On motion made by Justice Zaleski and seconded by Justice Warner it was Resolved, that the Supervisor be authorized to transfer the sum of \$390.17 from the Budgetary Control-Town Park Maintenance Account to the Highway Item #1-General Repairs Account. The Resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

On motion made by Justice Warner and seconded by Justice Zaleski, it was Resolved, that the Supervisor be authorized to transfer the sum of \$20.00 from the Town Surplus Account to the Town Board Expense Account. The Resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

Justice Zaleski offered the following Resolution, which was seconded by Justice Warner,

WHEREAS, pursuant to a resolution of the Riverhead Town Board duly adopted Feb. 10, 1937 the Town of Riverhead purchased a sand and gravel pit from Michael March for the sum of \$1,000.00, and \$500.00 was paid on account thereof upon the acceptance of a deed conveying the same to the Town in 1937, and

WHEREAS, the said resolution further provided that the remaining \$500.00 be paid on Jan. 15, 1938 without interest, and

WHEREAS, no provision was made in the Town budget for 1938 to pay the said remaining sum of \$500.00 and

WHEREAS, the said remaining sum of \$500.00 was paid on or about Jan. 15, 1938 by the Supt. of Highways, and

WHEREAS, the said sum of \$500.00 so paid by the Supt. of Highways should be paid from the General Town funds.

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby Resolved that the sum of \$500.00 be transferred from the Town Surplus account to Item #4 of the Town Highway account.

The Resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board.

Justice Kelly offered the following Resolution, which was seconded by Justice Zaleski,


Be it resolved by the TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF RIVERHEAD,

SECTION 1. That DENNIS G. HOMAN, SUPERVISOR, be and he is authorized to execute and file an application on behalf of TOWN OF RIVERHEAD, SUFFOLK COUNTY, NEW YORK, to the United States of America for a grant to aid in financing the construction of approximately 11 miles of concrete sidewalk and approximately 2 miles of curb and gutter and necessary appurtenances thereto:-

SECTION 2. That DANIEL R. YOUNG, PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to furnish such information as the United States of America through the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works may reasonably request in connection with the application which is herein authorized to be filed. The Vote, Justice Boutcher absent, Justices Zaleski, Kelly and Warner, Yes, Supervisor Homan, Yes. Total Vote, Yes 4, No 0, absent 1. The Resolution was thereupon declared duly adopted.

The meeting was interrupted by a terrific tropical hurricane, buildings, trees, light and telephone poles were blown down through-out the Village. Supervisor Homan dispatched policemen to all schools with messages. Justice Kelly personally visited the schools during the emergency. It was estimated that at times, the wind blew at 100 miles per hour. It was without a doubt the worst storm in the history of Suffolk County, with many lives lost in adjoining Towns and many thousands of dollars damage.

On motion and vote the meeting adjourned to meet on Wednesday September 28, 1938 at 2:00 P.M.
