve, if possible, the conjection in the business sections of the Town, during the summer months. By unanimous consent of the Board the date of the meeting was set for March 18, 1938 at 8:00 P.M. in the Town Hall.

There being no further business, on motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday, March 30, 1938 at 2:00 P.M.
